NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Nature of operations and summary of significant accounting policies

Nature of Operations

Aish Hatorah New York, Inc. (the "Organization") was established to broaden the knowledge of individuals to their Jewish heritage. The Organization provides seminars and courses in Jewish history and the Torah and sponsors educational trips.

Income Taxes

The Organization qualifies as a tax-exempt nonprofit organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. Accordingly, no provision is made for federal or state income taxes.

In accordance with GAAP, the Organization is required to determine whether a tax position is more likely than not to be sustained upon examination by the applicable taxing authority, including resolution of any related appeals or litigation processes, based on the technical merits of the position. The Organization files an income tax return in the U.S. federal jurisdiction, and may file income tax returns in various U.S. states and foreign jurisdictions. Generally, the Organization is not subject to income tax examinations by major taxing authorities for years before 2006. The tax benefit recognized is measured as the largest amount of benefit that has a greater than fifty percent likelihood of being realized upon ultimate settlement. De-recognition of a tax benefit previously recognized results in the Organization recording a tax liability that reduces retained earnings. This policy has been applied to all existing tax positions upon the Organization's initial adoption for the period ended December 31, 2009. Based on its analysis, the Organization has determined that the adoption of this policy did not have a material impact on the Organization's financial statements upon adoption. However, the Organization's conclusions regarding this policy may be subject to review and adjustment at a later date based on factors including, but not limited to, on-going analysis of and changes to tax laws, regulations and interpretations thereof. No interest expense or penalties have been recognized as of and for the year ended December 31, 2009.

Accounting for Contributions and Basis of Presentation

The accompanying financial statements are prepared in accordance with accounting principals generally accepted in the United States of America ("GAAP"). GAAP requires reporting revenue and net assets by class as permanently restricted, temporarily restricted and unrestricted.

Classes of Net Assets

The Organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Gifts of equipment are reported as unrestricted support unless explicit donor stipulations specify how the donated assets must be used. Gifts of long-lived assets with explicit restrictions that specify how the assets are to be used and gifts of cash or other assets that must be used to acquire long-lived assets are reported as restricted support. Absent explicit donor stipulations about how long those long-lived assets must be maintained, the Organization reports expirations of donor restrictions when the donated or acquired long-lived assets are placed in service. At December 31, 2009 and 2008, all of the Organization's assets are unrestricted.

NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

1. Nature of operations and summary of significant accounting policies (continued)

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Management considers money market accounts and all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with a maturity of 90 days or less to be cash equivalents.

Certificates of Deposit

The Organization classifies bank certificates of deposit as held-to-maturity and are carried at their amortized costs as the Organization has the positive intent and ability to hold them to maturity. All certificates of deposit have maturity dates of one year or less. As of December 31, 2009 and 2008, there are no unrecognized holding gains and losses on certificates of deposit.

Concentration of Credit Risk

The Organization maintains cash balances at financial institutions in excess of the amount insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation. Management regularly monitors the financial condition of these institutions in order to keep the potential risk to a minimum.

Investments

In accordance with GAAP, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets.

Valuation of Investments in Securities and Securities at Fair Value - Definition and Hierarchy

In accordance with GAAP, fair value is defined as the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability (i.e., the "exit price") in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date.

In determining fair value, the Organization uses various valuation approaches. GAAP establishes a fair value hierarchy for inputs used in measuring fair value that maximizes the use of observable inputs and minimizes the use of unobservable inputs by requiring that the most observable inputs be used when available. Observable inputs are those that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability based on market data obtained from sources independent of the Organization. Unobservable inputs reflect the Organization's assumptions about the inputs market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability developed based on the best information available in the circumstances. The fair value hierarchy is categorized into three levels based on the inputs as follows:

Level 1 - Valuations based on unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities that the Organization has the ability to access. Valuation adjustments and block discounts are not applied to Level 1 securities. Since valuations are based on quoted prices that are readily and regularly available in an active market, valuation of these securities does not entail a significant degree of judgment.

Level 2 - Valuations based on quoted prices in markets that are not active or for which all significant inputs are observable, either directly or indirectly.

Valuation of Investments in Securities and Securities at Fair Value - Definition and Hierarchy (continued)

Level 3 - Valuations based on inputs that are unobservable and significant to the overall fair value measurement.

The availability of valuation techniques and observable inputs can vary from security to security and is affected by a wide variety of factors including, the type of security, whether the security is new and not yet established in the marketplace, and other characteristics particular to the transaction. To the extent that valuation is based on models or inputs that are less observable or unobservable in the market, the determination of fair value requires more judgment. Those estimated values do not necessarily represent the amounts that may be ultimately realized due to the occurrence of future circumstances that cannot be reasonably determined. Because of the inherent uncertainty of valuation, those estimated values may be materially higher or lower than the values that would have been used had a ready market for the securities existed. Accordingly, the degree of judgment exercised by the Organization in determining fair value is greatest for securities categorized in Level 3. In certain cases, the inputs used to measure fair value may fall into different levels of the fair value hierarchy. In such cases, for disclosure purposes, the level in the fair value hierarchy within which the fair value measurement in its entirety falls is determined based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement.

Fair value is a market-based measure considered from the perspective of a market participant rather than an entity-specific measure. Therefore, even when market assumptions are not readily available, the Organization's own assumptions are set to reflect those that market participants would use in pricing the asset or liability at the measurement date.

The Organization uses prices and inputs that are current as of the measurement date, including periods of market dislocation. In periods of market dislocation, the observability of prices and inputs may be reduced for many securities. This condition could cause a security to be reclassified to a lower level within the fair value hierarchy.

The Organization values investments in securities and securities sold short that are freely tradable and are listed on a national securities exchange or reported on the NASDAQ national market at their last sales price as of the last business day of the year.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with GAAP requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Contributed property and equipment is recorded at fair value at the date of contribution. Depreciation is provided principally using the straight-line method as follows:

Expenditures for repairs and maintenance are charged to operations as incurred, while betterments and improvements are capitalized.

Revenue Recognition

The Organization's primary source of revenue is from contributions. Contributions are recorded when collected. Contributions of assets are recorded at fair value. Seminar and event fees are recorded when collected.

Subsequent Events

These financial statements were approved by management and available for issuance on August 11, 2010. Subsequent events have been evaluated through this date.
