Science Park Development Corporation (SPDC) was established in August of 1981 as a part of a cooperative effort by the City of New Haven, Connecticut, Yale University, and Olin Corporation to mobilize their considerable resources to create a new economic base at the site of a multi-tract, predominately vacant, industrial complex adjacent to the Yale Science Hill campus and in New Haven's state-designated enterprise zone. It's goal is to further the revitalization of the City of New Haven through the development and enhancement of employment opportunities for area residents, relief of poverty and neighborhood tension, and the prevention of blight and deterioration in the surrounding Dixwell-Newhallville neighborhood areas. The Park attracts start-up businesses and high technology firms, including life science and light manufacturing and assembly industries. Biotech is one of the fastest growing industries in Connecticut. Several of Connecticut's public biotech companies started and reside in the Park. As a home base for new growth-oriented life science, high tech and manufacturing companies, SPDC provides economic benefits to the City of New Haven as a whole, and offers indirect employment opportunities to area residents. Science Park is home to approximately 23 companies, from expanding start-up ventures to mature enterprises, divisions of multinational corporations, and a university. These entities employ approximately 1,300 people in the Park with some projecting over a 133 percent job growth rate, in total, over the next five years. Tenant companies at Science Park are part of a dynamic R&D community and campus-like environment. These companies also benefit by association with nearby Yale University, and are permitted the use of Yale's library and various other facilities. In July of 1998, the Connecticut Housing Finance Authority (CHFA) committed \$14 million to demolish obsolete structures, and to rehabilitate and/or construct new buildings in the Park. Yale University provided supporting funds during construction activities, Olin Corporation approved donation of additional land and facilities, and the City of New Haven provided contributions in the form of capital improvements. These were in addition to Connecticut Development Authority (CDA) and Department of Economic and Community Development (DECD) previous commitments to the Park. The major portion of the CHFA funds were used to renovate and expand a 102,000 square foot office/lab building that is now leased and occupied, primarily to companies in the biotech field. Ground lease transactions in 2000 and subsequently between SPDC and a former Massachusetts developer resulted in the infill and renovation of a 267,000 sq ft office/lab building, renovation of parking lots encompassing approximately 250 parking spaces and demolition of five abandoned and derelict buildings. Beginning in 2007, another Massachusetts developer and certain of its affiliates assumed three ground leases. Under these and subsequent licenses, additional abandoned buildings have been demolished, a structured parking garage for over one thousand vehicles was completed in 2009, and a vacant factory is being renovated for office and technology tenants, who began to take occupancy during 2009. In the fall of 2007, SPDC issued a RFQ for development of a seven acre abandoned, derelict, multi-building tract in Science Park. An exclusivity agreement with a nationally known developer was signed, and activity is progressing toward redevelopment and ground lease agreements expected in 2010. Science Park is and will continue to be a vibrant, integral part of the surrounding neighborhoods, New Haven, and Connecticut as a whole.









