The purpose of this award is to provide financial assistance to students planning a career in the skilled trades.

AWARD:

Each participating school will be eligible for one* award recipient to receive a grant equal to the lesser of \$2,500 or 50% of the cost of tuition and fees of the vocational-technical program proposed. Payment will be paid for the benefit of the recipient directly to the institution giving the vocational program.
