The H & R Block Foundation Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors February 18, 2009

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of The H & R Block Foundation was held on February 18, 2009, at One H&R Block Way, Kansas City, Missouri 64105 pursuant to notice, and in accordance with the Bylaws of the Foundation.

The following members of the Board of Directors were present, to wit:

Henry W. Bloch
William A. Hall
Morton I. Sosland (via telephone)

The following Foundation associates were also in attendance: David P. Miles, President; Carey Wilkerson Looney, Vice President and Secretary; and Hillary Beuschel, Program Administrator. Henry W. Bloch acted as Chairman of the meeting. Carey Wilkerson Looney acted as Secretary of the meeting.

First, the Chairman requested approval of the minutes of the annual meeting of the Board of Directors held on December 10, 2008, noting that copies of such minutes had been mailed to all directors prior to the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Salizzoni and seconded by Mr. Hall, the minutes were unanimously approved.

The Chairman then referred to the financial statements that had been distributed prior to the meeting. The balance sheet showed that as of December 31, 2008, the assets of the Foundation totaled \$44,260,192. The Chairman ordered that the financial statements be filed with the records of the Foundation.

Eric Thornton, of Cambridge Associates, then reviewed the following items: investment portfolio performance, market outlook, and recommended changes to the investment portfolio. In 2008, the Foundation's portfolio returned -32.5 percent, underperforming the policy benchmark for the period by 440 basis points. Since the policy's 2004 inception, the portfolio has returned an average of -0.5 percent annually, an average 80 basis points behind the policy benchmark. Following the discussion, the following outcomes were approved:

- Diversify the 10% allocation to real estate to include REITs, commodities, and natural resource equities
- Move toward the new allocation targets over time, with the objective that the portfolio be invested in line with the new targets by the end of 2009
- Foundation should hold sufficient cash for operations outside of the long-term investment portfolio

Cambridge Associates will recommend a portfolio transition plan and new commodities and natural resource equity managers at the next Board meeting. At the conclusion of the discussion, Mr. Thornton left the meeting.

Mr. Miles reviewed the Foundation's 2008 successes, which included: developing a Statement of Intent, adding William A. Hall to the Board of Directors, receiving a \$2 million gift from H&R Block, and the distribution of \$1.94 million to charitable organizations. It was noted that \$639,000 in grant distributions were carried forward

and added to 2009 budget. A summary of 2008 grant distributions in the areas of associate programs, Foundation programs, and community programs was provided.

Next, Mr. Miles presented the 2009 funding priorities, business plan, budget, and grant funding strategies. The Foundation's business plan included the core areas of organizational effectiveness, financial responsibility, and community investment. The recommended budget was \$3,719,000, which includes \$639,000 carried forward from 2008. Mr. Miles then presented the recommended standing grants and an overview of staff leadership in community projects. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Hall and seconded by Mr. Sosland, the 2009 planning documents and budget were approved.

In response to the economic downturn, the following essential services grant recommendations were approved:

Harvesters – a grant for \$25,000, to purchase food and other items necessary to address emergency assistance needs

Mid America Assistance Coalition – a grant for \$25,000, to provide emergency assistance

United Way of Greater Kansas City/Collaborative Funder's Pool – a grant for \$25,000, to provide program support grants for agencies addressing emergency assistance or other critical human needs such as: food; utility assistance; housing; transportation; medical needs through the safety-net clinics; and programs that link persons in financial need to stability and independence

It was noted that Mr. Sosland is involved with Harvesters and that he abstained from voting.

Due to Mark Ernst's new position as Deputy Commissioner of the Internal Revenue Service, he must resign from his various Board memberships. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Sosland and seconded by Mr. Salizzoni, Mr. Ernst's resignation from the Board of Directors was accepted.

After acceptance of Mr. Ernst's resignation, Mr. Miles, Ms. Wilkerson Looney, and Ms. Beuschel left the meeting and the Board of Directors went into executive session to discuss the addition of a new member to the Foundation's Board of Directors.

There being no further business to come before the Board, upon motion duly made by Mr. Sosland and seconded by Mr. Hall, the meeting was adjourned.

The H & R Block Foundation Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors April 21, 2009

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of The H & R Block Foundation was held on April 21, 2009, at One H&R Block Way, Kansas City, Missouri, 64105 pursuant to notice, and in accordance with the Bylaws of the Foundation.

The following members of the Board of Directors were present, to wit:

Henry W. Bloch William A. Hall Edward T. Matheny, Jr. Frank L. Salizzoni Morton I. Sosland Russell P. Smyth

Also in attendance were David P. Miles, President of The H & R Block Foundation, and Carey Wilkerson Looney, Vice President & Secretary of The H & R Block Foundation. Henry W. Bloch acted as Chairman of the meeting. Carey Wilkerson Looney acted as Secretary of the meeting.

The Chairman welcomed Russell P. Smyth, President and CEO of H&R Block, to the Foundation's Board of Directors. Mr. Smyth's nomination to the Foundation's Board of Directors was approved at the February 18, 2009 meeting. Mr. Smyth accepted the nomination and will serve until the next Annual Meeting.

The Chairman then requested approval of the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held on February 18, 2009, noting that copies of such minutes had been distributed to all directors prior to the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Sosland and seconded by Mr. Salizzoni, the minutes were unanimously approved.

Next, the Chairman referred to the financial statements that had been distributed prior to the meeting. The balance sheet showed that as of February 28, 2009, the assets of the Foundation were \$39,468,930. It was noted that the significant increase in year-to-date contributions was due to \$639,000 in 2008 grant payments that were carried forward to 2009. The Chairman ordered that the financial statements be filed with the records of the Foundation.

Eric Thornton and Francisco Aguirre, Cambridge Associates, joined the meeting (via telephone) to: review the portfolio's performance through March 31, 2009; determine management of 10% real assets allocation; finalize a transition plan for moving the portfolio to its new targets during 2009; and to review the revised Statement of Investment Objectives and Policies. It was noted that during the first quarter of 2009, the portfolio declined 5.7%, 380 points ahead of the policy benchmark. Since the portfolio's inception in March 2004, it has returned an average of 1.5%, 20 basis points ahead of the policy benchmark. After discussion, the following actions were recommended:

 Retain Wellington Management Company as the REIT manager with a 6% target allocation and add the T. Rowe Price New Era fund, as the natural resources manager, with a 4% target allocation

- Rebalance the investment portfolio incrementally by the end of 2009. This includes, but is not limited to, reducing assets in fixed income, increasing assets in emerging markets, and investing in natural resources
- Acceptance of the revised Statement of Investment Objectives and Policies Upon motion dually made by Mr. Sosland and seconded by Mr. Hall, the recommended actions were unanimously approved. After the discussion, the phone call with Mr. Thornton and Mr. Aguirre was concluded.

Following the conclusion of the phone call, Mr. Miles noted that renewal of the Foundation's contract with Cambridge Associates will be reviewed in June 2009. He sought guidance from the Board of Directors regarding the process desired to review the performance of Cambridge Associates. The Board of Directors stated they are satisfied with the services provided by Cambridge Associates and requested information on comparable fees charged by other investment advisors. It should be noted that Mr. Hall abstained from contract discussions with Cambridge Associates due to a professional conflict of interest.

Next, the Board of Directors considered a list of pending requests for grants and essential services contributions. In this regard, the Chairman referred to the previously distributed summary of all pending requests with attached descriptive data regarding the institution making the request, and the purpose thereof. Such requests and the action taken with respect to each request include the following:

Community Development

City Vision Ministries – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support project management capacity within the organization

Education

DeLaSalle Education Center – a grant for \$20,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support the Leadership Academy and Recovery Program

KIPP Endeavor Academy – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to supplement math teacher salaries during the 2009 - 2010 school year

Health and Human Service

University of Kansas Endowment Association/JayDoc Free Health Clinic – a grant for \$18,900 was approved, payable in 2009, to purchase an ultrasound machine for use by JayDoc Free Health Clinic and Southwest Boulevard Family Health Care

The following essential services grant recommendations were approved:

Catholic Charities of Northeast Kansas – a grant for \$25,000, to support services for low-income individuals through their family advocacy centers

Guadalupe Center – a grant for \$25,000, to support the children's nutrition program Operation Breakthrough – a grant for \$25,000, to support daycare and before/after school costs for children whose parents are unemployed

Truman Medical Center – a grant for \$25,000, to support services provided for low-income, uninsured individuals through outpatient clinics

United Way of Greater Kansas City – a grant for \$25,000, to support the 2-1-1 referral service and information system

The H & R Block Foundation Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors June 23, 2009

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of The H & R Block Foundation was held on June 23, 2009, at One H&R Block Way, Kansas City, Missouri 64105 pursuant to notice, and in accordance with the Bylaws of the Foundation.

The following members of the Board of Directors were present, to wit:

Also in attendance were David P. Miles, President of The H & R Block Foundation, and Carey Wilkerson Looney, Vice President & Secretary of The H & R Block Foundation. Russell P. Smyth was unable to attend the meeting. Henry W. Bloch acted as Chairman of the meeting. Carey Wilkerson Looney acted as Secretary of the meeting.

The Chairman requested approval of the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held on April 21, 2009, noting that copies of such minutes had been distributed to all directors prior to the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Sosland and seconded by Mr. Salizzoni, the minutes were unanimously approved.

Mr. Miles presented the Foundation's financial statements that had been distributed prior to the meeting. As of April 30, 2009, the assets of the Foundation were \$43,604,892. It was noted that the Foundation's second quarter investment performance report would be presented at the September 22, 2009 meeting. The Chairman ordered that the financial statements be filed with the records of the Foundation.

Next, Stan House and Mary Stratman, of House Park & Dobratz, reviewed the Foundation's 2008 audit with the Board of Directors. Mr. House noted that the investment fees included in the audit do not reflect the total fees because some investment fees are embedded within the funds. The Board of Directors requested that the total investment fees be reflected as a footnote in future audits. After the audit review, Mr. Miles and Ms. Wilkerson Looney were excused from the meeting for further Board inquiry about the audit. Once the inquiry was complete, Mr. House and Ms. Stratman left the meeting and Mr. Miles and Ms. Wilkerson Looney rejoined the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Matheny and seconded by Mr. Hall, the 2008 audit was unanimously approved with the addition of the footnote.

Then, the Investment Committee recommended approval of a one year investment advisor agreement with Cambridge Associates. The agreement includes fees of \$75,000 for the period of October 1, 2009 to September 30, 2010. It was

noted that the fee was not increased from the previous year. The Committee also recommended placing the Foundation's cash assets at H&R Block Bank into the FDIC's Temporary Liquidity Guarantee Program. This program will fully insure the Foundation's cash assets at the H&R Block Bank. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Matheny and seconded by Mr. Salizzoni, the investment advisor agreement and placement of cash accounts into the FDIC's Temporary Liquidity Guarantee Program were unanimously approved. Mr. Hall abstained from the Cambridge Associates agreement discussion and vote due to a professional conflict of interest.

The Board of Directors then considered a list of pending requests for grants and essential services contributions. In this regard, the Chairman referred to the previously distributed summary of all pending requests with attached descriptive data regarding the institution making the request, and the purpose thereof. Such requests and the action taken with respect to each request include the following:

Education

Donnelly College – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support assessment measures for students

United Inner City Services – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support professional development and access to early learning programs for underserved children

Health & Human Service

Big Brothers Big Sisters of Greater Kansas City – a grant for \$20,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support outsourcing of human resource functions and client and volunteer management systems

Community LINC – a grant for \$20,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to provide the required match for the organization's 2009 HUD contract for supportive housing services

The following essential services grant recommendations were approved:

- El Centro a grant for \$10,000 to support essential services provided for Hispanic clients utilizing family support, financial management, and domestic violence counseling services
- reStart a grant for \$25,000 to support the increased demand for emergency shelter and transitional living services for single adults, in addition to, emergency shelter and supportive housing for families
- The Helping Hand of Goodwill Industries a grant for \$15,000 to support the Job Hunter's program

The H & R Block Foundation Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors September 22, 2009

The annual meeting of the Board of Directors of The H & R Block Foundation was held on September 22, 2009, at One H&R Block Way, Kansas City, Missouri 64105 pursuant to notice, and in accordance with the Bylaws of the Foundation.

The following members of the Board of Directors were present, to wit:

Henry W. Bloch William A. Hall Frank L. Salizzoni Morton I. Sosland

Edward T. Matheny, Jr.

Also in attendance were David P. Miles, President of The H & R Block Foundation, Carey Wilkerson Looney, Vice President and Secretary of The H & R Block Foundation, and Hillary Beuschel, Program Administrator of The H & R Block Foundation. Russell P. Smyth was unable to attend the meeting. Henry W. Bloch acted as Chairman of the meeting. Carey Wilkerson Looney acted as Secretary of the meeting.

The Chairman first requested approval of the minutes of the Board of Directors meeting held on June 23, 2009, noting that copies of such minutes had been mailed to all directors prior to the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Salizzoni and seconded by Mr. Hall, the minutes were unanimously approved.

Next, the Chairman referred to the financial statements that had been distributed prior to the meeting. The balance sheet showed that as of July 31, 2009, the assets of the Foundation, totaled \$48,158,839. The Chairman ordered that the financial statements be filed with the records of the Foundation.

The 2009 Second Quarter Investment Performance Report, prepared by Cambridge Associates, was reviewed. It was noted that the Foundation's portfolio increased 8.4% in the first two quarters of 2009, 320 basis points ahead of its policy benchmark. Since inception, the portfolio has returned an average of 1.2% per year; or an average of 10 basis points ahead of the policy benchmark.

Mr. Miles then presented the following Investment Committee recommendations for approval by the Board of Directors:

- 1. Liquidation of the investment in Marsico Capital Management
- 2. Liquidation of the investment in Vanguard Group's International Value Fund
- 3. Addition of a passive international manager, State Street Global Advisors MSCI EAFE Index Fund
- 4. Addition of an active global equity manager, Oldfield Partners
- 5. An increase of 2% to the SSgA Russell 3000 target; and the addition of a 5% target for Oldfield Partners and 9% target for the SSgA EAFE Index
- 6. Modification of the Statement of Investment Objectives and Policies to allow more flexibility with establishing benchmarks without needing to approve a new policy.

Upon motion duly made by Mr. Hall and seconded by Mr. Salizzoni, investment committee recommendations were unanimously approved. Mr. Miles also presented information that showed the Foundation's 2008 total investment fees, as a percentage of the average monthly investment assets, were 92 basis points.

The Board then considered the election of directors. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Matheny and seconded by Mr. Sosland, the following directors were elected to serve until the next Annual Meeting and until their respective successors are elected or chosen and qualify were:

Gillis Center – a grant for \$11,326 was approved, payable in 2009, to replace science and social studies curricula at Gillis Alternative Day School.

Parents As Teachers National Center – a grant for \$10,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support the organization's 25th anniversary program expansion campaign.

Health & Human Service

Benilde Hall – a grant for \$12,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support the homeless outreach program.

Cabot Westside Health Center – a grant for \$25,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support expansion of the organization's parking lot.

Synergy Services – a grant for \$25,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to purchase and install Community CareLink.

The following essential services grant recommendations were approved: Community Services League – a grant for \$25,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support emergency and direct assistance and employment programs.

Don Bosco Community Center – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support the Work Empowerment program.

Project reviews and the reports were presented. Continued funding of the multivear grants and recommendations were approved.

Next, Mr. Miles presented information on the 2009-2010 H & R Block Foundation Scholarship program. The Foundation provided \$226,680 to Scholarship America; which included \$194,250 for scholarships and \$32,430 for management fees. There were 1,450 applications for the scholarship and 190 recipients. Scholarship amounts varied from \$1,000 to \$1,200. The following recommendations were presented for the 2010 – 2011 program:

- Increasing funding of scholarships to \$250,000 (\$221,500 for scholarship awards and \$28,500 for management fees)
- Transition to an online application process

Upon motion duly made by Mr. Matheny and seconded by Mr. Sosland recommendations for the 2010 – 2011 H & R Block Foundation Scholarship program were unanimously approved.

Mr. Miles presented the Henry W. Bloch Scholars program assessment that was conducted by Bernard Consulting Group during summer 2009. It was noted that during the 2009 · 2010 school year, staff will complete the following:

- Review of complete assessment with partner institutions
- Prioritize program recommendations with program partners
- Develop a work plan to implement program enhancements

Finally, Mr. Miles provided the Board of Directors with the list of authorized agents for the Foundation's money market and checking accounts. Authorized agents are Henry W. Bloch, David P. Miles, Douglas M. Salaway, Frank L. Salizzoni, and Becky S. Shulman. It was noted that Mr. Miles is not authorized to sign checks for administrative or grant distribution payments.

There being no further business to come before the Board, upon motion duly made by Mr. Hall and seconded by Mr. Sosland, the meeting was adjourned.

A regular meeting of the Board of Directors of The H & R Block Foundation was held on December 9, 2009, at One H&R Block Way, Kansas City, Missouri 64105 pursuant to notice, and in accordance with the Bylaws of the Foundation.

The following members of the Board of Directors were present, to wit:

Henry W. Bloch William A. Hall Edward T. Matheny, Jr. Frank L. Salizzoni Russell P. Smyth Morton I. Sosland

Also in attendance were David P. Miles, President of The H & R Block Foundation, Carey Wilkerson Looney, Vice President and Secretary of The H & R Block Foundation, and Hillary Beuschel, Program Administrator of The H & R Block Foundation. Henry W. Bloch acted as Chairman of the meeting. Carey Wilkerson Looney acted as Secretary of the meeting.

First, the Chairman requested approval of the minutes of the annual meeting of the Board of Directors held on September 22, 2009, noting that copies of such minutes had been mailed to all directors prior to the meeting. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Hall and seconded by Mr. Sosland, the minutes were unanimously approved.

Mr. Miles then referred to the financial statements that had been distributed prior to the meeting. The balance sheet showed that as of October 31, 2009, the assets of the Foundation totaled \$50,503,089. The Chairman ordered that the financial statements be filed with the records of the Foundation. The Chairman also thanked Mr. Smyth for the Corporation's \$2 million gift that will be transferred to the Foundation on December 14, 2009.

The 2009 Third Quarter Investment Performance Report, prepared by Cambridge Associates, was reviewed. It was noted that the Foundation's portfolio increased 13.9% during the third quarter, 100 basis points behind the policy benchmark. Since inception in 2004, the portfolio has returned an average of 3.6% per year, marginally lagging the policy benchmark by an average of 20 basis points. Mr. Miles informed the Board of Directors that the FDIC's Temporary Liquidity Guarantee, insuring the Foundation's cash assets at H&R Block Bank, has been extended to June 30, 2010.

Next, Mr. Miles recommended that House, Park & Dobratz perform the Foundation's 2009 audit for a fee not to exceed \$7,000, including out-of-pocket expenses. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Salizzoni and seconded by Mr. Smyth, the engagement of House, Park & Dobratz to perform the Foundation's 2009 audit was unanimously approved.

Then, the Board of Directors considered a list of pending requests for grants and contributions. In this regard, the Chairman referred to the previously distributed summary of pending requests with attached descriptive data regarding the institution

making the request and the purpose thereof. Such requests and the action taken with respect to each are as follows:

Community Development

Legal Aid of Western Missouri – a grant for \$20,000 was approved, payable in January 2010, to support the short-term reduction of Interest on Lawyer Trust Accounts (IOLTA) funding during 2010.

Education

Jumpstart for Young Children – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support implementation of a new curriculum through Jumpstart Kansas City.

Health & Human Service

Developing Potential Inc. – a grant for \$14,044 was approved, payable in 2009, to purchase 30 netbooks for the organization's staff to meet Medicaid requirements.

Southwest Boulevard Family Health Care – a grant for \$38,700 was approved, payable in 2009, to purchase digital radiology equipment.

TLC for Children and Families – a grant for \$22,500 was approved, payable in 2009, to support organizational assessment and strategic planning by Team Tech Consultants. This grant is contingent upon staff verification that Team Tech Consultants has expertise in state of Kansas social services funding revenue streams.

Turning Point – a grant for \$25,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support comprehensive organizational assessment for resource allocation and program development.

The following essential services grant recommendations were approved:

Health Partnership Clinic of Johnson County – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support the pharmaceutical assistance program for uninsured individuals living in Johnson County, Kansas.

Kansas City Free Health Clinic – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support medications for uninsured individuals living in Jackson County, Missouri.

Northland Health Care Access – a grant for \$15,000 was approved, payable in 2009, to support evening hours of service at the Crestview Family Medical Clinic.

Mr. Miles presented an overview of the Foundation's funding priorities in 2010. It was determined that during 2010, the Foundation will remain committed to its existing programs and essential services; but, will add some flexibility to consider strategic opportunities that will improve services to families and strengthen non profit organizations. The Board of Directors will finalize 2010 funding recommendations at its February 2010 planning meeting.

Next, Mr. Miles presented a request from the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art for sponsorship of an event honoring Marc Wilson's retirement and the opening of the Museum's new Egyptian Galleries. Upon motion duly made by Mr. Matheny and seconded by Mr. Smyth, the Board of Directors unanimously approved a sponsorship in the amount of \$40,000 for the reception and Egyptian Gallery viewing during the Friends of Art Tribute event for Marc Wilson.

Following the presentation of the Nelson-Atkins Museum of Art sponsorship request, Mr. Miles, Ms. Wilkerson Looney, and Ms. Beuschel left the meeting and the Board of Directors went into executive session.

There being no further business to come before the Board, upon motion duly made by Mr. Sosland and seconded by Mr. Salizzoni, the meeting was adjourned.

PROGRAM CVERVIEW

H&R Block, Inc. and its subsidiaries believe in civic involvement and volunteerism. We are committed to good corporate citizenship through community service and believe that dedication and effort by community volunteers deserve recognition.

Teamwork and group effort are an important part of the H&R Block success story. Through group efforts, associates have achieved exceptional business accomplishments. This approach can also help nonprofit organizations. For this reason, The H & R Block Foundation established the Cash for Champions Program. When an eligible associate provides 25 hours of volunteer service to a nonprofit organization within a 12-consecutive-month period, The H & R Block Foundation will match that commitment with a gift of \$100 to the organization.

Each qualified associate is eligible to have a maximum of \$400 (100 volunteer hours) matched by the Foundation during any calendar year.

WHO MAY PARTICIPATE?

To be a donor of volunteer services eligible for matching gifts under the Program (an 'Eligible Donor'), a person must (a) be a regular full time employee* of (i) any direct or indirect subsidiary of H&R Block, Inc. ('Block'), or (ii) McGladrey & Pullen, LLP (an accounting firm in which H&R Block, Inc. has no direct or indirect ownership interest, but with which an indirect subsidiary of H&R Block, Inc. has a contractual relationship), and (b) not be an officer of Block or any such subsidiary, or an officer or partner of McGladrey & Pullen, LLP on the date of The H & R Foundation's receipt of such employee's completed and executed verification form.

* A regular full-time employee of H&R Block is an associate who works five days a week, eight hours per day on a non-seasonal continuing basis.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE IN THE CASH FOR CHAMPIONS PROGRAM?

To qualify for a Cash For Champions matching gift, an associate must provide 25 hours of volunteer service to a qualified organization within a 12-consecutive-month period.

The associate must then complete Part 1 of the application provided in this brochure and send it to the charitable organization for completion of Part 2. When the application is received by The H & R Block Foundation and the gift is approved, a check will be sent to the specified agency on behalf of the associate. A confirmation e-mail will be sent to the associate.

Final determination of eligibility is made by The H & R Block Foundation.

A registered charity under Canada's Income Tax Act determined in good faith by the Foundation to be an organization described in the U.S. Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and 509(a)(1), (2), or (3).

Yes. They include:

- Organizations that knowingly discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, gender, national origin, sexual orientation, age, disability, marital status, or status as a veteran.

The H & R Block Foundation Scholarship Program was established in 1975 to make grants to assist academically capable children of qualified employees of H&R Block, Inc. and its direct and indirect subsidiaries in furthering their education at accredited post-secondary, degree-granting educational institutions.

Evaluation includes academic capability, participation in school and community activities, work experience, a statement of educational and career goals, unusual personal or family circumstances, an appraisal by someone not related to the student, and who has a parent or guardian who meets employment requirements described on the next page. Once the recipients are selected, the family's financial information is assessed to determine the amount of each award.

Under U.S. Internal Revenue Service regulations covering sponsored scholarship programs such as The H & R Block Foundation Scholarship Program, recipients must be selected impartially. To satisfy this requirement, The H & R Block Foundation has retained Scholarship America to oversee and manage the program. Scholarship America is a national nonprofit educational support and student aid service organization that offers complete administrative services for corporations, foundations, and others who wish to support higher education through grants to students.



Scholarships will be awarded in variable amounts from \$1,000 to \$2,000. In order to assure fuller racial minority participation in the program, a minimum number of grants are designated for awards to minority students. The number of grants awarded to eligible minority applicants will be in direct proportion to the total number of eligible applications received. Under the program, a "racial minority" is defined as an individual who has at least one natural parent who is not Caucasian.

A restricted scholarship has been established for each of five institutions located in the Kansas City metropolitan area: Avila University, Kansas City Art Institute, Rockhurst University, University of Missouri-Kansas City, and William Jewell College. A restricted award, in memory of Roman Halajko, former Assistant Vice President and Regional Director of H&R Block Canada, Inc., has been established. This scholarship will be awarded to the most deserving Canadian applicant each year. If any of the above mentioned restricted grants are not awarded by Scholarship America, the scholarship will become unrestricted and awarded accordingly.

Final selection of scholarship recipients will be made by Scholarship America. Selection is not made by any company or foundation employee, officer, or director.



Academic Requirements for Applicant:

- 1 A cumulative grade point average of at least 2.0 on a scale in which 4.0 is equivalent to a grade of A;
- 2. Graduate of a secondary school or a candidate for graduation at the time of application for a scholarship; and,
- 3. Must have met or have the apparent ability to meet the requirements for admission to a post-secondary, degree-granting educational institution, or already be enrolled in such an institution.

Employment Requirements for Parent or Guardian of Scholarship Applicant:

To be eligible, an individual must also be the child of a qualified employee of (a) H&R Block Services and its direct or indirect subsidiaries, HRB Management, Inc., H&R Block Bank, H&R Block Digital Tax Solutions, LLC, H&R Block Financial Advisors, Inc., H&R Block Mortgage Corporation, or Block Financial Corporation; (b) the child of a qualified franchisee of any direct or indirect subsidiary of H&R Block, Inc., (c) the child of a qualified employee of such qualified franchisee, or (d) the child of a qualified employee of McGladrey & Pullen, LLP (an accounting firm in which H&R Block, Inc. has no direct or indirect ownership interest, but with which an indirect subsidiary of H&R Block, Inc. has a contractual relationship.) A "qualified franchisee" is a franchisee of any direct or indirect subsidiary of H&R Block, Inc., who is in good standing on the date that applications for grants are due and on the date grants are awarded. "Child" shall include natural children, adopted children, stepchildren, and legal wards.

The term "qualified employee" includes:

- 1 Full-time employees who are employed and in good standing both on the date that applications for grants are due and the date grants are awarded;
- Employees employed in the preparation of tax returns who are employed only during the tax season and who, if not actively employed when applications for grants are due and grants are awarded, were employees in good standing at the close of the last tax season prior to such dates and are eligible for reemployment; and,
- 3 Part-time employees who do not qualify under (1) or (2) and who, if not actively employed at the time applications for grants are due and awarded, were employed for at least 100 days during the 12 months preceding such dates and who are in good standing and eligible for rehire.



Grantee must be a full-time student, defined as full-time enrollment for the entire upcoming academic year, pursuing a course of study as a candidate for a degree at an accredited post-secondary, degree-granting educational institution.

Grants shall be utilized only to defray expenses which are actually and necessarily incurred by the grantee during the period for which the scholarship is granted in attending the educational institution at which he or she is enrolled and which would qualify the amount of the grant to be excluded from the gross income of the grantee.

The educational institution which disburses the funds must agree to pay the funds to the grantee only if the grantee is enrolled at such institution and his or her standing at such educational institution is consistent with the purposes and conditions of the grant.

For the purpose of enabling Scholarship America to determine that the recipients of grants have performed the activities the grants are intended to finance, each grantee shall, if requested by Scholarship America, submit a report of the courses the grantee has taken and the grades received. This report shall be verified by the educational institution at which the grantee is enrolled.

No grant made under this program shall renew automatically. An individual who previously received a grant under this program may reapply to the scholarship program each year provided eligibility requirements continue to be met.

The grantee's standing at the educational institution at which he or she is enrolled must be consistent with the purposes and conditions of the grant originally made. All reports required as a condition of the original grant must have been received, and Scholarship America must not have received information indicating that the original grant was used for any purpose other than that for which it was made.



Each applicant is responsible for gathering and submitting all information necessary for Scholarship America to select scholarship recipients. The procedure is:

- 1. Link to the online application through the Foundation's website www.hrblockfoundation.org.
- 2 Complete the online application and submit the following documents: High school seniors must include your official high school transcript with your completed application. Students currently or previously enrolled in college or vocational technical schools must include all college or vo-tech transcripts from each previously attended post-secondary school with your completed application. On-line transcripts and grade reports are not acceptable.
- 3 Scholarship America will send an e-mail acknowledgment upon receipt of your completed application to the applicant's e-mail address or, if unavailable, a postcard will be sent by mail to the applicant's home address. If you do not receive such an acknowledgment within several weeks, call Scholarship America at 1-800-537-4180.
- 5 Scholarship awards, as determined by Scholarship America, will be announced in mid-June. All applicants will be notified whether or not they have been selected to receive an award.
