	Inpatient Services It is the Mission of The Valley Hospital to serve the community by healing and caring for patients, comforting their families and teaching good health. Valley has three buildings on its main campus. The Valley Hospital serves more than 440,000 people in 32 towns in Bergen County and adjoining communities. It is the second busiest hospital in New Jersey based on admissions and a regional provider of complex medical and surgical care. In 2009, more than 51,000 patients were admitted to Valley. Our core inpatient services include comprehensive programs in -Cardiology, including the Valley Columbia Heart Center, our cardiac surgery program -A Cardiac Surgery Intensive Care Unit-A Critical Care Unit -A Cardiac Catheterization Laboratory -An inpatient Oncology unit -A Stroke Center-A Center for Neuroscience-Medical and Surgical Floors-A Geriatric Services Unit-The Institute for Robotic and Minimally Invasive Surgery -The Total Joint Replacement Center -The Center for Obesity Surgery -The Center for Childbirth, which welcomes more than 3,000 newborns each year, and a Neonatal Intensive Care Unit -A Pediatric Intensive Care Unit Valley has been recognized for seven consecutive years for providing an outstanding inpatient experience by J. D. Power and Associates. The Hospital's Patient Relations staff and volunteers made 14,809 patient-related visits and responded to 8,774 calls, and Pastoral Care staff responded to 11,667 inquiries and made 100,259 patient and family contacts.

	Outpatient Services Through satellite facilities located throughout its service area, The Valley Hospital provides the communities it serves with a comprehensive array of outpatient services. Those services include -A full service laboratory-A Diagnostic Imaging Center-A Center for Fertility -A Maternal Fetal Medicine Program-A Pain management Center -A Center for Beast Health-A Prostate Cancer Center-A Center for Complementary Therapies-A Lung Cancer Center-A Center for Rehabilitation Medicine-A Center for Child development-A Renal Care Center-A Same Day Surgery Center -A Center for Sleep Disorders -A Spine Center-The Center for Women's Heart Health In addition, in 2009, the Hospital provided more than \$59 million in uncompensated care, attributable to chanty care, bad debt and Medicare and Medicaid shortfalls Patients receiving uncompensated care in 2009 include patients who were treated at Valley's Community Care clinic In 2009, the clinic recorded 8,314 visits. Valley's Community Care clinic offers services in many specialties including obstetrics, medicine, cardiology, and surgery Also in 2009, homebound community members received more than 93,000 "at cost" meals. Valley's Department of Community Health offers free heart health education programs attended by more than 8,200 people. Programs included A Woman's Heart, Hypnosis for Weight Loss, Hypertension, A Healthy Heart, Nutrition, Healthful Eating, and many health fairs. Health screenings for blood pressure, stroke and cholesterol were also offered. The Community Training Center offers Basic Life Support, Advanced Cardiac Life Support and Pediatric Advanced Life Support programs, see well as first aid training. Comprehensive parent education programs are offered to expectant Families. Classes, attended by more than 7,000 people, include. Childbirth Preparation, Newborn Care, Parenting, Grandparents', Moms & Babies Social Hour, Dads Class, Sibling Attending Birth, Infant and Child Safety, Infant Massage, Birastifeeding, Baby Sitters, Sibling, Pre/Postnata

	Emergency Services The Valley Hospital offers the communities it serves a full service Emergency Department providing emergency services and minor treatment services. All physicians on the active staff are board certified in emergency medicine, and many nurses are certified in emergency nursing. Services include a minor treatment area and a pediatric emergency room that features a child-friendly layout and design. The Department also has a dedicated Computed Tomography Scanner Valley's Emergency Department also features the services of several mobile intensive care units, which answer thousands of calls each year. Mobile intensive care units, staffed by qualified Valley paramedics, are specially equipped vehicles that bring the highly sophisticated techniques of intravenous therapy, airway management, cardiac monitoring and defibrillation directly to people in need of emergency care Valley also offers Lifeline, a communication device that links a homebound individual with emergency care or personal support with the push of a button, 24 hours a day, 365 days a year. In 2009, The Valley Hospital recorded 72,085 Emergency Department visits and 8,301 Mobile Intensive Care Unit dispatches.
