- MISSION IEEE's core purpose is to foster technological innovation and excellence for the benefit of humanity VISION IEEE will be essential to the global technical community and to technical professionals everywhere, and be universally recognized for the contributions of technology and of technical professionals in improving global conditions. ACTIVITY There are 397,001 IEEE members in over 160 countries. IEEE publishes 16 of the top 20 journals in electrical and electronic engineering, 9 of the top 10 journals in telecommunications, and also publishes top or high-ranking journals in many additional fields of engineering and science. The database in IEEE's online digital library contains over two million articles. In 2009, IEEE technically and/or financially sponsored or co-sponsored 1,077 conferences around the world. In addition, IEEE is a leading global standards developer for telecommunications, information technology, power generation, and other technologies.

IEEE members are engineers, scientists and allied professionals whose technical interests are rooted in electrical and computer sciences, engineering and related disciplines. IEEE communicates to the public how IEEE members and professionals improve the quality of life and how IEEE members and technical professionals promote diversity and ethical behavior in the profession.
- PERIODICALS The IEEE publishes nearly one third of the world's technical literature in electrical engineering, computer science and electronics. This includes over 130 journals, transactions and magazines and over 800 conference proceedings annually. It publishes 16 of the top 20 journals in electrical and electronic engineering, 9 of the top 10 in telecommunications, and also publishes top or high-ranking journals in many additional fields of engineering and science.
