- BE RESPONSIBLE FOR THE OVERALL MANAGEMENT OF NSA OPERATIONS;
- BE RESPONSIBLE FOR CONDUCTING THE OFFICIAL CORRESPONDENCE OF THE NSA;
- PRESERVE ALL BOOKS, DOCUMENTS, RECORDS, COMMUNICATIONS AND ARCHIVES;
- BE RESPONSIBLE FOR PRESERVING BOOKS OF ACCOUNT AND FOR MAINTAINING ACCURATE RECORDS OF THE ACTIVITIES OF THE NSA;
- RECEIVE AND DEPOSIT ALL MONIES IN THE NAME OF THE NSA, AND UPON APPROVAL
