Notes to Financial Statements December 31, 2009 and 2008

(1) Description of Organization

Phillies Charities, Inc. (the Organization) is a charitable organization whose purpose is to raise money for and distribute funds to organizations described as exempt under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The Organization raises funds primarily by conducting an annual autograph party and auction (the Phillies Phestival), selling corporate sponsorships and advertisement space in the autograph party and auction program book, operating booths at Citizens Bank Park, the major league playing facility of The Phillies (see below), and from various donations.

The Organization is closely associated with The Phillies, a Pennsylvania limited partnership that holds the Major League Baseball franchise in Philadelphia. The Phillies provide various facilities, supplies, and services, the expenses of which are charged to the Organization and have been included in fund-raising expenses in the accompanying statements of activities. All officers of the Organization are either employees of The Phillies or are related to employees of The Phillies.

(2) Summary of Significant Accounting Policies

(a) Basis of Accounting

The accompanying financial statements have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting.

(b) Net Assets

The Organization's net assets are not restricted by donor-imposed restrictions and thus are considered unrestricted net assets.

(c) Deferred Revenue

Deferred revenue represents amounts that were received in advance for advertising in the subsequent years' autograph party and auction program book.

(d) Revenue and Other Support Recognition

Revenue is recognized when cash is received for events held. Unconditional promises to give (pledges) are recorded when the pledge is received. Conditional promises to give are not recognized until they become unconditional, that is, when the conditions on which they depend are substantially met. There are no pledges outstanding at the end of either December 31, 2009 or 2008.

(e) Donations to the Philadelphia Foundation

The Phillies are required, under the terms and conditions of the 30-year sublease and development agreement for Citizens Bank Park, to remit \$1,000,000 per year, beginning in 2004, to the Philadelphia Foundation, a 501(c)(3) organization for children. The Phillies make this donation to the Organization, and the Organization makes the donation directly to the Philadelphia Foundation.

This donation from The Phillies is restricted to its use; however, as the amount flows through the Organization within the same year, there are no restricted net assets on the December 31, 2009 or 2008 statements of financial position. In accordance with the Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification (ASC) Topic 958, Not-for-Profit Entities, the Organization is acting as an agent for The Phillies with regard to the donation to the Philadelphia Foundation. As such, the Organization does not qualify as a donee, and therefore, no donation revenue is recognized on the statement of activities.

(f) Program Expenses

Distributions to the Philadelphia Chapter of the Amyotrophic Lateral Sclerosis Association (ALS) and other charities are recorded when paid unless there is an unconditional promise to give.

(g) Donations Payable

Donations payable represents amounts for which the Organization has an unconditional promise to give. As of December 31, 2009, the Organization has donations payable in the amount of \$30,000 which is payable in equal installments of \$10,000 per year over the next three years. There were no unconditional promises to give as of December 31, 2008.

(h) Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and other support and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

(i) Recently Issued Accounting Standards

In May 2009, the FASB issued an accounting pronouncement regarding subsequent events. The pronouncement sets forth the period after the balance sheet date during which management of a reporting entity should evaluate events or transactions that may occur for potential recognition or disclosure in the financial statements, the circumstances under which an entity should recognize events or transactions occurring after the balance sheet date in its financial statements, and disclosures that an entity should make about events or transactions that occurred after the balance sheet date. The pronouncement requires the disclosure of the date through which an entity has evaluated subsequent events and the basis for that date. This disclosure should alert all users of financials statements that an entity has not evaluated subsequent events after that date in the set of financial statements being presented. The pronouncement is effective for financial periods ending after June 15, 2009. The Organization has evaluated subsequent events from the balance sheet date through November 4, 2010, the date at which the financial statements were available to be issued, and determined there are no items to disclose.

In June 2009, the FASB issued an accounting pronouncement to establish the FASB ASC as the source of authoritative accounting principles recognized by the FASB to be applied by nongovernmental entities in the preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. The pronouncement is effective for annual periods ending after

September 15, 2009. The adoption of the pronouncement did not have any impact on the Organization's financial statements except to change the way specific accounting standards are referenced.

As of January 1, 2009, the Organization adopted the provisions for uncertain tax positions in accordance with FASB ASC Topic 740, *Income Taxes*, which requires that a tax position be recognized or derecognized based on a "more-likely-than-not" threshold for positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return. The impact of adoption did not have an impact on the Organization's financial statements.

(3) Federal Income Taxes

The Organization has received a letter of favorable determination for tax qualification from the Internal Revenue Service. Accordingly, the Organization is a qualified organization under Section 509(a)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code and is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Organization does not believe there are any unrecognized tax positions that should be recorded as of December 31, 2009.
