



Admissions

There are accommodations for 30 resident participants and additional day students. The regular session is 4 weeks, though a very limited number of 2 week applications may be considered. In addition to the regular sessions, the School has been privileged to offer Master Classes by the maestro Menahem Pressler. There are many opportunities to perform, without any obligation to do so. Participants will be assigned a primary teacher and encouraged to work with other jaculty members as well. Practice schedules are arranged to provide a minimum of four hours daily on a variety of pianos. Participants applying for the first time are asked to submit a tape.

Tuition costs have been kept to a minimum with careful management, sharing of daily chores and the benefits of an endowment. Some financial assistance is available for participants of merit with special need.







History

The Adamant Music School was founded in 1942 in the unincorporated village of Adamant, Vermont, eight miles north of the state capitol of Montpelier. Edwine Behre, Alice Mary Kimball, and Harry Godfrey created the School as a refuge for Edwine Behre's New York City piano students - a place to concentrate on piano in pleasant rural surroundings, away from the stress and concerns of the city. Read more about the School's founding, excerpted from the 60th Anniversary book.



The Village of Adamant has seen many changes over the years. First known as <u>Sodom</u>, and housing a thriving granite quarry, the Village now houses the premier center for piano study in the Northeast - the Adamant Music School.

The Adamant Music School was founded to promote noncompetitive piano study in an atmosphere of cooperative living, and it still lives by these values today. The School honors its founders, and its links to the Vermont community, and thus continues the connections made in 1942.

Membership

In 1921, Edwine Behre founded the Modern Piano School in New York City. The Modern Piano School, also known as Edwine Behre and Associates, was a loose collaboration of professional piano teachers headed by Behre. Twenty years later, in 1942, the Adamant Music School, a residential summer program for pianists, was founded by Edwine Behre together with her friends Alice Mary Kimball and Harry Godfrey. For more on the founding of the School, read its history.



As the piano programs grew and prospered, a more formal organizational structure was needed. In 1955, Behre Piano Associates was incorporated to manage the Adamant Music School, and in 1959 the organization was designated a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit organization by the IRS.

For over 60 years, Behre Piano Associates, Inc. has been operating the Adamant Music School in Adamant, Vermont. The Executive Committee members of Behre Piano Associates, Inc., charged with operating the organization are listed here.

Donations to the organization are tax deductible, and membership cost is nominal.

Benefits

Members are entitled to attend Adamant Music School concerts (except for special events) at no charge; concerts are held on the School's Vermont campus during the summer months, and in New York City in the winter.

Members receive all mailings and event notifications from the School, including the quarterly newsletter, <u>the adamanter</u>.

Non-members may attend a concert in Vermont or New York by making a \$6.00 donation to the Adamant Music School (\$3.00 for seniors and students).

PAUL ALBERTS

Paul Alberts has performed extensively in the United States and in Europe. His early studies were with Sokoloff, pianist of the Curtis String Quartet and Philadelphia Orchestra. After a move to New York City, Alberts completed his undergraduate studies with Adele Marcus and received a scholarship to attend the Juilliard School where received a Master of Music degree as a student of Beveridge Webster After completing his graduate studies at Juilliard, he has continued a long term liaison, coaching with Seymour Bernstein

In summer, 2008, he gave his second concert and teaching tour of Berlin, under the sponsorship of Steinwayhaus, Berlin While there, he played solo works, Beethoven's "Archduke Trio" and with orchestra, playing Chopin's Andante Spianato and Grand Polonaise Brillante He also premiered his own arrangement of Handel's Organ Concerto in B-flat, Opus 4#6

He has also compiled and edited a five volume graded anthology "Piano Music of Africa and the African Diaspora" published by Oxford University Press William has been a member of the Adamant Music School

DEIRDRE O'DONOHUE

Dr Deirdre O'Donohue is a member of the artist piano faculty at New York University's Steinhardt School in the department of Music and Performing Arts Professions, and is also on the college and preparatory faculties of Manhattan School of Music She has performed solo and chamber recitals in Austria, the Netherlands, Italy, Canada and the United States. Deirdre O'Donohue is Past President of the NY State Music Teachers' Association, former Chairperson of the Eastern Division High School Competition, and founder and former Chairperson of the NYSTMA Empire State Performance Competition In the summers of 1999 and 2000, Dr O'Donohue taught piano and chamber music at the Columbia University's High School Chamber Music Program. Since the summer of 2001 she has been on the faculty of the Adamant Music School in Adamant, Vermont, where she is also the Coordinator for week-long piano masterclasses of Menahem Pressler, John O'Conor and André Laplante

Dr. O'Donohue holds degrees from New York University, the Hochscule für Musik und Darstellende Kunst in Vienna, Austria, and Mount Holyoke College in South Hadley, Massachusetts

DMITRY RACHMANOV

Dmitry began his studies at Moscow's Gnesins School of Music and has earned undergraduate and graduate diplomas from The Juilliard School and his Doctor of Musical Arts degree from Manhattan School of Music, all on full scholarship Among his teachers are Ada Traub, Nadia Reisenberg and Arkady Aronov, and he has coached with Karl Ulrich Schnabel, Yvonne Lefébure, Claude Frank, John Browning and Menahem Pressler. He has served on the faculties of Manhattan School of Music and most recently at the Chicago College of Performing Arts at Roosevelt University

Dmitry has been a member of the Adamant Music School faculty since 1993

SETA TANYEL

She has toured extensively in Europe, Russia, the Middle and Far East and North and South America, performing with orchestras including the London Symphony, the Philharmonia, the Vienna Symphony and the Israel Philharmonic In addition to her busy performing schedule, she has given masterclasses and has also taught from 1986 to 1989 at the Yehudi Menuhin School in London

With a discography encompassing works by Bax, Beethoven, Brahms, Chopin, Babadjanian/Harutunian, Franck, Grieg, Khatchaturian, MacDowell, Moszkowski, Poulenc, Scharwenka, Schostakowitch, Schubert and Schumann, Seta Tanyel has received countless critical accolades for her 21 recordings on the Chandos, Collins Classics and Hyperion labels. Her first recital CD of Beethoven and Brahms variations was hailed in America as "the most stunning debut disc heard to date," while she has won particular plaudits for her series of the piano works of Xaver Scharwenka and Montz Moszkowski
