ARTICLE I
General Provisions

Section 1. Name — The name of the corporation shall be Save One Life, Incorporated.

Section 2. Location — The principal office of the corporation shall initially be located at the place set forth in the articles of organization of the corporation. The directors may establish other offices and places of business in Massachusetts or elsewhere.

Section 3. Fiscal Year — Except as from time to time otherwise determined by the directors, the fiscal year of the corporation shall end on the 31st day of December of each year.

Section 4. No Members — The corporation shall have no members. No person now or hereafter designated by the corporation as a "member" for any purpose shall be or be deemed to be a member for purposes of the articles of organization or bylaws of the corporation or for purposes of Massachusetts General Laws Chapter 180, as amended, or any other law, rule or regulation. Any action or vote required or permitted by Chapter 180 or any other law, rule or regulation to be taken by members shall be taken by action or vote of the same percentage of the directors of the corporation.

ARTICLE II
Directors

Section 1. Powers — The board of directors shall have the entire charge, control and management of the corporation and its property and may exercise all or any of its powers. Each director shall have one vote.

Section 2. Number and Designation — The board of directors shall be of such number (no less than 9 nor more than 15) as the directors shall determine from time to time. There will be one (1) director designated as a Founding Director, three (3) directors designated as Appointed Directors, and from five (5) to eleven (11) directors designated as Elected Directors.

Section 3. Founding Director — The founding director is the incorporator and shall hold her office until her resignation or removal at any time by a majority vote of the full board of directors.

Section 4. Appointed Directors — The three appointed directors shall be designated by the founding director. The appointed directors shall hold their office until their resignation or removal by a majority vote of the full board of directors. Any vacancy in the office of an appointed director may be filled by a majority vote of the directors present and the person so appointed shall serve the remainder of the term.

Section 5. Elected Directors — The elected directors shall serve for a three year term, with an option to renew for an unlimited number of terms, or until their respective successors are chosen and qualified. In any one year, at least two elected directors must be elected or re-elected to office. Any vacancy in the office of an elected director may be filled by a majority vote of the directors present and the person so elected shall serve the remainder of the term. A majority vote of the directors present shall elect the elected directors at the annual meeting of the directors or at a special meeting in lieu of an annual meeting.

Section 6. Resignation and Removal — Any director may resign by delivering a written resignation to the corporation at its principal office or to the president, chairperson or secretary. Such resignation shall be effective upon receipt unless it is specified to be effective at some later time. Any director may be removed from office with or without cause by the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors then in office.

Section 7. Annual Meeting — The annual meeting of the directors of the corporation shall be held on the 15th of November of each year (or on the next business day if that day is a legal holiday) at such time and place as the directors may determine. If the annual meeting is not held on such date, a special meeting in lieu of an annual meeting may be held with all the force and effect of an annual meeting. Notice of the annual meeting setting forth the date, time, and place of any such meeting shall be mailed to all directors not less than seven (7) days prior to the date of the annual meeting. Notice of any special meeting shall be given as directed under Section 9 of these bylaws.

Section 8. Regular Meeting — Regular meetings of the directors may be held without call or notice at such places and times as the directors may from time to time determine, provided that any director who is absent when such determination is made shall be given notice thereof.

Section 9. Special Meeting — Special meetings of the directors may be held at any time and place designated in a call by the president/chairperson, the treasurer or two or more directors. Notice of all special meetings of the directors shall be given to each director by the secretary or, in case of the death, absence, incapacity or refusal of the secretary, by the officer or one of the directors calling the meeting. Such notice shall be given to each director in person or by email, telephone, or facsimile transmission sent to each such director's business or home address at least forty-eight (48) hours in advance of the meeting, or by mail addressed to such business or home address and postmarked at least seventy-two (72) hours in advance of the meeting. Except as required by law, notice of a special meeting need not be given: (i) to any director who, either before or after the meeting, delivers a written waiver of notice, executed by the director, which is filed with the records of the meeting; or (ii) to any director who attends the meeting and who, either prior to the meeting or at its commencement, fails to protest the lack of such notice. A notice or waiver of notice need not specify the purpose of any special meeting unless such purpose is the removal of a director or an officer.

Section 10. Telephone and Electronic Conference Meetings — The directors or the members of any committee may participate in a meeting of the directors or such committee by means of a conference telephone or similar electronic communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other at the same time. Participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at a meeting. Directors may not vote by proxy at any meeting, regardless of whether participation in the meeting is by telephone, electronic communication or in person.

Section 11. Action at Meetings — A majority of the directors then in office shall constitute a quorum but a lesser number may, without further notice, adjourn the meeting to any other time. At any meeting at which a quorum is present, the vote of a majority of those present shall decide any matter unless the articles of organization, these bylaws, or any applicable law requires a different vote.

Section 12. Action by Consent — Any action by the directors or any committee may be taken without a meeting if a written consent thereto is signed by all the directors or all the members of the applicable committees and filed with the records of the meetings of the directors. Such consent shall be treated for all purposes as a vote at a meeting.

Section 13. Non-Voting Directors — The directors may create classes of non-voting directorship such as honorary directors, associate directors, regional directors, friends, alumni and the like, and may elect persons to those classes for such terms and on such conditions as the directors determine and may assign to such persons such responsibilities, duties and privileges as the directors determine. Persons elected as non-voting directors shall not be directors for the purposes of these bylaws and shall have no votes at any meetings of the directors.

Section 14. Committees — The directors may elect from their own number an Executive Committee, and may elect such other committees as they may from time to time determine necessary or advisable, including without limitation committees to deal with matters affecting

fund raising, planning, development, building and grounds, investments, finances and budgets and other matters affecting the state of the corporation, and may delegate such powers and duties thereto as the board of directors may deem advisable to the extent permitted by law. The Executive Committee shall be solely comprised of Board Members. However, each and every other Committee may add non-board members to serve on said Committee or Committees. Said non-board members may be elected to a specific Committee by a majority vote of said Committee but under no circumstances shall non-board members comprise more than one-third of the membership of any Committee. Only Board Members may serve as Committee Chairpersons. At any meeting of a committee a quorum for the transaction of all business properly before the meeting shall consist of a majority of the elected members of such committee.

ARTICLE III
Officers

Section 1. Officers — The officers of the corporation shall consist of a president, chairperson, a treasurer, a secretary, and executive director and such other officers as the directors may determine.

Section 2. Election — The president, chairperson, treasurer and secretary shall be elected annually by the directors. Any other officers determined necessary or desirable by the directors may be elected by the directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person. The secretary shall be a resident of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts unless the corporation shall appoint a resident agent for the service of process appointed in the manner prescribed by law. Except as otherwise provided by laws, the articles of organization or these bylaws, all officers shall hold office until the annual meeting of the directors or until their respective successors are chosen and qualified.

Section 3. Resignation and Removal — Any officer may resign by delivering a written resignation to the corporation at its principal office or to the president, chairperson or secretary, and such resignation shall be effective upon receipt unless it is specified to be effective at some later time. The directors may remove any officer with or without cause by a vote of a majority of the directors then in office.

Section 4. President — The president shall be the chief executive officer of the corporation and as such shall set out the strategic vision of the corporation and have charge of its affairs subject to the direction and control of the board of directors. The president shall have other powers and duties as are usually incident to that office and as may be vested in that office by the directors.

Section 5. Chairperson — The chairperson shall oversee the board, preside over board meetings, and work in partnership with the president and executive director to make sure board resolutions are carried out. The chairperson shall act as an alternative spokesperson for the organization, and shall have other powers and duties as are usually incident to that office and as may be vested in that office by the directors.

Section 6. Treasurer — The treasurer shall, subject to the direction and control of the board of directors, have general charge of the financial affairs of the corporation and shall keep custody of all funds, securities and valuable documents of the corporation, except as the directors may otherwise provide. The treasurer shall have such other powers and duties as are usually incident to that office and as may be vested in that office by these bylaws or by the directors.

Section 7. Secretary — The secretary shall give such notices of meetings of directors as are required by these bylaws and shall keep a record of all the meetings of directors. The secretary shall have such other powers and duties as are usually incident to that office and as may be vested in that office by these bylaws or by the directors. In the absence of the secretary from any meeting of directors, a temporary secretary designated by the person presiding at the

meeting shall perform the duties of the secretary.

Section 8. Executive Director — The executive director shall develop and implement strategic action plans for the organization, subject to board approval, and shall be responsible for the day-to-day operation of the organization. The executive director, as a non-voting officer of the board, reports to the president and is accountable to the board of directors on a regular basis.

ARTICLE IV
Board of Advisors

The corporation may establish an ongoing board of advisors to provide expertise and recommendations to the board of directors, and to assist with specific activities at the request of the president and/or chairperson. Advisory board members are invited by the president and/or chairperson to serve for indefinite terms.

ARTICLE V
Miscellaneous Provisions

Section 1. Execution of Instruments — All contracts, deeds, leases, bonds, notes, checks and other instruments authorized to be executed by an officer of the corporation on its behalf shall be signed by the president/chairperson or the treasurer except as the directors may generally or in particular cases otherwise determine.

Section 2. Voting of Securities — Except as the board of directors may otherwise designate, the president/chairperson or treasurer may waive notice of, and appoint any person or persons (with or without power of substitution) to act as proxy or attorney in fact for this corporation at any meeting of stockholders of any other corporation, the securities of which may be held by this corporation.

Section 3. Corporate Records — The original or attested copies of the articles of organization, bylaws and records of all meetings of incorporations and directors shall be kept in the same office.

Section 4. Definitions — All references in these bylaws to the articles of organization and to these bylaws shall be deemed to refer, respectively, to the articles of organization and the bylaws of the corporation as amended and in effect from time to time.

ARTICLE VI

Indemnification of Directors and Officers

The corporation shall, to the extent legally permissible, indemnify each person who may serve or who has served at any time as a director, president, chairperson, vice chairperson, treasurer, assistant treasurer, secretary, assistant secretary, executive director or other officer of the corporation or who at the request of the corporation may serve or at any time has served as a fiduciary or trustee of an employee benefit plan of the corporation (collectively, "Indemnified Officers" or individually, "Indemnified Officer"), against all expenses and liabilities, including, without limitation, counsel fees, judgments, fines, excise taxes, penalties and settlement payments, reasonably incurred by or imposed upon such person in connection with any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (a "proceeding") in which an indemnified officer may become involved by reason of serving or having served in such capacity (other than a proceeding voluntarily initiated by such person unless a majority of the full board of directors authorized the proceeding); provided that no indemnification shall be provided for any such indemnified officer shall have been finally adjudicated in any proceeding to have acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that such indemnified officer's action was in the best interests of the corporation or, to the extent that such matter relates to service with respect to any employee

benefit plan, in the best interests of the participants or beneficiaries of such employee benefit plan; and further provided that any compromise or settlement payment shall be approved by the corporation in the same manner as provided below for the authorization of indemnification.

Such indemnification may, to the extent authorized by the board of directors of the corporation, include payment by the corporation of expenses incurred in defending a civil or criminal action or proceeding in advance of the final disposition of such action or proceeding upon receipt of an undertaking by the indemnified officer to repay such payment if not entitled to indemnification under this article, which undertaking may be accepted without regard to the financial ability of such indemnified officer to make repayment.

The payment of any indemnification or advance shall be conclusively deemed authorized by the corporation under this article, and each director and officer of the corporation approving such payment shall be wholly protected, if:

- (i) the payment has been approved or ratified (1) by a majority vote of the directors who are not at that time parties to the proceeding or (2) by a majority vote of a committee of two or more directors who are not at that time parties to the proceeding and are selected for this purpose by the full board (in which selected directors who are parties may participate); or
- (ii) the action is taken in reliance upon the opinion of independent legal counsel (who may be counsel to the corporation) appointed for the purpose by vote of the directors in the manner specified in clauses (1) or (2) of subparagraph (i) or, if that manner is not possible, appointed by a majority of the full board of directors then in office; or
- (iii) the directors have otherwise acted in accordance with the standard of conduct applied to directors under Chapter 180 of the Massachusetts General Laws, as amended;

or

(iv) a court having jurisdiction shall have approved the payment.

The indemnification provided hereunder shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of any indemnified officer entitled to indemnification hereunder.

The right of indemnification under this article shall be in addition to and not exclusive of all other rights to which any person may be entitled. Nothing contained in this article shall affect any rights to indemnification to which corporation employees, agents, directors, officers and other persons may be entitled by contract or otherwise under law.

No amendment or repeal of the provisions of this article which adversely affects the right of an indemnified officer under this article shall apply to that indemnified officer with respect to the acts or omissions of such indemnified officer that occurred at any time prior to such amendment or repeal, unless such amendment or repeal was voted for by or was made with the written consent of such indemnified officer.

ARTICLE VII

Conflict of Interest

Any director, officer, or key employee who has an interest in a contract or other transaction presented to the board of directors or a committee thereof for authorization, approval, or ratification shall make a prompt and full disclosure of his interest to the board of directors or committee prior to its acting on such contract or transaction. Such disclosure shall, subject to pre-existing confidentiality obligations, include any relevant and material facts known to such person about the contract or transaction which might reasonably be construed to be adverse to the corporation's interest.

The body to which such disclosure is made shall thereupon determine, by a vote of seventy-five percent (75%) of the vote entitled to vote, whether the disclosure shows that a conflict of interest exists or can reasonably be construed to exist. If a conflict is deemed to exist, such person shall not vote on, nor use his personal influence on, nor participate (other than to present factual information or to respond to questions) in the discussions or deliberations with respect to such contract or transaction. Such person may be counted in determining whether quorum is present but may not be counted when the board of directors or a committee of the board of directors takes action on the transaction. The minutes of the meeting shall reflect the disclosure made, the vote thereon, the abstention from voting and participation, and whether a quorum was present.

ARTICLE VII
Amendment of Bylaws

These bylaws may at any time be amended or repealed, in whole or in part, by vote of a majority of the directors.
