Statement of Program Service Accomplishments 2009

Calendar Year 2009

The organization's primary exempt purpose is educational/charitable.

Educational Component:

The mission of *hawkwing* is to facilitate understanding among all cultures by promoting diversity and spiritual understanding (defined as 'who I am and what my mission in life is' and not by religious preference). We do this through outreach to all cultures and age groups through educational programs, diversity trainings and creative experiences. This is especially true for young people who we assist with healthy personal development and growth by offering programs in classrooms, places of faith, scouts, youth programs and other youth settings using, in part, Native American storytelling and Medicine Wheel Programs.

Key to our work is helping young people and adults reconnect to community and regain personal power through understanding that they can make a difference in the world around them by volunteering. Substance abuse and other risky behavioral avoidance is key to our youth focus. Although we did not receive any federal grants from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration under their Drug Free Communities Grants in 2009, we continue to build coalitions of adults and youth to solve the problems that foster unhealthy choices. Through this help of dedicated volunteers, grant, we support a multi-constituent coalition across two key towns and many support towns in Connecticut designed to foster community connections and lower substance use over time especially in the areas of alcohol. tobacco and marijuana. We also work closely with two school districts throughout the school year: Bolton, CT and South Windsor, CT, with the fifth and sixth grade classes respectively. These classes are designed to mobilize youth to make healthy decisions for themselves and to reconnect to community and family knowing that these are key assets to healthy development. We also receive funding from various school districts in Connecticut to provide diversity education programs, violence prevention through our PeaceWorks program, and bonding for moms and daughters through the Four Generations of Women program.

In 2009, there were a total of approximately 500 students and hundreds of adults participating under the Drug Free Communities volunteer program, some 50 girls and their moms in the Four Generations of Women program, 800 students participating in the PeaceWorks programs, and another 2,000 in other schools, through scouting, in faith communities and other locations. Youth participants totaled over 3,000 in 2009. We also provide educational programs to adult groups including staff trainings in diversity, cross- cultural understanding and community mobilization. These programs reached over 4,000 adults.

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The Tenth Annual Holiday Give Away:

Part of *hawkwing's* mission is to assist the people of the Lakota/Sioux nation to meet their basic needs arising out of extreme poverty. The Reservations of South Dakota are literally the poorest places in America with conditions that rival third world nations. The founder of *hawkwing*, Rochelle Ripley, is of Lakota descent and is strongly committed through the Agency to assist the tribes to regain economic self-sufficiency, cultural recognition and respect, and physical and emotional health. The focus is presently on the Cheyenne River Sioux Reservation in central South Dakota. The Reservation is home to over 8,000 Lakota Sioux people and is approximately the size of the state of Connecticut. By US Census, it is the poorest place in America.

hawkwing conducts an annual Give Away each year for new items for children and Elders of the tribe. We also assist the tribal programs and schools. In 2008, the Ninth Annual Give Away was held – delivering about \$180,000 of donated goods and services of some \$90,000. We served 2,600 children from birth through 18 years and 500 Elders age 60 and older. The children each received a gift box containing school supplies, new books and toys, five to seven new clothing items and eight personal care items. On average, each child's box was valued at \$100.00. Each Elder received a comfort care bag with seven or eight items valued at about \$25.00, 50 homeless veterans each received "warm" duffels containing two new blankets, gloves, socks, hats, personal care items and coats.

Dental Mission:

In April, *hawkwing*, paired up with Tunxis Community College and the University of Connecticut's School of Dentistry to provide dental services on the Reservation. Six dental hygenists and a pediatric dentist traveled to Cheyenne River and worked with over 300 children and adults to provide a week long free dental clinic including cleanings. fluoride treatments, sealants, root canals and fillings. All costs were assumed by the participants and the two colleges as well as funding from student groups within the colleges.

The Second Annual Moccasin Walk and Helping Hands:

In May, we conducted the second Annual Moccasin Walk fundraiser to leverage funds for a housing rehabilitation and repair project during the summer titled Helping Hands. We raised \$20,000 in cash donations and \$2,000 in donated building materials. In early June, fifteen volunteers traveled to the Reservation to spend a total of 100 work hours repairing five homes and one community center. Three of the homes required the expertise of our electrician, one required significant in-house repairs and minor construction, and the fifth house received a new building attached to their home trailer to serve as a new living and renovations to the kitchen cabinets. We spent a total of approximately \$15,500 in new materials. Volunteers from

hawkwing were supported by Lakota volunteers – both youth and adult as well as support from a Tribal Councilman.

Calendar Year 2009

Libraries:

To assist with literacy, *hawkwing* began a library program for students in late 2004 which expanded significantly in 2005 and has continued to grow each year. Working collaboratively with Reading Well for Kids in Meriden, CT, we continue to add to the existing six sites for library access as well as expanding to the Cultural Center as the seventh site. Many children, anxious to have access to reading materials, ask to keep the books they take home. We are adding a used book component to the Cultural Center Library to allow children to pick from some books that they can keep in addition to those they return on loan. We estimate that there are some 12,000 volumes in circulation among the sites.

Community Service/Volunteerism:

hawkwing is very proud of its level of mobilized volunteerism. We are firmly rooted in volunteer efforts promoting involvement of youth and adults in all aspects of the Agency both in Connecticut and on the Cheyenne River Sioux Reservation. All educational and cultural programs included donations for the Give Away usually in the form of donated new items. All program participants are engaged in Community Service with *hawkwing*. Thousands of adults and youth participate in small and large ways each year including organizing collecting and cash drives, delivering donations to the warehouse, warehouse organizing, packing of each child's gift package, loading a full sized semi-truck each December to go to South Dakota and unloading on the Reservation end, packaging "totem necklaces" as program supplies for over 6,000 participants each year, mission projects, traveling to the Reservation with the Give Away to assist with distribution, corporate outreach, office organization, publicity and fundraising. Warehouse space is donated by the Town of Glastonbury, CT. Shipping costs are donated by CEVA (formerly Eagle Global Logistics) of Houston, TX and North Granby, CT. Altogether, the donated value of goods and services accrued to \$280,000 in 2009. We are staffed with only 1.5 full time equivalent people. All other tasks and services are provided by our volunteers.
