#### INDEPENDENT AUDITOR'S REPORT

To the Board of Directors of The E. Matilda Ziegler Foundation For The Blind, Inc.

We have audited the accompanying statement of financial position - modified cash basis of The E. Matilda Ziegler Foundation For The Blind, Inc. (a nonprofit organization) as of December 31, 2009, and the related statements of activities - modified cash basis, and cash flows - modified cash basis for the year then ended. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Organization's management. Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit.

We conducted our audit in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America. #### NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### **Nature of Activities**

The E. Matilda Ziegler Foundation For The Blind, Inc. (the "Foundation") was created to provide support for programs and research for the amelioration of the blind. It was also the sole source of funding for The Matilda Ziegler Publishing Company For The Blind, Inc. (the "Company") which published a magazine and produced recordings for the blind which were distributed free of charge. In 2009, the Company halted its physical magazine and recording production and distribution operations. The Company reorganized its production and distribution efforts so that it now benefits the blind through materials and publications placed on the Internet.

The Foundation does not solicit contributions from the public, relying on the income generated from its investment portfolio.

#### **Basis of Presentation**

Financial statement presentation requires that the Foundation report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets.

#### **Basis of Accounting**

The Foundation maintains its books on the modified cash basis of accounting. Expenses are reported in the period incurred rather than paid. Dividends and interest are recorded as income when received.

#### Cash and Cash Equivalents

For the purpose of the statement of cash flows, the Foundation considers all highly liquid debt instruments purchased with an original maturity of three months or less to be cash equivalents.

#### <u>Investments</u>

The Foundation carries investments at fair value. The fair values are based on quoted market prices. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets in the statement of activities.

#### NOTE 1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

#### Restrictions on Net Assets

Temporarily restricted net assets provide an endowment to generate income from investments to award grants and support the Foundation. Net proceeds from the disposition of investments are reinvested in the investment portfolio. A portion of excess funds resulting from dispositions at times is made available for the Foundation's operating purposes.

#### Use of Estimates

Financial statement preparation in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

#### **NOTE 2. TAX STATUS**

The Internal Revenue Service has determined that the Foundation is exempt from federal income tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. The Code imposes an excise tax of 2% (reduced to 1% if certain requirements are met) on the net investment income of private foundations.

Current federal tax regulations require that a portion of the excess of revenues over expenses be distributed within one year for qualifying purposes. As of December 31, 2009 there were not any excess distributions carried over to 2010. However, undistributed income at December 31, 2009 is \$88,094, which must be distributed in 2010 to avoid the excise tax on undistributed income.

#### **NOTE 3. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS**

Monthly grants were paid to The Matilda Ziegler Publishing Company For The Blind, Inc. to meet their operating expenses of publishing the magazine and making recordings. Grants paid during the year ended December 31, 2009 totaled \$435,000. The Foundation and Publishing Company share common directors and officers.

#### **NOTE 6. COMMITMENTS**

On July 24, 2002, the Foundation entered into an investment management agreement with Voyageur Asset Management, Inc. to invest and manage a portfolio of equity and fixed income asset securities within specified guidelines. Annual fees to Voyageur Asset Management, Inc. were based on .75% of the first \$10 million, .60% on the next \$15 million and .50% on assets exceeding \$25 million. In July, 2009, the Foundation liquidated this portfolio, discontinuing Voyageur Asset Management, Inc. services. The related funds were deposited into the Vanguard Total Stock Market Index Mutual Fund.

In February 1991, the Foundation entered into an investment management agreement with Fox Asset Management to invest and manage a portfolio of equity and fixed income asset securities within specified guidelines. Advisory fees for these services are payable quarterly at the annual rate of one percent for equity assets and one half percent on fixed income assets on the fair market value of assets managed by Fox Asset Management as of the last business day of the quarter previously ended. Either party may terminate this agreement upon thirty days written notice.

In December 2004, the Foundation replaced Fox Asset Management's services in their equity portfolio with SASCO Capital. The advisory fees for these services are payable quarterly at 2.4% of the fair market value of the assets managed. Either party may terminate this agreement upon thirty days written notice.

In December 1999, the Foundation entered into an agreement with Bank of America, formerly known as Fleet Bank, appointing them custodian of its investment accounts. Either party may terminate this agreement upon thirty days written notice. Compensation for services rendered is payable on a quarterly basis based on net principal value of the assets of the investments.

The Foundation contracted with Evaluation Associates International to oversee the Organizations assets and make recommendations based on portfolio allocation and current market conditions. The quarterly fee for these services is \$6,250. During 2003, Evaluation Services International was purchased by Milliman USA.

#### **NOTE 7. GRANTS PAYABLE**

Grants authorized with routine performance requirements but unpaid as of year end are recorded as liabilities. Grants payable as of December 31, 2009 are as follows:

#### NOTE 8. CONCENTRATION OF CREDIT RISK

The Foundation maintains its cash balances with one financial institution. Cash maintained at the financial institution is insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation up to \$250,000. The maximum loss that would result from cash on deposit in excess of insured limits at December 31, 2009 is \$3,004.

#### NOTE 9. FAIR VALUE MEASUREMENTS

The Foundation's investments are reported at fair value by investment category in the below table. The methods used to measure fair value may produce an amount that may not be indicative of net realizable value or reflective of future fair values. Furthermore, although the Foundation believes its valuation methods are appropriate and consistent with other market participants, the use of different methodologies or assumptions to determine the fair value of certain financial instruments could result in a different fair value measurement at the reporting date.

The fair value measurements authoritative literature establishes a fair value hierarchy that prioritizes the inputs to valuation techniques used to measure fair value. This hierarchy consists of three broad levels: Level 1 inputs consist of unadjusted quoted prices in active markets for identical assets and have the highest priority, Level 2 inputs consist of observable inputs other than quoted prices for identical assets, and Level 3 inputs have the lowest priority.

All of the Foundation's investments are valued using quoted prices in active markets for identical assets (Level 1).
