


Development

VML will deliver an online social networking site to be used by registered physicians of BTTC. The site will contain six universal site pages and three to five sub pages per clinical trial. The site will have administrative log in and user log in functionalities. Due to the aggressive launch date, VML will utilize a streamlined, rapid build approach for this project and will launch in two phases based on previously documented priorities. Phase One's main objective will be to facilitate doctor engagement to the community resources and trials. Phase Two will focus on physician collaboration via discussion boards and customized blogs.

Tissue Tracking Discovery

In addition to the above, VML will research the appropriate tissue tracking software to incorporate within the BTTC site post-launch. The exact process and timing will be documented once proper research is conducted and approved by the client. All discovery will be allocated to this scope of work – this does not include the purchasing or implementation of the tissue software. Discovery deliverables include a process flow chart and POV.

Deployment

VML will be responsible for all quality assurance measurements including user acceptance testing and system administration. Hosting will need to be determined and estimated based on client privacy requirements.



Dialogue

There will be annual hosting and optimization features included with this project, no other post launch reporting will be utilized. In addition, this estimate includes Ektron licenses - 15 total.


