MAINE WOMEN'S POLICY CENTER BY-LAWS

ARTICLE I

General

Section 1.1 Name

The name of the Corporation shall be Maine Women's Policy Center. For purposes of these bylaws, the organization shall be referred to as "Maine Women's Policy Center" or the "Corporation."

Section 1.2 Location of the Corporation

The Corporation shall maintain an office located in the state of Maine.

ARTICLE II

Purposes, Powers and Limitations

Section 2.1 Purpose

The purpose of the Maine Women's Policy Center is to increase social, economic, and political opportunities for Maine women and girls through public policy and leadership development.

Section 2.2 Organization

The Corporation is organized under 13-B MRSA § 101 et seq. (Maine Nonprofit Corporation Act) and is tax exempt pursuant to IRC § 501(c)(3).

Section 2.3 Activities

The activities of the Corporation shall include, but not be limited to:

- A. Research and development of policy options in the areas of health, safety, education, and economic justice;
- B. Provision of educational forums on the legislative process and the importance of voting;
- C. Sponsorship of interns in public policy programs;
- D. Provision of technical assistance in public policy areas on project development, implementation and/or evaluation; and,
- E. All other necessary and proper activities designed to carry out its mission, provided, however, that no activities be undertaken that would jeopardize the organization's corporate status or tax exempt status.

MAINE WOMEN'S POLICY CENTER BY-LAWS ADOPTED JUNE 24, 2009 Page 2 of 9

Section 2.4 Non-Discrimination

In furtherance of the above purposes, the Corporation shall be an equal opportunity and affirmative action employer and, further, it shall not discriminate against employees, officers, board members, committee members, volunteers, or organizational members on the basis of race, color, national origin, creed, religion, age, citizenship, sex, sexual orientation, gender identification, familial or marital status, family responsibilities, physical or mental disability, veteran status, or any other characteristic protected under federal, state or local law:

- A. In the persons served, or in the manner of services;
- B. In its personnel policies; or
- C. In membership of its Board of Directors.

Section 2.5 Corporate Powers

In furtherance of its objectives, the Corporation is empowered to have the general powers accorded Corporations under 13-B MRSA § 201, and to do all other things necessary and convenient to carry out the lawful purposes of the Corporation, except as limited under § 2.6 of these by-laws.

Section 2.6 Limitations

The Corporation shall neither have nor exercise any power, nor shall it engage directly or indirectly in any activity that would invalidate its status (1) as a Corporation, or (2) as a Corporation to which contributions are deductible under IRC § 170 (c)(2) or the corresponding provisions of any subsequent law.

Section 2.7 Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall begin on January 1 and end on December 31.

ARTICLE III

Board of Directors

Section 3.1 Composition

The Board of the Corporation may consist of no more than twelve (12) and no fewer than nine (9) Board Members. This shall include the Officers of the Executive Board (as defined by Article V below). The Board may appoint an Executive Director and may delegate to her or him authority necessary to carry out the necessary and proper business of the Corporation.

Section 3.2 Duties

The Board of Directors shall manage the affairs and control the funds and property of the Corporation in order to execute the policies and purposes of the organization.

Section 3.3 Term of Service

Board Members shall be elected each year for a three-year term at the annual meeting of the Corporation in numbers sufficient to replace Board Members completing two consecutive terms and to fill any unexpired vacancies. The term of service for a Board Member shall be three (3) years. Membership on the Board shall be limited to two consecutive full terms (six (6) years).

Board Members leaving the Board at the end of two terms may be considered for re-election to the Board provided that the new term begins no less than two (2) years after the end of the previous terms. No one Board Member may serve more than a total of twelve (12) years or four (4) terms.

Section 3.4 Limitation of Eligibility

Any person who is an employee of the Corporation shall not be eligible to serve as a Board Member during the term of his/her employment.

Section 3.5 Participation

If a Board Member is unable to attend a Board meeting, she/he shall notify the Chair or the Executive Director. Any Board Member who is absent for two (2) successive meetings without prior notification to the Chair or Executive Director, or who is absent for more than one-half of the regularly scheduled meetings during the year, without prior approval of the Board, will be deemed to have vacated her/his position.

Section 3.6 Committees

The work of the Board shall be carried out by the several committees described in this section, and by *ad hoc* committees, which may be created and appointed from time to time by the Chair. Maine Women's Policy Center organizational members, who are not Board Members, may participate in committee meetings, but are not authorized to vote.

Committee meetings may be conducted by telephone or any other electronic mode of communication as long as all participants are able to understand each other and fully participate in the meeting. With the exception of the Executive Committee as provided below, any policies and procedures developed by committees shall be subject to approval by a majority vote of the full Board of Directors.

- A. <u>Governance Committee</u>: The Chair shall appoint a Board Member as the Chair of a Nominating Committee. This committee shall prepare a slate of nominees for Board membership to be presented at the annual meeting.
- B. <u>Finance Committee</u>: The Treasurer shall also serve as the chair of the Finance Committee. This committee shall prepare and present the budget to the Board for its adoption and take the lead in planning and developing fundraising events.

Section 3.7 Vacancies

Any vacancy occurring on the Board of Directors may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of all remaining Board Members, except that a vacancy in the post of Chair, Vice-Chair, Secretary, or Treasurer will be filled in consultation with the Board of Directors of the Maine Women's Lobby. Board Members elected to fill an unplanned Board vacancy shall complete the unexpired portion, if any, of the vacated term.

Section 3.8 Removal of Board Members

Any Board Member may be removed from the Board of Directors, with or without cause, by an affirmative vote of three-fourths of all Board Members at any meeting. Any Board Member who has been proposed for removal shall receive written notice of the proposed action from the Executive Director. The notice shall be dated not less than seven (7) days prior to the meeting. "Written notice" may be made by either mailing a written notice to the Board Member's last known address or by sending an email to the Board Member's last known email address, or both.

Section 3.9 Voting

Only elected Board Members and Officers, and not members of the public, shall have voting rights to conduct business as permitted or required under these by-laws, elections of new and incoming Board Members or Officers, or any other activity that requires voting as permitted under these by-laws. In conducting any business permitted under these by-laws, elections of officers, or any other activity permitted under these by-laws, the Corporation is authorized to use any combination of paper, electronic and/or in-person voting, as reasonable and appropriate.

ARTICLE IV

Meetings

Section 4.1 Annual Meeting

The annual meeting shall be held on the first Wednesday of September annually, at such time and place as shall be designated by the Board Members. At the annual meeting, the Board shall elect new and renewing Board Members and Officers, as well as conduct the transaction of such other business as may come before it.

Section 4.2 Regular and Special Meetings

<u>Section 4.2.A Regular Meetings</u>: In addition to the annual meeting as described above, the Board of Directors shall meet on a regular schedule, commencing on the first Wednesday of September, and meeting on the first Wednesday of every other month annually.

Section 4.2.B Special Meetings: A special meeting(s) may be called by the Chair or by petition of any three (3) Board Members, with at least seven (7) days' written notice to all remaining Board Members. The notice to Board Members shall be dated not less than seven (7) days prior to the meeting. "Written notice" may be made by either mailing a written notice to the Board Members' last known address or by sending an email to the Board Members' last known email address, or both.

In exigent circumstances, as the Chair deems necessary, a special meeting may be called provided all Board Members receive notice. In such circumstances "notice" may be made by either sending an email to the Board Members' last known email address or by placing a telephone call to the Board Members' last known telephone number.

Section 4.3 Quorum

A quorum shall be defined by not less than majority of the total number of Board Members currently serving. A quorum is required for the transaction of business and the act of a majority of the Board Members present at any duly called meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of Board Members, except as these by-laws may otherwise provide.

A quorum shall be met whether Board Members participate in person or via telephonic conference.

Section 4.4 Action by Proxies

At any meeting of the Board, a Board Member entitled to vote may do so by proxy executed in writing for that meeting. Only a Board Member may serve as a proxy. Proxies may confer general voting rights, or they may be limited to prescribed action on a particular issue, however, proxy voting may not be used to create a quorum. A Board Member may act as proxy for not more than two (2) absent Board Members.

ARTICLE V

Officers

Section 5.1 Composition

The Officers of the Corporation shall be Chair, Vice-Chair, Treasurer and Secretary, to be elected at the annual meeting from a slate presented by the Governance Committee, following the election of new Board Members.

Board Members elected to serve on the Executive Committee shall be selected without regard to the Board from which they rose. Once elected, Officers shall become Board Members of both the Maine Women's Policy Center and the Maine Women's Lobby. In their capacity as Board Members, Offers shall have equal fiduciary obligations and duties to both Boards.

Section 5.2 Duties

Section 5.2.A Chair

The Chair shall preside at all meetings of the Board, and may appoint the Chair(s) of the Governance Committee, Finance Committee, and any other standing or *ad hoc* committees from among the Board membership. The Chair may sign contracts, checks, or other documents which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, except when these by-laws require the signature of some other Officer or agent of the Corporation.

The Chair of the Maine Women's Policy Center shall also serve as the Chair of the Corporation's sister organization, the Maine Women's Lobby.

Section 5. 2.B Vice-Chair

The Vice-Chair shall, in the absence or disability of the Chair, perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair and shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as the Board of Directors may from time to time prescribe. The Vice-Chair of the Maine Women's Policy Center shall serve only as the Vice-Chair of the Maine Women's Policy Center.

Section 5. 2.C Secretary

The Secretary shall keep a record of all proceedings of the Board and, in her/his absence a temporary Secretary shall be appointed and shall record proceedings of such meetings. The Secretary shall ensure that notice is given of the time and place of all meetings of the Board and perform such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors or by the Chair. The Secretary may certify all votes, resolutions and actions of the Board.

The Secretary of the Maine Women's Policy Center shall also serve as the Secretary of the Corporation's sister organization, the Maine Women's Lobby.

Section 5. 2.D Treasurer

The Treasurer shall have the care and custody of all funds and securities of the Corporation; shall be responsible for seeing that an accurate account is kept of all monies received and expended; shall arrange for an annual review of accounts of the Corporation and submit an annual report of the preceding year at the annual meeting; shall submit regular financial reports to the Board. The Treasurer of the Maine Women's Policy Center shall also serve as the Treasurer of the Corporation's sister organization, the Maine Women's Lobby.

Section 5.3 Limitation of Eligibility

To be eligible for service as Vice-Chair, Treasurer, or Secretary, an individual must be a Board Member who has served for a minimum of one (1) year. Any person who is an employee of the Corporation shall not be eligible to serve as a Board Member during the term of his/her employment.

To be eligible for service as Chair an individual must be a Board Member who has served for a minimum of one (1) year and served a minimum of one (1) year on the Executive Board in the position of Vice-Chair, Treasurer, or Secretary.

Section 5.4 Term of Service

Each Officer shall be elected at the annual meeting for a term of one (1) year. At the discretion of the Board, an Officer may serve for more than one consecutive term in the same office, but in no case may any one (1) individual serve more than two (2) consecutive terms in the same office.

Section 5.5 Vacancies

A vacancy in the post of Chair, Vice-Chair or Treasurer will be filled in consultation with the Board of Directors of the Maine Women's Lobby. Board Members elected to fill an unplanned Board vacancy shall complete the unexpired portion, if any, of the vacated term.

Section 5.6 Removal of Officers

An Officer may be removed from the Executive Board, with or without cause, by an affirmative vote of three-fourths of all Board Members at any meeting. Any Officer who has been proposed for removal shall receive written notice of the proposed action from the Executive Director. The notice shall be dated not less than seven (7) days prior to the meeting. "Written notice" may be made by either mailing a written notice to the Officer's last known address or by sending an email to the Officer's last known email address, or both.

ARTICLE VI

Limitation of Liability and Indemnification

The Corporation shall, to the full extent of its power to do so provided by law, including without limitation 13-B MRSA § 714 indemnify any and all present and former members, Board Members, Officers, employees, committee members and agents of the Corporation against expenses, including attorney's fees, judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by them in connection with any action, suite or proceeding in which they, or any of them, are made parties, or a party, by reason of their being or having been members, Officers, Board Members, employees, committee members, or agents of the Corporation; except in relation to matters as to which any such person shall be finally adjudicated in any such action, suit or proceeding not to have acted in good faith in the reasonable belief that his or her action was in the best interest of the Corporation, or, with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, where such person is finally adjudged to have had reasonable cause to believe that his or her conduct was unlawful.

Such indemnification shall be made in accordance with the procedures set forth at 13-B MRSA § 714, as the same may be amended from time to time. Such indemnification shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which those indemnified may be entitled under any other by-law, agreement, or otherwise.

ARTICLE VII

Prohibition Against Private Gain

No Officer, Board Member, committee member, volunteer, or organizational member shall receive any pay, compensation, or benefit from the Corporation directly or indirectly, for performing such duties. This by-law shall not prohibit the reimbursement of incidental expenses necessarily incurred in the business of the Corporation by any Officer, Board Member, committee member, volunteer, or organizational member duly authorized, and also shall not prohibit the employment of persons to perform duties for the Corporation and receive compensation thereof, upon proper authorization of the Board.

ARTICLE VIII

Dissolution

In the event of the dissolution of the Corporation, none of its assets shall inure to the benefit of any Officer or Board Member and all assets remaining after satisfaction of claims shall be disposed of by distribution to an organization or organizations having purpose compatible with and similar to those of the Maine Women's Policy Center and which then qualifies for tax exempt status in accordance with the provisions of Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE IX

Amendments

The Maine Women's Policy Center Board may amend these by-laws by an affirmative vote of a majority of Board Members present at any regular meeting at which there is a quorum present. No vote shall be taken unless the Board Members receive written notice of the proposed changes prior to the meeting at which the vote shall be taken. The notice shall be dated not less than seven (7) days prior to the meeting. "Written notice" may be made by either mailing a written notice to the Board Members' last known address or by sending an email to the Board Members' last known email address, or both.
