### Explanation of Lobbying Activities For the year 2009

During 2009, The Foundation for Peripheral Neuropathy ("TFFPN") distributed two letters (copies attached) via electronic mail to a California state assemblyman (the "Assemblyman") in support of legislation supporting therapies to treat peripheral neuropathy pain. TFFPN received copies of similar letters supporting the same legislation that had been sent to the Assemblyman from another organization described in Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, which had been determined by the Internal Revenue Service to be a public charity (the "Public Charity"). Unaware that sending such letters constituted lobbying and a prohibited activity by TFFPN (although permissible for the Public Charity), TFFPN copied the contents of the letters from the Public Charity, placed them on TFFPN letterhead, and sent them to the Assemblyman on behalf of TFFPN.

Upon learning that sending these letters constituted lobbying, TFFPN ceased sending any letters of this nature. Additionally, TFFPN has sent follow-up letters to the Assemblyman informing him that TFFPN was not permitted to attempt to influence such legislation and requesting that he disregard TFFPN's prior requests (copies of these letters are also attached).

### BY-LAWS OF THE FOUNDATION FOR PERIPHERAL NEUROPATHY

(Amended and Restated on March 11, 2009)

### ARTICLE I NAME

The name of the corporation shall be The Foundation For Peripheral Neuropathy ("Corporation").

# ARTICLE II PURPOSES

- Section 1. Not for Profit. The Corporation is organized and shall operate as an Illinois not-for-profit corporation, and shall have such powers as are now and may hereafter be granted by the General Not-for-Profit Corporation Act of the State of Illinois.
- Section 2. Purposes. The Corporation is organized to operate exclusively for the purposes set forth in its Articles of Incorporation, Mission Statement (attached hereto as Exhibit A) and Guidelines (attached hereto as Exhibit B), including the promotion of causes that seek to better prevent, diagnose, more effectively treat and, eventually, cure peripheral neuropathy, and that provide increased awareness of promising treatment options for peripheral neuropathy, and the making of distributions to organizations that promote the same causes and qualify as exempt organizations under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended.
- Section 3. Rules. The Corporation and all persons acting for and on behalf of it shall be conclusively bound by the rules set forth in its Articles of Incorporation and these by-laws.
- Section 4. Charitable Lead Trust Income. No officer or director of the Corporation shall have any voice or vote regarding the ultimate disposition of funds directly or indirectly received by the Corporation from any charitable lead trust (also known as a 'charitable income trust'), as described in Section 2522(c)(2)(B) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (a 'Charitable Lead Trust'), established by such officer or director. In the event a Charitable Lead Trust established by an officer or director of the Corporation shall contribute funds directly or indirectly to the Corporation, such funds shall be segregated into a separate account, the disposition of which shall be directed by the other officers and directors of the Corporation for

the purposes set forth in the Articles of Incorporation of the Corporation, subject to the provisions of this Article.

## ARTICLE III REGISTERED OFFICE AND AGENT

The Corporation shall have and continuously maintain in the State of Illinois a registered office and a registered agent whose office shall be identical with such registered office, and may have such other offices within or without the State of Illinois as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

### ARTICLE IV BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- Section 1. General Powers. The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors, which shall supervise, control and direct the business and affairs of the Corporation; shall determine its policies or changes within the limits of these by-laws, the Articles of Incorporation and as directed by the Mission Statement; shall actively promote its purposes as identified within the Articles of Incorporation and the Mission Statement; and shall have discretion in the disbursement of its funds. The Board of Directors may adopt such rules and regulations for the conduct of its business as shall be deemed advisable and may, in the execution of the powers granted, appoint such agents as it may consider necessary.
- Section 2. Composition, Tenure, and Qualifications. A majority of the directors of the Corporation shall elect the Board of Directors which shall be comprised of not less than four (4) nor more than nine (9) directors, as fixed from time to time, within such minimum and maximum, by a majority of the directors of the Corporation. The term of office for each director shall be two (2) years. An individual may serve a maximum of three (3) terms as a director, whether consecutive or non-consecutive; provided, however, that notwithstanding the foregoing to the contrary, Jack Miller may serve an unlimited number of terms as director, whether consecutive or non-consecutive. Each director shall continue in office until his or her successor is duly elected or appointed, and qualified. Directors need not be residents of Illinois, U.S. citizens or officers of the Corporation.
- Section 3. Initial Directors. The initial Board of Directors shall be the persons specified in the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation.
- Section 4. Vacancies. A majority of the directors of the Corporation shall appoint successor directors to fill any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors or any newly created directorships resulting from an increase in the number of directors. A director appointed to fill a vacancy for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor shall serve for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office and until his or her successor shall have been appointed and qualified.
- Section 5. Regular Meetings. The Board of Directors shall hold an Annual Meeting for such business as the Board of Directors shall deem appropriate. The Board of Directors may hold regularly scheduled meetings for any other purpose as the Board of Directors shall deem

appropriate. The Board of Directors may provide by resolution the time, date and place, either within or without the State of Illinois, for such Annual Meeting and other regular meetings without other notice than such resolution.

- Section 6. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of the President or any two (2) directors of the Corporation. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board of Directors may fix any place, either within or without the State of Illinois, for the special meeting called by them.
- Section 7. Notice. Notice of any special meeting of the Board of Directors shall state the time, date and place of the meeting and shall be given at least three (3) days prior to the date of such meeting, by written or printed notice delivered personally, by mail, by electronic mail ("e-mail") or by facsimile transmission to each director at his or her address as shown in the records of the Corporation; provided, however, in the case of a meeting held pursuant to Article IV, Section 9 below, notice may be given no less than twenty-four (24) hours prior thereto. Any director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened. Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting.
- Section 8. Quorum. A majority of the directors in office shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board; provided that, if less than a majority of such number of directors are present at any meeting of the Board of Directors, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice. The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, unless the act of a greater number is required by law, the Articles of Incorporation or these by-laws.
- Section 9. Meeting by Communications Equipment. Members of the Board, or of any committee designated by the Board, may take any action permitted or authorized by law, the Articles of Incorporation or these by-laws pursuant to meeting through the use of a conference telephone or other communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can communicate with each other. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this section shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- Section 10. Informal Action. Any action which is permitted or authorized by law, the Articles of Incorporation or these by-laws to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors, or any other action which may be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors, may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing, setting forth the action taken, shall be signed by all of the directors entitled to vote with respect to the subject matter thereof. Any such consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote at a duly called and constituted meeting of the Board of Directors.

- Section 11. Resignation. Any director may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board of Directors, the President or the Secretary of the Corporation. A resignation need not be accepted in order to be effective.
- Section 12. Removal. Any director may be removed by a majority of the directors of the Corporation whenever in the sole and unquestionable judgment of the directors the best interests of the Corporation would be served thereby.

### ARTICLE V OFFICERS

- Section 1. Officers. The officers of the Corporation shall be a Chairman, a President, one or more Vice-Presidents (if determined by the Board of Directors), a Secretary and a Treasurer. In addition, the Board of Directors may elect or appoint such other officers as it shall deem desirable, who shall have authority to perform the duties prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- Section 2. Election, Tenure, and Qualifications. The Chairman (other than Jack Miller), President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary and Treasurer of the Corporation shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at its Annual Meeting, or as soon thereafter as practicable. The Chairman (other than Jack Miller), President, Vice-Presidents, Secretary, and Treasurer shall serve two-year terms commencing at the conclusion of the Annual Meeting at which they are elected and continuing until their successors have been duly elected and qualified. There shall be no limit on the number of consecutive terms an individual may serve as an officer. An individual may hold more than one office simultaneously.
- Special Provision for Jack Miller. Jack Miller shall be the initial Chairman and he shall serve until his resignation, death or Permanent Disability. For purposes of these By-laws, the term "Permanent Disability" shall mean, with respect to Jack Miller, either (a) the issuance of an order by a court of competent jurisdiction declaring Jack Miller to be an incompetent or a disabled person and appointing a conservator or a guardian for such his person or property, or (b) the written certification by "three (3) Proper Physicians" (as defined herein) issued within two (2) years of attending Jack Miller, stating that Jack Miller, due to physical, mental or emotional disability, is not able to manage business affairs in a manner similar to that of individuals of prudence, discretion and intelligence. Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, Jack Miller shall not be considered to have a Permanent Disability solely by reason of having a physical disability which does not otherwise cause him to be substantially unable to perform his customary duties for the Corporation. As used herein, the term "three (3) Proper Physicians" shall mean (A) Jack Miller's primary care physician, (B) a physician chosen by such person, which physician shall be certified by a recognized Medical Specialty Board and shall not be related by blood or marriage to such person and (C) a physician chosen by the aforesaid two physicians, which physician shall be certified by a recognized Medical Specialty Board and shall not be related by blood or marriage to such person.
- Section 4. Resignation. Any officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board of Directors, the President or the Secretary of the Corporation. A resignation need not be accepted in order to be effective.

- Section 5. Removal. Any officer may be removed from office by an affirmative vote of the Board of Directors whenever, in its judgment, the best interests of the Corporation would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.
- Section 6. Vacancies. A vacancy in any office shall be filled by action of the Board of Directors at the next regular or special meeting thereof. An officer elected to fill a vacancy shall serve for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor, and until his or her successor shall have been duly elected and qualified, or until his or her death, resignation, or removal.
- Section 7. Chairman. The Chairman of the Board of Directors when present shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee and other meetings as required. The Chairman of the Board of Directors shall perform such other duties commonly incident to, and commensurate with, the office of Chairman of the Board of Directors and shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as the Board of Directors shall designate from time to time including, but not limited to, the following:
  - (a) Work with the President/Executive Director and the Board of Directors to establish the guiding principles, policies, and mission for the Corporation for example, by initiating a regular review of the Corporation's strategic plan and mission to keep them fresh and relevant, and by establishing metrics to measure success;
  - (b) Work with the appropriate directors to oversee the budget of the Corporation and assume ultimate responsibility for the integrity of its finances for example, by overseeing independent outside audits and, as appropriate, internal audits as well;
  - (c) Serve as an ad hoc member of all Board committees and work to structure a committee system that contributes to the Board's overall effectiveness;
  - (d) Oversee efforts to build and maintain a strong Board by setting goals and expectations for the Board, cultivating leadership among individual directors, and working with the nominating committee to make Board development a priority;
  - (e) Work with the President/Executive Director to identify and recruit new directors who bring important skills and knowledge to the board;
  - (f) Work to make sure the Board has opportunities to reflect regularly on how well it is meeting its responsibilities to the organization in part by overseeing a board self-assessment every 2 years;
  - (g) Oversee the hiring, evaluation, and compensation of the chief executive; and work to develop a succession plan for the chief executive's position for example, by making sure that other staff members have the capabilities they need to lead the Corporation;
  - (h) Guide the work of the Board to secure funds for the organization by overseeing the development of fundraising policies, encouraging and supporting the fundraising efforts of the development committee and individual directors, soliciting contributions from directors

and selected outside contributors, and setting an example by contributing his or her own funds to the organization; and

- (i) Speak for the Board in the event of a controversy or crisis; oversee the development of communications policies; and work to promote the work of the Corporation in conversations, speeches, interviews, and other day-to-day activities.
- Section 8. President. The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Corporation, and shall, in general, supervise and control all the affairs of the Corporation. The President shall preside at all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President may sign, with the Treasurer or any other proper officer of the Corporation authorized by the Board of Directors, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts or other instruments which the Board of Directors has authorized to be executed, except documents the execution of which shall be expressly delegated by law, the Articles of Incorporation, these by-laws, or the Board of Directors to some other officer or agent of the Corporation. The President shall handle the administrative and day-to-day operation of the Corporation, and shall, in general, perform all duties customarily incident to the office of president and such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors.
- Section 9. Vice-President. In the absence of the President or in the event of his inability or refusal to act, the Vice-President (or in the event there be more than one Vice-President, the Vice-Presidents, in the order designated, or in the absence of any designation, then in the order of their election) shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. Any Vice-President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him by the President or by the Board of Directors.
- Section 10. Secretary. The Secretary shall keep minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in one or more books maintained for that purpose; shall see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws or applicable law; shall be custodian of the corporate records; shall keep a record of the mailing address of each Director and officer of the Corporation, which addresses shall be furnished to the Secretary by the Directors and officers; and in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of secretary and such other duties as may be assigned from time to time by the President or the Board of Directors. The duties of the Secretary may be assigned in whole or in part to the President.
- Section 11. Treasurer. The Treasurer shall be the principal accounting and financial officer of the Corporation and shall have charge of and be responsible for the maintenance of adequate books of account for the Corporation; shall supervise and be responsible for custody of all funds and securities of the Corporation and for the receipt and disbursement thereof; shall deposit all funds and securities of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws; and shall, in general, perform all of the duties customarily incident to the office of treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the President or the Board of Directors. The duties of the Treasurer may be assigned in whole or in part to the President.

# ARTICLE VI COMMITTEES AND ADVISORY BODIES

- Section 1. Committees of the Board. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors in office, may form one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more directors and a majority of which shall be directors. Each such committee, to the extent provided in said resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the Corporation; but the designation of such committees, and the delegation thereto of any authority, shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual director, of any responsibility imposed upon them by law. A member of such committee may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever, in its judgment, the best interests of the Corporation would be served by such removal.
- Section 2. Other Advisory Bodies. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors in office, may create and appoint two or more persons to a commission, advisory body or other such body which may or may not have directors as members, which body may not act on behalf of the Corporation or bind it to any action but may make recommendations to the Board of Directors or to the officers. A member of such commission, advisory body or other such body may be removed by the Board of Directors whenever, in its judgment, the best interests of the Corporation would be served by such removal.
- Section 3. Term of Office. Each member of a committee shall continue as such until the next annual meeting of the Board of Directors of the Corporation and until his or her successor is appointed, unless the committee shall be sooner terminated, or unless such member shall have been removed by the Board.
  - Section 4. Chair. One member of each committee shall be appointed chair.
- Section 5. Vacancies. Vacancies in the membership of any committee may be filled by appointment made in the same manner as herein provided for the original appointment to that committee.
- Section 6. Quorum and Manner of Acting. Unless otherwise provided by resolution of the Board of Directors or by the President in establishing a committee, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum, and the act of a majority of the members present and voting at a duly called meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee.
- Section 7. Rules. Each committee may adopt rules for its own governance not inconsistent with these by-laws or with rules adopted by the Board of Directors.
- Section 8. Advisory Committee. The Board of Directors may establish an Advisory Committee for the Corporation upon such terms as the Board of Directors deems advisable.

Section 9. Scientific Advisory Board. The Board of Directors shall establish an advisory body, upon such terms as the Board of Directors deems advisable, to be known and commonly referred to as the "Scientific Advisory Board" which body may not act on behalf of the Corporation or bind it to any action but may make recommendations to the Board of Directors or to the officers on matters pertaining to the prevention, diagnosis, treatment and cure of peripheral neuropathy.

# ARTICLE VII FINANCE

- Section 1. Contracts. Any two (2) of the Chairman, President or Vice President may enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation; provided, however, notwithstanding the foregoing to the contrary, the Board of Directors may, at any time and from time to time, by a resolution of the Board authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation, in addition to or in lieu of the officers so authorized by these by-laws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- Section 2. Checks, Drafts, Etc. Each of the Chairman and the Treasurer of the Corporation may unilaterally sign checks, drafts, or other orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation without countersignature; provided, however, that notwithstanding the foregoing to the contrary, the Board of Directors may, at any time and from time to time, by a resolution of the Board authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation, in addition to or in lieu of the officers so authorized by these by-laws, to sign and/or countersign any one or more of the aforementioned instruments.
- Section 3. Deposits. All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.
- Section 4. Bonding. Any officer or director of the Corporation who handles funds may be required, at the Corporation's expense, to furnish an adequate surety bond approved by the Board of Directors in such amount as the Board of Directors shall prescribe.
- Section 5. Gifts. The Board of Directors may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Corporation.

### Section 6. Compensation, Reimbursement of Expenses and Prohibition of Loans.

(a) Except as otherwise provided in this Section, directors shall not receive any compensation for their services as directors. Nothing herein shall be construed to preclude a director from serving the Corporation in any other capacity and receiving reasonable compensation therefor.

- (b) Notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, the Board of Directors may authorize reimbursement of reasonable expenses incurred by directors, officers, employees, and members of any committee, commission or advisory body created by the Board of Directors including, but not limited to, the Scientific Advisory Board in connection with the performance of their duties as such, such reimbursement to be made in accordance with the procedure set forth in an expense reimbursement policy adopted by the Board of Directors.
- (c) No loans shall be made by the Corporation to any director, officer, employee, consultant, committee member or agent of the Corporation.

# ARTICLE VIII VOTING OF SECURITIES

The President shall have full authority, in the name and on behalf of the Corporation, to attend, act and vote at any meeting of security holders of any corporation in which the Corporation may hold securities, and at any such meeting shall possess and may exercise any and all rights and powers incident to the ownership of such securities and which, as the holder thereof, the Corporation might possess and exercise as if personally present, and may exercise such power and authority through the execution of proxies or may delegate such power and authority to any other officer, agent or employee of the Corporation.

# ARTICLE IX BOOKS AND RECORDS

The Corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors. The books and accounts of the Corporation may be audited annually by accountants selected by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE X FISCAL YEAR

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors.

# ARTICLE XI WAIVER OF NOTICE

Whenever any notice is required to be given under applicable law, the Articles of Incorporation or these by-laws, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

## ARTICLE XII INDEMNIFICATION

The Corporation shall indemnify all officers, directors, committee members, employees and agents acting on behalf of and at the request of the Corporation (other than consultants hired to provide services to the Corporation and members of any commission or advisory body created by the Board of Directors including, but not limited to, the Scientific Advisory Board) to the full extent permitted by the General Not for Profit Corporation Act of the State of Illinois, as amended, except that the Corporation shall not indemnify any officer, director, committee member, employee or agent acting on behalf and at the request of the Corporation for any criminal act committed by such person. The Corporation shall be entitled to purchase insurance for such indemnification to the full extent as determined from time to time by the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

# ARTICLE XIII AMENDMENTS

These by-laws may be altered, amended or repealed and new by-laws may be adopted by an affirmative vote of a two-thirds (2/3) majority of the directors present and voting at any duly called meeting of the directors at which a quorum is present; except that, notwithstanding any provision herein to the contrary, the provisions of Section 3 of Article V hereof may only be amended with the consent of Jack Miller.
