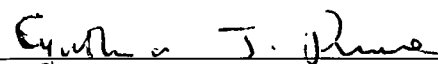
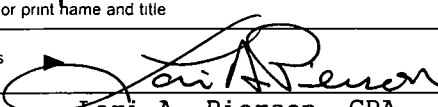

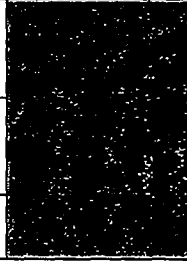

3200 individual items have been provided to Swaziland recipients from Australian supporters during 2009, valued at over \$30,000 Australian.

SOHO seeks to empower women providing screening, education and skills designed to help them become an effective part of the solution and to build more stable environments for children. Educated and equipped, women can be better care givers, community educators, mentors, income-earners and role models. Women are seen as essential elements to revive and rebuild communities.

Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

SOHO programs include the establishment of welcome places, homesteads and community gardens. Welcome places and homesteads accomodate 1,000's of orphans and provide indoor multipurpose rooms to accomodate meals and educational support. Homestead and community gardens provide food for orphans and fresh produce for sale so that funds are generated to address other basic needs. Two welcome places have been established in Mhlosheni and Mbekiweni, Swaziland.

This program sends container shipments of medical supplies, clothing, school supplies, toys, and other items to "clinics" and the welcome places. The shipments also provide used printing presses, bibles, and bible study resources to support the emotional and spiritual growth of the individuals. During 2009, 292 boxes, bales or crates were shipped to Swaziland. Volunteers at the clinics distribute the clothing and hygiene supplies serving 7500-10,000 people annually. A team of 15 participants worked in clinics during 2009.

SOHO programs also include volunteer mission trips. Two volunteer mission trips have resulted in the distribution of the container contents as well as health examinations and medical treatments for physical well being. Thousands of orphans have received medical treatments or health examinations under these programs.

**BYLAWS
OF**

SAVING ORPHANS THROUGH HEALTHCARE AND OUTREACH, INC.

ARTICLE I.

Members

Section 1.1. No Members. Saving Orphans through Healthcare and Outreach, Inc. (the "Corporation") shall have no members.

ARTICLE II.

Board of Directors

Section 2.1. Duties and Qualifications. The business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by the Board of Directors.

Section 2.2. Number, Term, and Election. The Board of Directors shall consist of a minimum of three (3) directors and a maximum of fifteen (15) directors, with the exact number of directors specified from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors. Each director shall serve for a term of three (3) years. Nominations of directors shall be made by the management committee. Directors shall be elected by a majority vote of the Board of Directors. Voting for the election of directors shall be by ballot unless otherwise directed by the Board of Directors. Each director shall have the right to vote for as many persons as there are directors to be elected, but no director shall be entitled to cumulate votes. Despite the expiration of a director's term, the director continues to serve until a successor is elected and qualifies, or until there is a decrease in the number of directors.

Section 2.3. Vacancies. Any vacancy among the directors caused by death, resignation, removal, increase in the number of directors or otherwise may be filled by a majority vote of the remaining members of the Board of Directors. The term of office of a director

chosen to fill a vacancy shall expire at the later of the next annual meeting of the directors, or at such time as a successor shall be duly elected and qualified.

Section 2.4. Removal. Any director may be removed, with or without cause, by the vote of two-thirds (2/3) of the directors holding office but not counting the director to be removed.

Section 2.5. Scheduled Meetings. Unless the Board of Directors determines otherwise, the Board of Directors shall meet a minimum of twice per year. The dates of the meetings shall be established at the last regularly scheduled meeting of the calendar year. Meetings shall be held at the principal office of the Corporation or at such other place as the Board of Directors may elect. No notice shall be necessary for the holding of the scheduled meetings.

Section 2.6. Other Meetings. Other regular meetings of the Board of Directors may be held pursuant to a resolution of the Board to such effect, and shall be held whenever convenient for the Board of Directors. Unless otherwise provided by the Board of Directors, regular meetings shall be held at the Corporation's principal office. No notice shall be necessary for any regular meeting. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be held upon the call of the presiding officer of the Board of Directors or the President and upon at least forty-eight (48) hours' notice specifying the date, time, place and purpose or purposes of the meeting, given to each director either personally or by mail, electronic mail, facsimile transmission, or telephone. Oral notice is authorized. A director may waive any required notice of an scheduled, regular or special meeting. The waiver must be in writing, signed by the director entitled to the notice, and filed with the minutes or Corporate records. A director's attendance at or participation in a meeting waives any required notice to the director of the meeting unless the director at the

beginning of the meeting or promptly upon the director's arrival, objects to holding the meeting or transacting business at the meeting and does not vote for or assent to action taken at the meeting.

Section 2.7. Quorum; Voting. A majority of the directors in office when action is taken, but in no event fewer than two (2) directors, shall be necessary to constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business at a meeting of the Board of Directors. If a quorum is present when a vote is taken, the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors present when the act is taken shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a greater number is required by law, the Articles of Incorporation, or these Bylaws. A director may participate in a scheduled, regular, a special, or a committee meeting of the directors, by or through the use of any means of communication by which all directors participating may simultaneously hear each other during the meeting. A director participating by this means is considered to be present in person at the meeting.

Section 2.8. Action by Consent. Any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of the Board of Directors may be taken without a meeting if the action is taken by all directors. The action must be evidenced by at least one (1) written consent describing the action to be taken, signed by each director, and included in the minutes or filed with the corporate records reflecting the action taken. Action taken under this section is effective when the last director signs the consent, unless the consent specifies a prior or subsequent effective date.

Section 2.9. Executive Committee. There shall be, and by the adoption of these Bylaws the Board of Directors hereby creates, an Executive Committee of the Corporation, which shall consist of a minimum of two (2) directors, appointed by a majority of all the directors in office when the action is taken. During intervals between meetings of the Board of

Directors, the Executive Committee shall have and exercise all of the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the Corporation, except where prohibited by law. In addition, the Executive Committee, to the extent specified by the Board of Directors, may exercise the authority of the Board of Directors, except where prohibited by law. The Executive Committee shall cause minutes of its proceedings to be kept and filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors.

Section 2.10. Other Committees. The Board of Directors may from time to time create and appoint standing, special or other committees to undertake studies, make recommendations, and carry on functions for the purpose of efficiently accomplishing the purposes of the Corporation. Committees, to the extent specified by the Board of Directors, may exercise the powers, functions, or authority of the Board of Directors, except where prohibited by law; provided, however, that if a committee is to exercise board powers, functions, or authority, (a) all the persons serving on the committee must be directors, (b) there must be at least two (2) persons on the committee, and (c) the creation of the committee and the appointment of its members shall be by a majority of all directors in office when the action is taken.

ARTICLE III.

Officers

Section 3.1. Officers and Qualifications Therefor. The officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, a Vice President, a Secretary and a Treasurer. The officers shall be chosen by the Board of Directors. Any two (2) or more offices may be held by the same person.

Section 3.2. Terms of Office. Each officer of the Corporation shall be elected by the Board of Directors at its final scheduled meeting of the year and shall hold office for a term of one (1) year and until a successor shall be duly elected and qualified, or until resignation, removal, or death.

Section 3.3. Vacancies. Whenever any vacancies shall occur in any of the offices of the Corporation for any reason, the same may be filled by the Board of Directors, and any officer so elected shall hold office until the expiration of the term of the officer causing the vacancy and until the officer's successor shall be duly elected and qualified.

Section 3.4. Removal. Any officer of the Corporation may be removed, with or without cause, at any time by the Board of Directors.

Section 3.5. Compensation. Each officer of the Corporation shall receive such compensation for his or her services in such office as may be fixed by action of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE IV.

Powers and Duties of Officers

Section 4.1. President. The President, if present, shall preside at all meetings of the members and the Board of Directors. At each scheduled meetings of members, the President or the President's designee shall report on the activities of the Corporation. Subject to the general control of the Board of Directors, the President shall manage and supervise all of the affairs of the Corporation and shall perform all of the usual duties of the chief executive officer of a corporation.

Section 4.2. Vice President. Subject to the general control of the Board of Directors, if the President is not present, the Vice President shall discharge all the usual functions of the President and shall have such other powers and duties as these Bylaws, the Board of Directors, or an officer authorized by the Board may prescribe.

Section 4.3. Secretary. The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the members and of the Board of Directors, and prepare, keep, or cause to be kept, a true and complete record and minutes of the proceedings of such meetings, and shall perform a like duty, when required, for

all committees appointed by the Board of Directors. If required, the Secretary shall attest the execution by the Corporation of deeds, leases, agreements and other official documents. The Secretary shall attend to the giving and serving of all notices of the Corporation required by these Bylaws, shall have custody of the books (except books of account) and records of the Corporation, shall be responsible for authenticating records of the Corporation, and in general shall perform all duties pertaining to the office of Secretary and such other duties as these Bylaws, the Board of Directors, or an officer authorized by the Board may prescribe.

Section 4.4. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall keep correct and complete records of account, showing accurately at all times the financial condition of the Corporation. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of, and be responsible for, all funds, notes, securities and other valuables which may from time to time come into the possession of the Corporation and shall deposit, or cause to be deposited, all funds of the Corporation with such depositories as the Board of Directors shall designate. At each annual meeting of the members, the Treasurer, or the Treasurer's designee, shall report on the financial condition of the Corporation. The Treasurer, or the Treasurer's designee, shall furnish, at meetings of the Board of Directors or whenever requested, a statement of the financial condition of the Corporation, and in general shall perform all duties pertaining to the office of Treasurer.

Section 4.5. Assistant Officers. The Board of Directors may from time to time designate and elect assistant officers who shall have such powers and duties as the officers whom they are elected to assist shall specify and delegate to them, and such other powers and duties as these Bylaws or the Board of Directors may prescribe. An Assistant Secretary may, in the absence or disability of the Secretary, attest the execution of all documents by the Corporation.

ARTICLE V.

Miscellaneous

Section 5.1. Corporate Seal. The Corporation may, but need not, have a corporate seal. The form of any such corporate seal may be specified in a resolution of the Board of Directors. A corporate seal, however, shall not be required for any purpose, and its absence shall not invalidate any document or action.

Section 5.2. Execution of Contracts and Other Documents. Unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors, all written contracts and other documents entered into by the Corporation shall be executed on behalf of the Corporation by the President or Vice President, and, if required, attested by the Secretary or an assistant secretary.

Section 5.3. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin on January 1st of each year and end on the immediately following December 31st.

ARTICLE VI.

Amendments

Subject to law and the Articles of Incorporation, the power to make, alter, amend or repeal all or any part of these Bylaws is vested in the Board of Directors. The Corporation must provide notice to the directors of any meeting at which an amendment to the Bylaws is to be considered and voted upon.
