Brady's Smile, Inc was organized exclusively for charitable purposes. Specifically, Brady's Smile, Inc. will promote, improve, protect and sustain the health, emotional well-being and social development of children in need, including children suffering from illness or disability, children at risk and under served children.

It is our goal to help in the following ways:

- 1) Help make life easier in the newborn and pediatric intensive care facilities for patients and their families;
- 2) Provide financial assistance to defray medical expenses; and
- 3) Establish and grant scholarships to educational institutions benefiting children in need.

Brady's Smile's programs serve patients in pediatric and newborn Intensive Care Units ("ICU") in 11 pediatric hospitals across 5 states

28. **Comfort Bags Program** – Our Comfort Bags program provides basic essentials to caregivers and toys to babies and children who are in the ICU of children's hospitals. Our bags include items such as toiletries, a pen, paper, snacks, stuffed animals and toys. They provide families with things that are not found in the hospital environment and help make their lives easier during their stay. During 2009, Brady's Smile distributed **2,323 comfort bags** to families in the ICU

29. **Brady Blankets Program** – Our Brady Blankets program provides homemade fleece blankets to babies and children during their time in the ICU. Fleece blankets help provide a "secure" feeling to babies and are very soft and snuggly. The blankets also provide a sense of home to many families.

During 2009, Brady's Smile distributed **1,663 blankets** to children in the ICU

30. **Meals by Matt and Annie Program** – Our Meals program provides home cooked dinners or lunch to children and their parents while in the ICU. Brady's Smile teams up with local restaurants and serves these meals. During 2009, Brady's Smile served **1,808 meals** to people in the ICU.

31 (1). **Smiles in a Box Program** – Our Smiles in a Box program provides children and their families a comfort bag, blanket and music, all delivered to their ICU bedside. This program gives Brady's Smile an opportunity to touch families who are not a part of their "hospital partnerships." During 2009, Brady's

Smile distributed **1 Smiles in a Box** program.

31 (2). Medical Defrayment Program – Our Medical Defrayment Program helps provide assistance to families that have large medical bills to pay that are not covered by insurance. Brady's Smile provides payments for items like glasses or therapy equipment to these families. During 2009, Brady's Smile helped **1 family** through this program. We will continue to build this program in 2010.

31 (3). Music in the ICU – Our Music in the ICU program provides cribside CD players and CDs to each cribside in the ICU. This program is implemented at our partnering pediatric hospitals and stays at each bedside for patients to enjoy during their stay. During 2009, Brady's Smile distributed **158 music players and 300 CDs** to partnering hospitals.
