The Larry Robbins Foundation is pleased to inform you that The Nduna Foundation has been awarded a grant of \$7,000,000. The grant is to be used to fund: (1) education programs in New York City through KIPP Charter schools; (2) poverty alleviation in New York City through the Robin Hood Foundation; (3) education programs internationally through Teach for All, a partnership of Teach for America; (4) children's nutrition programs in Niger, Ethiopia, Sudan and Zimbabwe through UNICEF, (5) conservation work in the United States through the National Fish and Wildlife Foundation; and (6) programs supporting social entrepreneurs in developing countries through the Acumen Fund.

Use of Funds

Under United States tax laws and regulations, all grant funds must be expended for charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes as defined under Internal Revenue Code §501(c)(3). This grant is made solely for the purposes stated in this Agreement, and the grant funds as well as any interest earned upon them may not be expended for any other purpose without the written approval of the Larry Robbins Foundation. Any funds not expended in accordance with the terms of this Agreement must be returned to the Larry Robbins Foundation.

In addition, The Nduna Foundation agrees not to use any of the grant funds for any of the following purposes with respect to either the United States or any foreign country:

- (1) lobbying -- that is, any attempt to influence the outcome of any specific public election or any attempt to influence any legislation, such as by advocating the adoption or rejection of legislation, or by contacting or urging the public to contact members of a legislative body for the purpose of proposing, supporting or opposing legislation;
- (2) carrying on, directly or indirectly, any voter registration drive;
- (3) engaging in propaganda or partisan political activity;
- (4) making grants to individuals for travel, study or other similar purposes, unless you comply with applicable United States tax law with regard to such grants; and
- (5) making grants to other organizations (except public charities, governmental bodies and U.S. tax-exempt organizations), unless you conduct a "pre-grant" inquiry and have a written agreement with such organization in a form that is substantially the same as this Agreement. (Please let us know if you require more information on this procedure.)

Annual Report

The Nduna Foundation will provide to us written narrative and financial reports regarding the use of the grant funds and the progress that the Foundation has made toward accomplishing the charitable purposes of the grant. Each report will include a financial statement attested to by its responsible financial officer or independent accountant showing the grant funds and records of receipts and expenditures under the grant.

Such a report must be provided within a reasonable time after the conclusion of your yearly accounting period for every year in which the grant funds have been expended or retained, and in no case provided later than three months after the end of such year.

You also agree to provide, within a reasonable time after the conclusion of your yearly accounting period during which the use of the grant funds is completed, a final report with respect to all expenditures made from the grant and progress made toward the goals of the grant.

You also agree to provide to us copies of any other reports, publications or written material prepared in connection with the project funded by this grant and, upon our request, to provide any other report or information which we believe is necessary to keep us fully apprised of the status or use of the grant funds.

Although grant funds need not be physically separated, records of receipts and expenditures under the grant, as well as copies of the report furnished to us, should be kept available for our inspection until four years after the grant.
