Part IX-A - Summary of Direct Charitable Activities

In 2006, The Highmark Foundation launch hed "Highmark Healthy High 5", a five year \$100 million children's health promotion initiative to promote lifelong, healthy behaviors in children and adolescents ages 6-18 to ensure that they have healthy bodies and minds. High mark Healthy High 5 will provide support in five areas critical to children's overall health and well-being: physical activity, nutrition, self-esteem, grieving and bullying. A total of 23 community-based programs were supported in these five a reas in addition to five signature partners.

Bullying prevention programs will be implemented in 47 school districts in the next three years using the internationally recognized Olweus anti-b ullying program through Windber Research Institut e. Highmark Healthy High 5 HALT! will im prove supervision, implement classroom rules against bullying and host talks around the topic. The Highmark Healthy High 5 Bullying Prevention Institute was founded by, and is supported by, The Highmark Foundation. The Bullying Prevention Institute was created to afford professional development and educational opportunities to school personnel and other professionals as part of the wide-scale implementation of the Olweus Bullying Prevention Program in Pennsylvania.

Character education curric ulum by the Heart wood Institute deve lops children's moral character and self-esteem through understanding and seven core attributes. T.R.U.E. CardsLife Lessons introduces core attributes through a guided approach for discussion with children to build their self-esteem. The cards provide resources for teachers, school counselor and parents. A total of 9,606 sets of cards were distributed impacting 180,000 children.

SPARK is an internationally recognized program that offers quality recreational experiences for children age s 5-13 in an after-school setting. Through non-competitive fun, games and activities, SPARK promotes appreciation for and participation in an active lifestyle. The SPARK Active Recreation Program is currently being offered in 164 after-school and summer programs in western and central Pennsylvania.

Highmark Health eTools for Schools is a web-based portal that supports policy change within Pennsylvania schools and provides a secure method to calculate, track and report student body mass index (BMI) in a format required by the Pennsylvania Department of Health. Health eTools for Schools a Iso provides standards-based nutrition and physical activities introduced during core academic instructional time. Health eTools for Schools will be funded by The Highmark Foundation for three years from the enrollment date. A total of 468,500 students in western and central Pennsylvania are being tracked in Health eTools.

LearntobeHealty.org is an e-learning initiative created by the Susan P. Byrnes Health Education Center for teachers, students, and parents. It is provided to schools across central and western Pennsylvania at no cost. LearntobeHealty.org contains quality health education programs that directly affect the lives of children through the use of interactive, high tech exhibits coupled with skilled and trained educators. Learntobehealthy usage in Highmark's 49-counties is as follows: 3,900 teachers. Approximately 1,300 school buildings have used the site, in addition to 404,000 children associated with teachers (teachers using the site for classr oom instruction).

nrg-Powered by Choice off ered by the Center for Nutrition and Ph ysical Activity (CNAP) includes program materials to support school and community-based youth-led initiatives in counties served by Highmark Inc. The nrg program is available to all schools as well as community-based youth organizations. Approximately 250,000 students have been engaged through program activity kits distributed in schools (272) and at community sites (60).

The Highmark Caring Place is dedicated to ensuring that grieving children and families receive support in the midst of their grief by creating awareness of their needs, providing specialized programs, and empowering the community through trained consultation services. The Caring Place is a family program with services offered at no cost and is available to the whole community. In 2009, a total of 1,600 children and adults atten ded peer support group programs from 20 counties. Over 11,000 grieving children, adolescents and family members were served in 2009 through peer support and group programs.

KidShape is a nine-week program geared toward overweight children ages 6 to 14 and is based upon weight criteria (at or above the 95th percentile). The curriculum is intended to help families adopt better nutrition habits and engage in more frequent physical

activity. There are 18 KidShape sites located in western and central PA.

In addition to grants to these identified Highmark Healthy High 5 strategic partners, the Highmark Foundation also awards annual one-year Challenge Grants to Pennsylva nia schools, grades K- 12. The Highmark Healthy High 5 School Challenge grant program is designed to produce programs that will create healthier students. All schools in the 49-county service area are invited to submit proposals for programs to improve nutrition education, nutrition choices or opportunities for physical activity. In 2009, a total of 297 challenge grants were awarded.

If an organization is a supporting organization described in section 509(a)(3) of the Code, it must be a Type I (controlled by the supported organization), Type II (under common control with the supported organization) or functionally integrated Type III (operates as part of the supported organization) supporting organization.
