The Gustavus and Louise Pfeiffer Research Foundation was organized in 1942 under the laws of the State of New York as a non-profit corporation. It was founded by Mr. Gustavus A. Pfeiffer and his wife, Louise F. Pfeiffer. It received the bulk of its capital under the provisions of Mr. Pfeiffer's Will after his death in 1953.

Mr. Pfeiffer was born in Cedar Falls, Iowa, in 1872. After attending the Illinois College of Pharmacy, he became a pharmacist in Parkersburg, Iowa. This was the beginning of Mr. Pfeiffer's long and distinguished business career in pharmaceutical and allied industries which led eventually to his chairmanship and his family's original ownership of the former Warner Lambert Pharmaceutical Corporation.

In addition to the diligence, foresight and business acumen which brought to him his great success in the business world, Mr. Pfeiffer possessed a great compassion for others which resulted in many philanthropic works, including the establishment of the Foundation.

The Foundation was created to serve as a vehicle through which a large portion of the fortune which Mr. Pfeiffer had accumulated could be "plowed back" into the fields of medicine and pharmacy, from which it had been derived.

Fields of Interest

The Foundation makes grants solely for the general improvement of the public health through the advancement and promotion of medicine and pharmacy, and solely to tax-exempt institutions. These grants are, normally, no larger than \$75,000 and limited to institutions and projects located in the United States of America. The grants are for a period of one year, subject to possible renewal, limited to not more than an additional two renewal years for the same project or investigator.

The Foundation makes grants for the support of specific medical and pharmacy school programs and projects, including post-graduate scholarship and fellowship assistance. It also funds studies in nutrition, blindness, deafness and other physical disabilities.

The Board of Directors of the Foundation, at its meeting held October 19, 2001, determined to change the emphasis of its fields of interest away from basic biomedical research. Accordingly, the Foundation will no longer accept new Applications for cancer or other basic biomedical research. It will, however, continue to accept Renewal Applications for projects in these fields previously funded by the Foundation.

Certain continuing programs established years ago, and certain institutions with which the Foundation has a special historical relationship, may receive grants which do not fit within the fields of interest described herein. Such grants do not establish exceptions available to new applicants.

Grant Policies

General

Grants are made only to institutions which (i) qualify as organizations described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, (ii) are not "private foundations" as defined in Section 509 of that Code, and (iii) have currently effective rulings from the Internal Revenue Service as to the foregoing.

In recent years, the annual amount of the Foundation's grants has generally been between \$750,000 and \$2,000,000. The number of grants made at each of the semiannual meetings of the Board of Directors does not normally exceed 10 to 20, and at recent meetings has usually been between 10% to 25% of the total number of Applications considered.

The Foundation will not normally accept a request for a grant in excess of \$75,000 for any year. Due to this limitation, and because the Directors normally do not favor projects where the Foundation's contribution would be relatively insignificant in relation to the total funding required, in the case of research projects pilot projects are generally preferred.

The Board will not approve more than one year's funding of a project at a time. If the project will require more than one year to complete, the Application should so indicate, in which event requests for renewal will be entertained for not more than two additional years. Similarly, continuous support for the same investigator is limited to no more than three years. The approval of an initial grant for a multi-year project does not result in a commitment on the part of the Foundation to grant renewal requests, which will be evaluated not only on the basis of results achieved but also in relation to other pending Applications and other considerations deemed appropriate by the Board.

Limits on Multiple Requests

The Board of Directors has adopted the following policies to avoid concentration of grant activity at any single institution:

- 1. No more than 3 Letters of Inquiry from the same institution will be processed for any meeting; further Letters of Inquiry will be automatically rejected. For this purpose, all components of the same institution are considered as parts of a single institution, but the fact that affiliations exist between independent institutions, such as those between a medical school and a teaching hospital, does not result in their being so considered.
- No more than one Application from the same institution will normally be funded at any meeting, with the selection, in case multiple Applications are received (as a result of the approval of multiple Letters of Inquiry) based on relative merit.
- 3. No more than one active grant will normally be permitted to be outstanding at any institution. Therefore, no Applications or Letters of Inquiry from an institution which has just received a grant will normally be processed for the next meeting.

In view of the foregoing restrictions, administrators of grant application programs are urged to take appropriate action to prevent wasted effort in preparing fruitless Letters of Inquiry or Applications.

Investigators at institutions where there is already an ongoing grant to a different investigator should not submit proposals for support covering any part of the period covered by the ongoing grant. Also, where the ongoing grant is one for which a Renewal Application is contemplated, it should be borne in mind that, all things being equal, a Renewal Application is likely to be approved if satisfactory progress has been shown in the period covered by the ongoing grant, which would preclude favorable action on a new project.

Ineligible Funding Categories

In addition to the restrictions noted under "Fields of Interest" above, there are a number of types of funding which the Foundation will not normally provide. Most significant among them are:

- 1. Grants will not be made:
 - (a) effective with the Spring 2002 Meeting, for projects involving basic biomedical research;
 - (b) for delivery of health care services;
 - (c) for programs which benefit only a limited service area within the United States;
 - (d) for endowment, general institutional support, building programs, chairs, or the like;
 - (e) solely or in major part for equipment, exhibits, conferences, seminars, lectures, workshops, travel, sabbatical leave, or the like;
 - (f) to fund indirect costs, such as allocation of general administrative or other overhead expense;
 - (g) for projects where the contribution of the Foundation to the overall project would not be significant, as where the support requested is relatively minor (either as a percentage of the total funds required for the project or in terms of the importance of the items to be funded) in relation to support to be received from other sources (other than institutional support);
 - (h) to institutions not located in, or for projects to be conducted outside, the United States of America;
 - (i) for projects involving vivisection or other use of animal subjects (other than insects) for experiments; or
 - (j) to carry on propaganda or influence legislation or elections.

- 2. Research grants are made only for specific projects, not for departmental or other general programs of research.
- 3. Grants will not be made:
 - (a) to other foundations or fund raising organizations for the purpose of their making grants to other entities;
 - (b) which should more appropriately receive support for the project from the public or other sources; or
 - (d) for projects which should more appropriately be supported by pharmaceutical companies, such as research into commercial applications of, or improvements to, existing pharmaceutical products.

Application Procedures

The Foundation's Board of Directors meets twice in each year to consider Applications. Its Spring meeting is held in March or April. Its Fall meeting is held in October.

Institutions seeking support from the Foundation must first submit a Letter of Inquiry briefly describing the proposed project for review by the Foundation's Secretary, followed, if notified that a formal Application may be submitted, by a formal Application, in accordance with the procedures set forth below.

Where a Letter of Inquiry or Application is disapproved, no resubmission for the same project will be processed. It is not the policy of the Foundation to advise applicants of the reasons for disapproval of an Application or its ranking in relation to other Applications.

Letters of Inquiry or Applications should not be submitted for a project which is not proposed to be commenced until after the date for the second Board meeting scheduled to be held after the date of any such Letter or Application.

Letters of Inquiry

Institutions wishing to apply for a grant should first send a Letter of Inquiry to the Foundation's office in time to be received not later than 5:00 P.M., Eastern Time, on:

- (a) January 8, for requests to be considered at the Spring Meeting, and
- (b) July 25 for requests to be considered at the Fall Meeting.

 (If the deadline would otherwise fall on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, it goes back to the next earlier business day.)

To insure that information is current, no Letter of Inquiry should be filed between the deadline for one meeting and the first day of the month following the month of that meeting.

The Letter of Inquiry must be in language which an educated lay person can understand.

The Letter of Inquiry should state the nature and purpose of the project, the field of interest of the Foundation to which the project relates, the amount to be requested from the Foundation in each year for which grants are to be sought, and a general description of the types of items to be funded thereby.

The Letter of Inquiry must not exceed 2 pages (standard type) in length.

Letters of Inquiry which fail to observe the foregoing requirements will not be processed.

The Letter of Inquiry will be reviewed by the Foundation's Secretary to determine not only whether the project falls within a field of interest of the Foundation but also whether the information submitted indicates that support is precluded by any of the policies of the Foundation.

The Secretary will notify the investigator whether an Application may be filed and of the deadline for filing such Application. No Application should be filed without receipt of such notification.

Applications

An original and nine copies of a formal Application (hard copies only; no faxes), signed both by the applicant institution and the principal investigator, must be received at the Foundation's office not later than 5:00 P.M., Eastern Time on the date specified in the notice of approval of the related Letter of Inquiry.

In order to insure that information is current, Applications should be dated (and information included therein should be current as of such date), in the case of a Spring Meeting, no earlier than the preceding December 31, or, in the case of a Fall Meeting, the preceding June 30.

The Application should contain the information required by items 1 through 8 below, and may not exceed 10 pages (standard type) in length:

- 1. General Information (to be set forth on the first page):
 - a. Name, address and telephone number of the applicant institution;
 - b. Name, address and telephone number of the principal investigator(s) or other person(s) in charge of the project;
 - c. Amount of support requested and, if the project will exceed one year, the number of additional years (not to exceed two more years), and the amounts, for which renewal requests are contemplated;
 - d. Title of the project;
 - e. Date(s) on which payment is requested, the payee for checks and the address to which checks should be mailed;
 - f. If copies of correspondence relating to the Application should be mailed to any address other than that of the principal investigator, that address;
 - g. Index, with page numbers; and
 - h. Signatures of the applicant institution and investigator(s).
- 2. A description of the purpose of the project and the manner in which it will be carried out.
- 3. A description of all current grants, and all pending or contemplated applications for grants, for the same or closely related projects (including the name of the institution involved, the period covered and the title of the project), with a statement as to whether there is any overlap with the project being applied for and, if such overlap exists, a description of the extent of overlap and the procedure to be followed if overlapping grants are made.

- 4. Brief biographical summaries, including education and post-graduate experience, of the principal investigator(s) and other personnel who have important roles in the project.
- 5. The budget for the year of requested support, itemized by expense categories (personnel, equipment, supplies, etc., but excluding indirect costs), the names and percentage of working time to be devoted to the project for all individuals who will significantly participate, an explanation of any unusual costs, and identification of any funds from other sources which will be applied to meet the costs of the project.
- 6. In the case of a research project, a description thereof, in language which an educated lay person can understand, including the information set forth in the following subparagraphs:
 - a. A glossary of any unusual terms and abbreviations;
 - b. An executive summary (not more than 500 words) of the proposed research;
 - c. A detailed description of the research and the main procedures to be followed in carrying out the project; and
 - d. A brief review of recent research by others in the field.
- 7. A statement as to whether patent protection may be sought for results of research funded and, if so, that the institution will permit royalty free use for non-commercial projects.
- 8. Such other information as is desired to be included for consideration by the Board of Directors.

The application shall be accompanied by the following supplemental information (not required to be counted in applying the 10 page limit referred to above):

- a. One copy of the latest U.S. Treasury Department ruling that the applicant has the required tax exempt status described under "Grant Policies" above, together with a signed statement that it is still in effect;
- b. If the applicant institution has not within the past ten years received a grant from the Foundation, one copy of background information (including financial statements for the most recent three years) concerning the institution. A request for waiver of this requirement will be entertained from colleges or universities or other institutions well known to the educated lay public.

Renewal Applications

Where an approved Application requested more than one year of support, the Foundation will, unless otherwise stated, consider a request for a renewal grant. The procedure to be followed is:

Notice of Intention

A Notice of Intention to file a renewal request shall be submitted not later than the deadline for filing Letters of Inquiry for the meeting at which the renewal request is to be considered.

Renewal Application

An original and nine copies (hard copy only; no faxes) of a Renewal Application, which shall not exceed 10 pages in length, signed by the applicant institution and the principal investigator, shall be submitted in time to be received not later than the deadline for filing of Applications. The Renewal Application shall contain the following information:

- 1. The same general information required by Items 1, 3, 5, 7 and 8 of the requirements for an original Application.
- 2. A description in language which an educated lay person can understand of (i) the overall project, (ii) the results achieved in the prior period(s) of Foundation support, (iii) whether the project has achieved the results originally expected and justifies the continuation of the project and (iv) the activity to be carried out during the renewal period. In the case of a research project, an introductory summary (not more than 500 words) of the foregoing information shall be provided.
- A description of any significant change in any of the information submitted in the original Application, in any prior Renewal Application, or in the documentation submitted in connection therewith.

Reports and Acknowledgement of Foundation Support
