




NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

ORGANIZATION

The Monroe County Bar Association (the "Association") a nonprofit entity is organized to promote the Code of Professional Responsibility within its membership and the legal profession. Membership is granted to practitioners in Monroe County, Pennsylvania.

The Association consists of two divisions, the Monroe Legal Reporter and the Treasurer's Account. The primary sources of revenues are legal notice fees and subscriptions and membership dues respectively for the divisions. Each division maintains separate records to account for revenues and expenses.

BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The financial statements of the Association have been prepared on the accrual basis of accounting and accordingly reflect all significant receivables, payables, and other liabilities.

BASIS OF PRESENTATION

Financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) No 117, Financial Statements of Not-For-Profit Organizations. Under SFAS No 117, the Association is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. The Association has only unrestricted net assets as of December 31, 2009. However, during 2007, the Board of Directors created a Building Repair Account which the board designated for expenditures related solely to capital repairs to the building.

CASH AND CASH EQUIVALENTS

Cash and cash equivalents include all monies in banks and highly liquid investments purchased with an initial maturity of three months or less. On December 31, 2009 fair value approximates carrying amounts.

INVESTMENTS

Investments are reported in accordance with SFAS No 124, Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations. Investments purchased by the Organization are initially recorded at cost, and donated investments are recorded at fair value on the date they are received as a donation. Subsequent to their acquisition, investments in marketable securities with readily determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are adjusted to their fair values as of the date of the statement of financial position. Unrealized gains and losses are included in the change in net assets investment income and gains restricted by a donor are reported as increases in unrestricted net assets if the restrictions are met (either by passage of time or by use) in the same reporting period in which the income and/or gains are recognized. For year ended December 31, 2009, The Association has not donated investments.

DEPRECIATION

Property and equipment are stated at cost and depreciation is provided on the double-declining balance and straight-line methods over the assets' estimated useful life.

EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENTS

The Association sponsors various social and educational events and continuing legal education seminars to promote the legal profession from within the profession as well as to the public. The Association receives reimbursement from attendees to defray the cost of the events. These reimbursements are recorded as an offset to the expense in the financial statements and not recognized as revenue.

NOTE 1 ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

INCOME TAXES

The Association is exempt from income taxes under Internal Revenue Code section 501 (c)(6). However, the Association is taxed on its net unrelated business income, such as advertising income. The unrelated business income tax amounted to \$0 for 2009.

ESTIMATES

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 PROPERTY AND EQUIPMENT

Building, equipment and fixtures are stated at cost. Depreciation is computed using accelerated and straight-line methods over the estimated useful lives of the asset and amounted to \$ 19,461 in 2009. The estimated useful lives of depreciable assets are

Expenditures for major renewals and betterments that materially extend the useful lives of property are capitalized. Expenditures for maintenance and repair are charged to expense as incurred.

NOTE 3 LEASES IN THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS OF LESSORS

In 2004, the Association entered into an informal agreement with the Pennsylvania Unemployment Hearing Board to rent one of the conference rooms at the Bar Center on a weekly basis. The agreement remained in place for 2009 but was amended to allow for a rent increase to \$ 100 per half day and \$ 150 per full day. In 2007, The Association entered into a lease agreement to lease conference room space to the Workers Compensation Office of Adjudication (WC) on a month-to-month basis. The WC office leases space for 8 to 9 full days per month at \$150 per day or \$ 100 per half day.

NOTE 4 RELATED PARTY

The Monroe County Bar Foundation is an IRC 501c(3) not-for-profit corporation whose mission it is to support and enrich the lives of children in Monroe County. The Foundation and the Association are neither under common control nor are there material transactions that occurred between the entities during 2009 that would require the organizations to consolidate their financial statements. The Monroe County Bar Association collects voluntary contributions from its members on behalf of the Foundation that totaled \$ 3,075 for 2009.
