Guidelines for Grants

- 1.) Grants will be made once a year, in December. All grant applications must be submitted no later than November 15. No multi-year grants will be given.
- 2.) No grants will be made to individuals; all grantees must be tax-exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and qualify as "not a private foundation" under Section 509(a) of the Code. If an organization has not previously received a grant from the Standish Foundation, a copy of the organization's Section 501(c)(3) exemption letter must be submitted with the application.
- 3.) There is no specific application form to complete. Proposals should be in letter form, generally no more than three pages in length.
- 4.) Grants will be made primarily to organizations in the Westfield, New Jersey area that provide a community service to the citizens of Westfield and their immediate neighbors. Grants may be for operating, capital or endowment purposes and will generally not exceed \$3,000.
