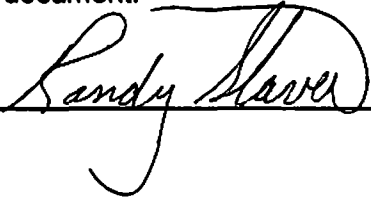

**BY-LAWS OF THE:
ROCHESTER DOWNTOWN ALLIANCE**

A non-profit, 501-C6 Corporation
April 21, 2010

I. REGISTERED OFFICE

The registered office of this corporation, at which the general business of this corporation shall be transacted and where the records of this corporation shall be kept, shall be at such place in the State of Minnesota as shall be fixed from time to time by duly adopted resolutions of the Board of Directors. Until otherwise fixed by the Board of Directors, the registered office shall be located at 220 South Broadway, Suite 100, Rochester, MN 55904.

II. DIRECTORS

- A. Number and Method of Election: The Board of Directors of this corporation shall consist of no fewer than thirteen (13) and no more than twenty-two (22) persons, and, subject to such limitation, the number of members of the Board of Directors shall be such as may be designated from time to time by the Board of Directors. Directors of this corporation shall be elected by the Board of Directors at each annual meeting.
- B. Terms: Except as otherwise provided in Article II.A. each director of this corporation shall be elected to serve for a term of either one (1) year or three (3) years. A director shall hold office for the term for which they were elected and until the end of the meeting at which their successor has been elected and until such successor has qualified, or until the director's prior death, resignation or removal. Any director may at any time be removed with or without cause by the Board of Directors. Any vacancy occurring because of the death, resignation or removal of a director, or because of an increase in the number of members of the Board of Directors, shall be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired term of such director.
- C. Term Limits: No director shall serve for more than seven (7) years unless any director is elected Chair in their 7th term, whereby upon approval of the Board of Directors, the director may serve an 8th year as Past Chair of the Board of Directors. After a mandatory one (1) year absence from the Board of Directors, a former director may be considered by the Nominating Committee for a new term and subsequent terms.
- D. Ex Officio and Honorary Directors: The Board of Directors may, from time to time, elect one or more ex officio or honorary directors of this corporation who shall be advisory members of the Board of Directors of this corporation. Any such election shall be for such time to time deems appropriate. All ex officio and honorary directors shall be non-voting directors of this corporation.
- E. Director Conflicts of Interest: This corporation shall not enter into any contract or transaction with (a) one or more of its directors, (b) a director of a related organization (within the meaning of Minnesota Statutes, section 317A.011, subd. 18), or (c) an organization in or of which an RDA director is a director, officer or legal representative or has a material financial interest; unless the material facts as to the contract or transaction and as to the director's interest are fully disclosed or known to the Board of Directors, and the Board of Directors authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or transaction in good faith by the affirmative vote of a majority of the directors (without counting the interested director), at a meeting at which there is a quorum without counting the interested director. Failure to comply with the provisions of this Article shall not invalidate any contract or transaction to which this corporation is a party. This Section does not authorize any act of "self-dealing" as defined in Section 4941(a) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

III. MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- A. Meetings: Meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at such time and place as are announced at a previous meeting of the Board of Directors. The annual meeting shall be designated as the January meeting of the Board of Directors. Meetings of the Board of Directors may also be called at any time (a) by the Chair, or (b) upon the written request of five (5) or more members of the Board of Directors. Anyone entitled to call a meeting of the Board of Directors may make a written request to the Secretary by either postal mail or email to call the meeting, and the Secretary shall give notice of the meeting, setting forth the time, place and purpose thereof, to be held between five and thirty days after receiving the request by mail or email. If the Secretary fails to give notice of the meeting within seven days from the day on which the request was made, the person or persons who requested the meeting may fix the time and place of the meeting and give notice in the manner hereinafter provided.
- B. Notice of Meetings: Written notice of each meeting of the Board of Directors for which written notice is required, and of each annual meeting, stating the time, place and purpose thereof shall be sent by postal mail or email, not less than two nor more than thirty days before the meeting, excluding the day of the meeting, to each director at his or her postal mail or email address according to the last available records of this corporation. Any director may waive notice of a meeting before, at or after the meeting, orally, or by email, or in writing, or by attendance. Attendance at a meeting is deemed a waiver unless the director objects at the beginning of the meeting to the transaction of business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened and the director does not participate in the meeting.
- C. Quorum and Voting: The presence of a majority of the members of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum at any meeting thereof, but the directors present at any meeting, although less than a quorum, may adjourn the meeting from time to time. At all meetings of the Board of Directors, each director shall be entitled to cast one vote on any question coming before the meeting. A majority vote of the directors present at any meeting, if there be a quorum, shall be sufficient to transact any business, unless a greater number of votes are required by law or these By-Laws. A director shall not appoint a proxy for himself or herself or vote by proxy at a meeting of the Board of Directors. A director who is present at a meeting of the Board of Directors when an action is taken is presumed to have assented to the action unless the director votes against the action or is prohibited from voting on the action.
- D. Adjourned Meetings: When a meeting of the Board of Directors is adjourned to another time or place, notice of the adjourned meeting need not be given other than by announcement at the meeting at which adjournment is taken.
- E. Written Action: Any action that could be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors may be taken by written action signed by all of the directors.

Electronic Voting without a Meeting: Any action item which is required to be taken, or which may be taken, by majority vote at a meeting of the Board of Directors, may be taken without a meeting, by means of electronic communication when deemed necessary and authorized by the Chair of the Board of Directors.

The motion must be made by the Chair of the Board of Directors, and seconded by another Board member. The motion and the second may be made by electronic communication. For purposes of this article a majority of the full Board of Directors constitutes a quorum. No voting by proxy will be permitted.

Electronic communications of action items must show all names of the Board of Directors and shall not be made by blind copy -- allowing for a "reply to all" of each director's vote.

The motion must have a deadline with a defined date and time of no more than 24 hours after the

motion is made. Up and until this deadline, votes by directors may be changed by means of electronic communication. Votes cast later than the deadline of 24 hours, not including intervening weekends and/or holidays shall not be counted.

Board members may cast their votes in the same manner as delivery. For purposes of this article the motion, second and votes cast shall be documented and retained by the secretary and published in the minutes of the next published minutes of the Board of Directors.

Board members shall regularly notify the corporation of any changes in notification addresses or numbers. Delivery shall be deemed complete upon deposit or electronic transmission.

IV. SELECTION AND ELECTION OF DIRECTORS AND OFFICERS

- A. Nominating Committee: Prior to September 1st of each year the Chair of the Board shall appoint, subject to approval by the Board of Directors, a nominating committee of five (5) members. The Chair of the Board shall designate the Vice Chair as the Chair of the Nominating Committee. The Nominating Committee shall determine the needs for candidates for the Board of Directors, including the number and terms of each open position including vacancies.
- Prior to October 1st of each year, Stakeholders shall be invited to submit the names of potential candidates for the open positions of the Board of Directors of the RDA. Notification will be sent by email to all known stakeholders, and by posting in the regular publications of the RDA. The Nominating Committee shall make public the process, rules, and contact methods for each nominee to be considered.
- B. Report of the Nominating Committee: Prior to November 1st of each year, the Nominating Committee shall file its report with the Board of Directors which shall approve or modify the slate as it deems appropriate. The slate shall consist of candidates to serve any open one-year or three-year terms, candidates to fulfill vacant terms, and a candidate for each Officer of the RDA (Chair, Chair Elect, and Secretary/Treasurer). One 1-year term will be offered to the past Chair of the Board of Directors if recommended by the Nominating Committee. Upon approval of a full slate by the Board of Directors at the annual meeting, it shall notify stakeholders either by email, postal mail or through the regular publication of the RDA announcing the approved slate.
- C. Seating of New Directors: All newly elected Board members shall be seated at the January Board meeting and may be participating members thereafter. Retiring Directors shall continue to serve until the end of December.
- D. Vacancies: A member of the Board of Directors who shall be absent from three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the Board of Directors shall automatically be dropped from membership on the Board, unless confined by illness, or whose absence is approved by a majority vote of those voting at any Board meeting on the issue. Vacancies on the Board of Directors or among Officers, whether created voluntarily or involuntarily, may be filled by the Board of Directors by a majority vote. Such successors shall be elected to fill the unexpired term.

V. OFFICERS:

- A. Officers: The Officers of this corporation shall be a Chair, Vice Chair (usually the Incoming Chair), Secretary, and Treasurer and such other officers as the Board of Directors may from time to time designate. The same person may hold more than one office at the same time, except the officers of (a) Chair and Vice Chair, and (b) Chair and Secretary. The officers need not be directors of this corporation.

- B. Tenure of Office: Officers shall be elected by the Board of Directors to serve for terms of one year and until their respective successors are chosen and have qualified. Any officer may at any time be removed by the Board of Directors with or without cause.
- C. Chair: The Chair shall be the chief executive officer of this corporation. They shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. They shall be responsible for the general supervision, direction and management of the affairs of this corporation. They may execute on behalf of this corporation all contracts, deeds, conveyances and other instruments in writing which may be required or authorized by the Board of Directors for the property and necessary transaction of the business of this corporation.
- D. Vice Chair: The Vice Chair shall perform the duties of the Chair in case of the latter's absence or disability. The execution by the Vice Chair on behalf of this corporation of any instrument shall have the same force and effect as if it were executed on behalf of this corporation by the Chair.
- E. Secretary: The Secretary shall keep accurate minutes of all meetings and shall be custodian of the records, documents and papers of this corporation. They shall provide for the keeping of proper records of all transactions of this corporation. They shall have and may exercise any and all other powers and duties pertaining by law, regulation or practice to the office of Secretary, or imposed by these By-Laws. They shall also perform such other duties as may be assigned to them from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- F. Treasurer: The Treasurer shall be responsible for maintaining accurate financial records for this corporation and safeguarding the assets of this corporation. They shall present a report of this corporation's financial transactions and status to the Board of Directors at its annual meeting, and shall from time to time make such other reports to the Board of Directors as it may require. The Treasurer shall perform such other duties as may be assigned to them from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- G. Assistant Secretary and/or Treasurer: The Board of Directors in its discretion may elect an Assistant Secretary and/or Treasurer who shall perform the duties and assume the responsibilities of the Secretary and/or Treasurer as above set forth under the general direction of the Secretary, Treasurer or Chair.
- H. Additional Powers: Any officer of this corporation, in addition to the powers conferred upon him or her by these By-Laws shall have such powers and perform such additional duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors.

VI. COMMITTEES

- A. Authority: The Board of Directors may act by and through such committees as may be specified in resolutions adopted by a majority of the members of the Board of Directors. Each such committee shall have such duties and responsibilities as are granted to it from time to time by the Board of Directors. Each such committee shall at all times be subject to the control and direction of the Board of Directors. Committee members, other than members of the Executive Committee, need not be directors.
- B. Executive Committee: The Board of Directors may designate an Executive Committee composed of at least six directors designated by the Board of Directors. The Executive Committee will be comprised of RDA officers and Chairs of the standing committees. They shall have the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the business of this corporation in the interval between meetings of the Board of Directors, and the Executive Committee shall at all times be subject to the control and direction of the Board of Directors.

- C. Meetings and Voting: Meetings of each committee may be held at such time and place as are announced at a previous meeting of the committee. Meetings of any committee may also be called at any time by the chairperson of the committee or by the Chair, on at least five days' notice by mail, or two days' oral notice by telephone or in person. Appearance at a meeting is deemed to be a waiver of notice unless the committee member objects at the beginning of the meeting to the transaction of business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened and the committee member does not participate in the meeting. At all meetings of a committee of this corporation each member thereof shall be entitled to cast one vote on any question coming before such meeting. The presence of a majority of the membership of any committee of this corporation shall constitute a quorum at any meeting thereof, but the members of a committee present at any such meeting, although less than a quorum, may adjourn the meeting from time to time. A majority vote of the members of a committee of this corporation present at any meeting thereof, if there be a quorum, shall be sufficient for the transaction of the business of such committee. Any action that could be taken at a committee meeting may be taken by written action signed by all members of the committee
- D. Electronic Voting without a Meeting: Any action item which is required to be taken, or which may be taken, by majority vote at a meeting of a committee, may be taken without a meeting, by means of electronic communication when deemed necessary and authorized by the Chair of the committee.

The motion must be made by the Chair of the committee, and seconded by another committee member. The motion and the second may be made by electronic communication. For purposes of this article a majority of the full committee constitutes a quorum. No voting by proxy will be permitted.

Electronic communications of action items must show all names of the committee members and shall not be made by blind copy -- allowing for a "reply to all" of each member's vote.

The motion must have a deadline with a defined date and time of no more than 24 hours after the motion is made. Up and until this deadline, votes by committee members may be changed by means of electronic communication. Votes cast later than the deadline of 24 hours, not including intervening weekends and/or holidays shall not be counted.

Committee members may cast their votes in the same manner as delivery. For purposes of this article the motion, second and votes cast shall be documented and retained by the secretary and published in the minutes of the next published minutes of the committee.

Committee members shall regularly notify the corporation of any changes in notification addresses or numbers. Delivery shall be deemed complete upon deposit or electronic transmission.

VII. INDEMNIFICATION

To the full extent permitted by any applicable law, this corporation shall indemnify each person who, while acting in good faith and within the scope of their duties on behalf of the corporation, is made or threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending or completed civil, criminal, administrative, arbitration, or investigative proceeding, including a proceeding by or in the right of this corporation, by reason of the former or present capacity of the person as:

- A. A director, officer, or member of a committee of this corporation or;
- B. A director, officer, partners, trustee, or agent of another organization or employee benefit plan, who while a director, officer of employee of this corporation, is or was serving the other corporation at the request of this corporation or whose duties as a

director, officer or employee of this corporation involve or involved such service to the other corporation;

against judgments, penalties, fines (including, without limitation, excise taxes assessed against the person with respect to an employee benefit plan), settlements, and reasonable attorneys' fees and disbursements incurred by the person in connection with the proceeding.

Indemnification provided by this section shall continue as to a person who has ceased to be a director, officer, or committee member, shall inure to the benefit of the heirs, executors and administrators of such person and shall apply whether or not the claim against such person arises out of matters occurring before the adoption of this section. Any indemnification realized other than under this section shall apply as a credit against any indemnification provided by this section.

This corporation may, to the full extent permitted by applicable law from time to time in effect, purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any person who is or was a director, officer, or a member of a committee of this corporation against any liability asserted against such person and incurred by such person in any such capacity.

VIII. MISCELLANEOUS

- A. Fiscal Year: Unless otherwise fixed by the Board of Directors, the fiscal year of this corporation shall begin on January 1 and end on the succeeding December 31.
- B. Corporate Seal. This Corporation shall have no seal.
- C. Electronic Communications: A director or committee member may participate in a meeting by any means of communication through which such person, other persons so participating, and all persons physically present at the meeting may simultaneously hear each other during the meeting. Participation in a meeting by that means constitutes presence in person at the meeting. A conference among directors or committee members by any means of communication through which such persons may simultaneously hear each other during the conference is a meeting of the Board of Directors or committee, as the case may be, if the same notice is given of the conference as would be required for a meeting, and if the number of persons participating in the conference would be sufficient to constitute a quorum at a meeting. Participation in a meeting by that means constitutes presence in person at the meeting.
- D. Amendments: The Board of Directors may amend these By-Laws by adopting a resolution setting forth the amendment.
- E. Authority to Borrow, Encumber Assets: No director, officer, agent or employee of this corporation shall have any power or authority to borrow money on its behalf, to pledge its credit or to mortgage or pledge its real or personal property except within the scope and to the extent of the authority delegated by resolutions adopted from time to time by the Board of Directors. Authority may be given by the Board of Directors for any of the above purposes and may be general or limited to specific instances.
- F. Deposit of Funds: All funds of this corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of this corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may approve or designate, and all such funds shall be withdrawn only in the manner or manners authorized by the Board of Directors from time to time.
