MAIN STREETS OF OLD TOWN ASSOCIATION Board of Directors Meeting March 18, 2009 – 8:30 AM Augello's Coffeehouse and Delicatessen

Call To Order – Jason Broadwater called the meeting to order. Comments were made by several people regarding the successful St. Paddy's Day on Main event. D. Lawrence expressed Candy Randall's appreciation to the sponsors of St. Paddy's Day on Main: Williams and Fudge, McHale's on Main, O'Darby's, and Comer Distributing.

Old Business – J. Broadwater reviewed the Master Plan update prior to D. Lawrence's presentation on the Employment goal. Three tasks came from the work invested in the downtown residential development goal. A video was made to be used when the bias against residential rental properties is addressed with decision-makers. A database of people interested in downtown will be developed for ongoing communications. Lastly, the developer of Renaissance Square spoke to the Board about his experience developing an urban residential project in Rock Hill.

- J. Broadwater turned the floor over D. Lawrence. J. Broadwater explained that the Employment topic would be covered with background first, strategy development second, and task creation third.
- D. Lawrence gave a brief presentation on the Employment goal. The goal states: "Downtown will be Rock Hill's largest and most diverse concentration of jobs and businesses". The goal is primarily met through the attraction and retention of office uses and jobs. A list of sixteen office tenants that have been attracted to downtown since 2004 was shared. D. Lawrence shared market data pulled from the Downtown Parking Management System. The data shows that there is approximately 300,000 sq. ft. of office space in downtown with a 15%-20% vacancy. A 2004 Office Space Study completed by the City's Planning Department showed 316,500 sq. ft. of office space in "area 2" (includes downtown) with 23% available. A number of sites available for new development were identified and discussed, including the TownCenter Sites, the Good Motor Company property, and the former Woolworths property. Several advantages of locating an office in downtown were discussed, including: availability of incentives, networking opportunities, opportunity to have Main Street address, ability to access a diverse workforce, available development sites, shared public parking resources, lower occupancy costs versus some other locations, a unique setting and amenities, easily accessible, a developed market. Several impediments related to the development of office uses in downtown were discussed, including: cost - sometimes it is more expensive to build in downtown, it is more difficult (codes, density, parking, etc.) in some aspects to build in downtown, financing is difficult to secure in the current economic environment, lack of tenant and developer awareness of downtown's advantages and opportunities. In a broader, more long-term sense, we are not sure of our targets - what businesses, what size, etc. to direct our marketing at. We acknowledge that we are not marketing our assets and opportunities well enough - we need to communicate our advantages better and more often.

Next time this topic is discussed, D. Lawrence will review a strategy to attract office uses. This strategy has been designed in conjunction with City Management and with the support of the Mayor. A few key points regarding this office recruitment strategy are: involves key business leaders in the community, has a market research component, involves the creation of marketing materials/messages, improves the marketing of available real estate.

Discussion took place with J. Broadwater noting the growing presence of creative service businesses in downtown. He referred to Insignia Design, his business, Barry Grant, Springs Creative, and others. The

unique setting in downtown is a draw, as is its affordability. Incentives were noted as a good approach to attracting businesses. Barbara Augello discussed a partnership between Winthrop University and Piedmont Medical Center. She suggested that MSOTA and Winthrop work together and that Winthrop should be assisted and encouraged to have a presence in downtown. J. Broadwater indicated that a temporary gallery will likely operate in the vacant portion of his building on Caldwell Street soon. Jim Paolone indicated that downtown is cheaper than several other business locations around Rock Hill. Three targets were identified during the discussion: creative services, financial services, and legal services. D. Lawrence was asked to add the City Club membership incentives offered by RHEDC to the list of advantages found in downtown. J. Broadwater reported that John Barnes and Comporium Communications have donated a key marketing staff person and financial support to a new marketing effort to build the City Club's membership.

New Business – Jami Wilson presented the financial report. She noted the small number of expenses shown related to either the Super Bowl event held in February or the St. Patrick's Day event. The checking account balances at the beginning and end of February were \$6,099 and \$4,742, respectively. Unanimous motion to approve the financial report.

- J. Broadwater asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the February Board Meeting. Motion made by John Rinehart, second by Harriet Goode. All in favor, motion carried.
- J. Wilson gave a brief presentation describing the process and progress made on the Old Town Marketing Implementation Plan. History was reviewed regarding the 1.5-mile radius of Old Town and the Old Town Master Planning effort. Lyerly Agency was hired in 2007 to perform market research tasks to create a Strategic Marketing Plan. Lyerly identified the need to "Connect the Dots" regarding the numerous successes and efforts going on to improve Old Town. J. Wilson explained that the RHEDC Marketing Committee has created the Old Town Marketing Implementation Plan, which was approved by the RHEDC Board in March. A full presentation of the Plan will likely occur at the April Board Meeting.

The Board was asked to assist in the clean up of a great deal of confusion between the various brands that have been used. Tamara LaValla of Lavalla Maddox presented information regarding the use of the Main Streets of Old Town logo and nomenclature and the Old Town logo and nomenclature. T. LaValla indicated that amongst her tasks is a streamlining of the logos and nomenclature in use, plus the restructuring of a brand identity. She spoke about the confusion that exists between the use of the terms Old Town and Main Streets of Old Town. She pointed out that staff has four choices at present when sending out a letter; they can choose between City letterhead, RHEDC letterhead, MSOTA letterhead, or Old Town letterhead depending on the topic. T. LaValla indicated that no organizational chart showing the relationship between the various organizations existed when she asked

Old Town is downtown. With a 1.5-mile radius, Old Town is too large to market, so we will focus our efforts on downtown where the most important assets (at this time) exist. A proposed organizational chart was presented. At the top is the City of Rock Hill. RHEDC is below the City of Rock Hill. Below RHEDC is Old Town in the form of three organizations – RHEDC Marketing Committee, Old Town Association (formerly MSOTA), and a downtown merchants association. The merchants association is an organization that can be created in the future to address specific downtown concerns while the Old Town Association can give attention to more long-term development.

A request was made to change the name of the Main Streets of Old Town Association. The organization's focus, by-laws (except for the organization's name), mission, and projects would stay the same. The request was made solely to clean-up the confusion between all the names and logos in use. H. Goode asked if "core" or "nucleus" could be used to identify that the focus of the organization's work remains on downtown. J. Rinehart commented that we need to incorporate Old Town with Downtown. Brendan Kuhlkin suggested that we just use "downtown"; asking, "why fight uphill?" versus long-standing terminology. T. LaValla explained that the core of Rock Hill has been established as Old Town. She noted that we need to include many things in the marketing, such as downtown, Winthrop University, the Textile Corridor, and other prominent places. J. Rinehart stated that we need to reprogram people to say/think "Downtown in Old Town". B. Augello referred to Uptown Charlotte; she asked how long the stakeholders in

Charlotte worked at branding "Uptown". She suggested bringing folks from Charlotte here; T. LaValla noted that the Lyerly Agency is based in Charlotte. B Brindel stated that we are not sure what we are marketing. He recommended that we decide what we are marketing and then unify our messages and methods.

T. LaValla recommended that we work at bringing everything back to "Old Town" and that we work to make people understand what and where Old Town is. Tracy Reynolds explained her thoughts on this discussion. She explained that MSOTA's name is causing confusion and that this organization can help significantly to make things simpler and reduce the confusion. She explained that the organization would continue to operate in the same fashion as today. There was wide support for Tracey's thoughts. Motion made by B. Brindel, second by T. Reynolds to change the organization's name from Main Streets of Old Town Association to Old Town Association. On the question, there was discussion about making the change legal with the IRS and Secretary of State. D. Lawrence will make the appropriate DBA changes. All in favor, motion carried.

John Misskelley showed a sample marker that will be installed at twelve locations throughout the East Town Neighborhood. The markers are a source of pride and identification.

Unanimous motion to adjourn.
