

The faith-based Performing Arts Academy will provide opportunities that will enhance character, promote well-being, and inspire greatness by developing people through the Arts. The Academy desires to change lives by offering affordable, quality music education, positive theatre experiences, and an appreciation for the Arts.

The community and students will be encouraged to participate in small and large ensembles and theatrical opportunities. All teachers and staff at the Academy are to aspire to a level of excellence in teaching and performance.

The Academy will serve, primarily, Butler and Warren Counties, and surrounding communities. No participant will be denied study at the Academy due to socio-economic conditions. Financial aid or scholarships will be made available to those in need regardless of ethnic origin.

The Academy will sponsor special events and give public performances involving Academy participants as well as other performing groups from the area.

Form 990-EZ, Part III, Line 28 – Statement of Program Service Accomplishments

The Performing Arts Academy, in accordance with its mission statement, provided musical training and performance opportunities to numerous students during 2009. No students were denied study at the Academy due to socio-economic conditions. Student achievement was excellent as was the quality of the performances.

Music Lessons: During the year 2009 a total of 232 students received either private or group music lessons of voice, piano, guitar, clarinet, trumpet and percussion with degreed instructors.

Performance Opportunities: In the performance side of the PAA, the following activities were successfully undertaken. Rehearsals included voice and performance instruction.

“Circus, Circus” – 23 youth in grades 1-3 participated, rehearsing once a week for five months and performing one evening in June 2009 with 300 people in attendance.

“Peter Pan” – 28 youth in grades 4-6 participated, rehearsing once a week for five months and performing one evening in June 2009 with 394 people in attendance.

“You’re a Good Man, Charlie Brown” – 10 youth grades 4-6 and 9 youth in high school participated, rehearsing one evening a week for five months and performing two evenings in June 2009 with 213 people in attendance.

“Jungle Book” (summer program) – 34 youth in grades 4-6 participated, rehearsing Monday through Friday for three weeks and performing two evenings in June 2009. 524 people attended.

“Rats” (summer program) – 26 youth grades 1-3 participated, rehearsing Monday through Friday for two weeks and performing one evening in July 2009 with 197 people in attendance.

“Lemonade” – 32 youth grades 1-3 participated, rehearsing once a week for three months and performing one evening in November 2009. 296 people attended.

“Frosty” – 20 youth grades 4-6 participated, rehearsing 1-2 evenings a week for four months and performing two evenings in December 2009. 286 people attended.

“Nutcracker” – 28 youth grades 5-7 and 37 dancers grades 7-12 (members of The Academy of Dance Arts) participated, rehearsing two evenings a week for three months and performing three evenings in December 2009. 670 people were in attendance.
