The mission of Impact Foundation is to build the capacity of nonprofits, businesses, and individuals to maximize their community impact with an overall goal to dramatically improve its nonprofit partners' capacity to produce superior results. Impact Foundation operates exclusively for charitable scientific and educational purposes. To meet its primary purpose, the foundation receives and administers donations, makes contributions to, and provides assistance to other nonprofit organizations. The Foundation has the power to establish, own, operate, control, conduct and maintain various organizations and programs to meet its primary purpose. Impact operates charitable initiatives designed to measurably improve society in areas including economic development, health and healthcare access, education and training, and other philanthropic areas identified by donors

	IMPACT INSTITUTEImpact and its supporting organization, Achievements Unlimited Foundation, recognize that many nonprofit organizations often lack expertise and financial resources to invest in critical organizational assessments, strategic planning and highly effective fundraising efforts to ensure their organization's effectiveness and sustainability over the long-term. Impact supports and promotes education and training sessions for partner organizations through the Impact Institute. The Impact Institute has provided training to approximately 289 partner nonprofit organizations since its 2005 inception. Fundraising Training Training organizations to become effective fundraisers is a key education program at the Impact Institute. The Institute has reported that new fundraising strategies were developed and implemented by 188 nonprofit organizations as a result of the training and technical assistance received. Strategic Planning Training Training organizations to have highly effective competent boards and management is a key focus at the Impact Institute. Impact has encouraged many area nonprofit organizations to attend strategic planning and organizational assessment training through the Impact Institute. The Institute has tracked and reported that strategic plans have been developed and implemented by 54 nonprofit organizations as a result of training received. The Institute has developed and is piloting the High Impact Nonprofit Designation program that involves a more in depth commitment from nonprofit organizations through completion of an organizational assessment, organizational development plan, and more intensive leadership education for boards and executives. Upon completion of the program nonprofit organizations will receive a High Impact Seal of Distinction Impact partnered with Mark Kramer, Founder and Managing Director of FSG, author of several influential articles and one of the leading experts in the field of philanthropy, to facilitate the HIP initiative. The goal of HIP is to inspire funders

	ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENTImpact Foundation supports the economic development of North Dakota communities by initiating and funding various initiatives directed at assisting veteran, women's, and Native American small businesses located in the less populated areas of North Dakota. Grants from the USDA Office of Rural Development, North Dakota Department of Commerce, and Dakota Certified Development Corporation in 2005 established the procurement assistance program (PAC) to provide research, technical assistance, and training to North Dakota small businesses assisting them in securing federal and state government contracts for their goods and services The Otto Bremer Foundation provided Impact with a \$240,000 multi-year grant in 2008 to establish a Veteran's Entrepreneurship Assistance. Program This funding allowed the PAC to assist veterans to start businesses and to build their businesses by securing government contracts. Funding from the USDA Office of Rural Development has allowed this program to assist businesses in key rural communities throughout the state. The PAC program has helped over 57 veteran-owned businesses secure \$32.6 million in government contracts. Through 2009, technical assistance has been provided to over 225 North Dakota businesses including 153 Native American and 57 veteran owned businesses and representing 90% of the current 8(a)/Small Disadvantaged Business certified companies. The PAC has provided 24 workshops with over 412 attendees. Over 191 bids have been submitted with 91 contracts obtained totaling over \$153 million of which \$126 million were Native American business contract dollars. Over 660 North Dakota jobs have been created and/or retained Impact entered into a 30-yea loan commitment with the USDA Intermediary Loan Program (IRP) through the Office of Rural Development in 2007. The IRP created a \$937,500 pool of funds available to qualifying North Dakota businesses at low interest rates. The revolving pool provides an ongoing source of loans to small businesses as a result of the

	COMMUNITY SUPPORTThe Foundation provides grants to support community events, statewide nonprofit organizations and other societal improvement initiatives Grants were provided for these purposes from established named funds and from other grants and donor contributions to the Foundation Impact provided support to the local area Fill-the-Dome program to restock local food shelters. The Foundation established a Clubs Fore Kids Initiative to promote youth golf programs by providing clubs, practice and play opportunities to those unable to afford the cost of participating. Impact has given back to North Dakota communities impacted by

natural disasters During 2009, Impact worked closely with Red River Valley community leaders to create funds at Impact to receive grants and donor contributions to provide financial support for communities affected by the 2009 flooding of the Red River Impact coordinated with community committees to distribute funds to nonprofit organizations that provided relief to flood victims. The funds established in 2009 remain in effect to collect contributions and to distribute funds for future

Other program services (Code) (Expenses \$ 164,707 including grants of \$) (Revenue \$ 35,725) GIVEBACK INITIATIVE with grants from Dakota Medical Foundation, Alex Stern Family Foundation and various individual and corporate contributions, Impact launched the GiveBack Initiative in 2006 to inspire donors to substantially increase and improve the impact of their giving of time, talent, and treasure in North Dakota and western Minnesota communities. Initiative strategies have focused on education and training for nonprofit organizations to become highly proficient fundraisers and more operationally efficient and effective, education and training for donors and facilitation of greater volunteerism in the region through marketing, education and training of businesses and nonprofit organizations. The initiative has created new ways of thinking and new approaches to maximize opportunities presented with our region's significant wealth transfer and substantial volunteer workforce Impact commissioned and funded a North Dakota wealth transfer study in 2005 conducted by the Center on Wealth and Philanthropy at Boston College in Boston, Massachusetts. Impact has presented the North Dakota Wealth Transfer Study to donors, community leaders, nonprofit organizations, attorneys, accountants, financial advisors, bank, and trust personnel in several North Dakota communities. The study concluded that through 2055 North Dakota estates will pay an estimated \$55 3 billion in estate taxes. Under the GiveBack Initiative basic strategies are presented to educate donors on how to reduce the outflow of capital (estate taxes) from our region through increased charitable giving and better estate planning. Impact has contracted with Boston College to produce a new Wealth Transfer Micro-simulation Model that will provide estimates for North Dakota county-bycounty wealth transfer data along with more recent U S data that will be completed in 2011 Impact's website (www.impactgiveback.org) is designed to provide a one-stop information resource for donors to conveniently locate, review, and connect with over 350 nonprofit organizations in the region. Nonprofit organizations in North Dakota and northwestern Minnesota are encouraged to place their organizational information on the website to easily connect with donors for their time, talent and treasure. Donors are able to research and identify their favorite nonprofit organizations and to make contributions directly online using their credit card or to purchase gift cards that are redeemed as contributions to listed organizations. Nonprofit organizations are able to utilize the website to receive contributions, process event registrations, and conduct fundraising auctions. Impact partners with Dakota Medical Foundation to sponsor an annual Giving Hearts Day around Valentine's Day using the capabilities of the GiveBack online giving website Approximately 6,000 contributions totaling over \$1,291,000 have been completed since implementation of the GiveBack website giving online capability benefiting over 80 nonprofit organizations Impact partnered with Dakota Medical Foundation in 2007 to implement a Volunteer Initiative designed to help nonprofit organizations more effectively recruit, train, manage and retain volunteers. Volunteer Management Training has been held with 25 nonprofit organizations represented by 30 individuals participating in the training. The success of the training programs led to the establishment of Volunteer Management Advanced Leadership training programs resulting in 11 nonprofit organizations participating in focused monthly training sessions. Impact partnered with FirstLink in 2009 to sponsor a Regional Conference on Volunteer Management and Leadership resulting in over 100 participants from North Dakota and Minnesota attending. The Impact GiveBack website www impactgiveback org has a Volunteer section that provides the capability for nonprofit organizations to list their volunteer opportunities and to track the volunteer's time spent. An Impact Institute study conducted with 6 partner nonprofit organizations over a 7-month period identified a monthly average of 615 volunteers in different positions generating 2,478 volunteer hours correlating to an economic impact of approximately \$337,668 in wages Impact provides grant writing technical support to its partner nonprofit organizations desiring to increase resources for their programs and services. Dakota Medical Charities provided a multi-year grant that initially funded this initiative in 2005. Impact continues to leverage those funds by assisting other nonprofit organizations with their fundraising efforts through writing effective grant applications. Grant writing efforts to date have resulted in 20 grants totaling \$5,830,401 prepared and submitted to various grant making organizations, 11 grants awarded totaling \$2,952,100, 6 grants denied totaling \$1,498,000 A multi-year \$452,510 Bush Foundation grant was awarded in 2007 to support statewide capacity building efforts of the Impact Institute A \$2,000,000 Bush Foundation grant was awarded to Achievements Unlimited Foundation at the end of 2008 to expand Impact Institute training and education conferences throughout North Dakota
