





By-Laws

ARTICLE I ORGANIZATION

The name of the organization shall be the International Center of the Capital Region, Inc. ("ICCR")

ARTICLE II PURPOSE

Section 2.1 ***Mission:*** The ICCR helps the Capital Region engage with the world and promotes international understanding.

Section 2.2 ***Vision:*** The ICCR is the leader in New York's Capital Region in developing international friendship and cooperation. We do this by:

- Serving as citizen diplomats by hosting international visitors and delegations, and promoting professional and cultural exchanges;
- Fostering education, awareness and advocacy about cultural diversity and global issues;
- Promoting the assets of the New York Capital Region to the global community;
- Offering shared services for international groups in the Capital Region.

ARTICLE III BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 3.1 The governing body of the ICCR shall be the Board of Directors.

Section 3.2 The Board of Directors shall consist of no fewer than twelve nor more than twenty-one members. The Executive Director shall serve as an *ex officio* board member.

Section 3.3 Each Director shall serve a term of three years, with the terms of office of the Directors arranged insofar as possible so that one third of the Board of Directors shall be elected each year,

Section 3.4 One-half of the members of the Board of Directors present in person shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Unless otherwise provided in the Certificate of Incorporation, the vote of a majority of the directors present at the time of the vote, if a quorum is present, shall be the act of the Board. No proxies are permitted.

Section 3.5 There shall be a minimum of three regular meetings of the Board each year, which shall be held upon prior notice to all members of the Board. One will be the Annual Meeting which shall be held in the month of December or as close to that as possible, and one will be the Midyear Meeting, which shall be held in June, or failing that, as close to June as possible.

Section 3.6 The President may call a special meeting of the Board at any time, and shall call such meeting whenever requested by two-thirds of the Directors. All Directors shall be notified of any special meeting, and the agenda for the special meeting, at least seven days in advance.

Section 3.7 Vacancies occurring on the Board of Directors between Annual Meetings may be filled for the unexpired term by a vote of the majority of the members of the Board present at any regular or special meeting.

Section 3.8 For the election of a slate of directors for the coming year, the Governance Committee shall submit a list of nominees for the Board of Directors and nominations for officers twenty (20) days prior to the last meeting of the calendar year. Elections for the Board of Directors and officers shall take place at the Annual Meeting.

Section 3.9 Notice of regular Board meetings shall be given no less than 14 days in advance. The Board may establish a schedule of meetings, which, when distributed to Board members, shall constitute notice of such meetings, with an agenda for such meetings being distributed no less than seven days in advance.

Section 3.10 Any member of the Board of Directors who has a financial or personal interest in any matter under discussion by the Board shall be excused from the discussion and shall take no part in the Board's deliberation on the matters. The recusal of a Board member from some part of a discussion shall not affect the existence of a quorum.

Section 3.11 A member of the Board of Directors shall serve no more than six consecutive years on the Board. A former member of the Board may be reelected to the Board after an absence from the Board of one year.

Section 3.12 Any member of the Board of Directors may be removed from the Board, with or without cause, by a majority vote of the Board,

ARTICLE IV
OFFICERS

Section 4.1 The officers of the Board of Directors shall be a President, a Vice President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. Each officer shall take office in January following election at the Annual Meeting of the preceding year, and shall hold office for the period of two years or until a successor shall have been chosen.

Section 4.2 The President shall serve as Chair of the Board of Directors, shall preside at all meetings, shall appoint the chairpersons of all committees and shall be an *ex officio* member of all committees of the ICCR, with the exception of the Governance Committee. The President shall be, together with the Treasurer, empowered to sign checks, notes and other negotiable instruments, subject to such conditions as the Board may impose.

Section 4.3 The Vice President shall have the power to perform all duties of the President in his/her absence.

Section 4.4 The Secretary shall keep full minutes of all meetings, send out notices of all meetings and prepare any necessary correspondence on behalf of the ICCR. The Secretary shall have charge of the ICCR's books and records.

Section 4.5 The Treasurer shall have custody of all funds of the ICCR, shall maintain such funds in a bank or banks as the Board may direct and, together with the President, shall be empowered to sign checks, notes and other negotiable instruments, subject to such conditions as the Board may impose. The Treasurer shall ensure that an accurate account of all receipts, expenditures and outstanding bills is maintained, and shall prepare and issue reports and financial statements for the Board no less often than for each regular Board meeting.

Section 4.6 If any office should become vacant, the Board of Directors may appoint any qualified person to fill such vacancy, who shall hold office for the unexpired term of the predecessor. The Board shall work with the Governance Committee to identify qualified candidates.

Section 4.7 The officers shall also carry out any other or further duties as may be assigned to them by the Board of Directors, or by the President with the consent of the Board.

Section 4.8 Any officer elected by the Board may be removed by the Board, with or without cause, by a majority vote of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE V

COMMITTEES

Section 5.1 The standing committees of the ICCR shall be:

- Executive
- Finance
- Fundraising
- Governance
- Marketing/Communications
- Program
- Volunteer Development

The President shall appoint the chairperson of each of the standing committees. The members of all standing committees shall be selected by the President in consultation with the chairpersons, subject to Board approval. With the exception of the Executive Committee, each committee shall consist of at least two Board members and such other non-Board members as the President and the chairperson shall decide. Committee members shall serve for one year.

Section 5.2 The Executive Committee shall consist of the current officers (President, Vice President, Treasurer, and Secretary), the immediate past President, and the Executive Director. The Executive Committee shall act for and on behalf of the ICCR on any and all matters arising or requiring action between meetings of the Board of Directors. This committee shall also be responsible for the overall development of financial plans, goals, strategy, bylaws, policy and practices.

Section 5.3 The Finance Committee shall oversee the finances of the ICCR, and shall prepare a draft annual budget for discussion and approval at the last Board meeting of the calendar year.

Section 5.4 The Fundraising Committee shall develop new and maintain existing sources of financial and community support to carry out the ICCR's mission.

Section 5.5 The Governance Committee is charged with nominations and board development. It will recruit, develop and nurture existing as well as prospective board members. This committee shall prepare and submit lists of nominees for the Board of Directors and nominations for officers in accordance with Article III of the by-laws.

Section 5.6 The Marketing/Communications Committee shall promote the activities of the center and increase awareness of the ICCR's programs and services.

Section 5.7 The Program Committee shall evaluate and provide guidance for all of the ICCR's on-going programs. It shall develop recommendations for new programs and services for the ICCR to meet the needs and fulfill the mission of the ICCR.

Section 5.8 The Volunteer Development Committee shall actively recruit, develop and nurture a base of volunteers to help carry forward the ICCR's mission.

Section 5.9 The President may name other *ad hoc* committees with the approval of the Board of Directors. All committees shall report to the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI
EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

The Board of Directors may appoint an Executive Director to assist in the operation of the ICCR.

The Executive Director shall be the principal administrative officer of the ICCR. The Executive Director has responsibility for directing the activities of the organization, interpreting policies, administering the budget, and directing the fiscal management of the organization. The Executive Director shall engage, direct and discharge any organization staff. He/she shall report on the ICCR's programmatic operations and activities at regular meetings of the Board of Directors, and shall be an *ex officio* member of all committees. The Executive Director may also carry out such responsibilities or exercise such other or further powers as may be assigned by the President or directed by the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI
AMENDMENTS

These bylaws may be amended by the majority vote of the Board of Directors at any meeting, provided a quorum is present and notice of such proposed amendment has been contained in the notice of such meeting.
