School Enhancement Program: Many Israeli schools opened in response to the massive immigration from Russia to Israel, remain under-funded and lack basic educational standards. Drop-out rates are three times the national average and full matriculation rates are 27%. JOI established 25 computer centers serving 5,600 students with 400 computers, 24 science laboratories serving 4,500 students, 21 libraries, four English centers, and a dozen sports and music centers serving over 1,500 youths each. JOI provides academic equipment, teacher training, curriculum consulting, and standarized student testing to augment teaching quality and ensure academic achievement.

Night Owls: Many thousands of Russian immigrant teens feel alienated and are failing. They have three times delinquency rates, twice the crime rate, four times the drug rates, three times drop-out rates, and three times the teen suicide rates. Night Owls targets the most vulnerable teens, those who hang out on the streets late on weekday nights, exposed to the worst elements, and prevents the prevalent slide to delinquency. Night Owls employs immigrant youth counselors to work from 8PM till midnight on the streets to forge positive relationships with the teens and serve as an adult voice, a role model, and an anchor. The youth counselors arrange ongoing and special activities and liaison with existing municipal and NGO activities to integrate the youth in constructive frameworks. In 2009, Night Owls worked in 25 cities with 47 counselors, reachig 4,500 teens.

Lifeline: Thirty percent of Israel's elderly live exclusively on welfare, in severe financial distress. When specific emergencies arise, they simply do not have the money to cope. LifeLine partners with five municipal welfare agencies in Israel to provide the infrastructure, professional social workers, and professional assessments to provide the critical financial subsidies that they cannot offer to the most-needy elderly. Typically, LifeLine assists in areas that are not covered by the welfare system, such as dental work, hearing aids, eyeglasses, critical home repairs and medical transportation and medicine. LifeLine assists 25 emergency cases each month in five cities.
