**AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS
OF
THE VIBRANT VILLAGE FOUNDATION**

THIS AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS OF THE VIBRANT VILLAGE FOUNDATION (the "Corporation") is entered as of this 27 day of March, 2010, by and among the persons executing these Bylaws as Trustees.

WHEREAS, the articles of the Corporation were filed on July 7, 2009, pursuant to the Virginia Nonstock Corporation Act;

WHEREAS, KENNETH E. deLASKI is President and initial Trustee of the Corporation;

WHEREAS, KATHLEEN deLASKI GRUBB and CAROLYN STANDING were subsequently elected to the Board of Trustees on November 10, 2009;

WHEREAS, the Bylaws of the Corporation were certified by the President on November 12, 2009 (the "original Bylaws");

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 4 of Article V of the original Bylaws, the Bylaws may be altered, amended or replaced and new Bylaws adopted by two-thirds of the Board of Trustees at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose; and

WHEREAS, by meeting the Board of Trustees unanimously adopted a resolution to amend and restate the Bylaws of the Corporation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing, the Board of Trustees hereby amend and restate the Bylaws of the Corporation as follows:

ARTICLE I. TRUSTEES

Section 1. General Powers; Managing Trustee.

a. General Powers. Except as provided elsewhere herein, the business and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed under the direction of its Board of Trustees consisting initially of that individual or those individuals named in the Articles of Incorporation, and those individuals appointed and serving thereafter. In addition to the powers expressly conferred upon them by these Bylaws, the Board of Trustees may exercise all the powers of the Corporation. From time to time, the Board of Trustees may delegate to officers of the Corporation such powers and duties as it may see fit in addition to those specifically provided in these Bylaws.

b. Managing Trustee. KENNETH E. deLASKI shall be the Managing Trustee of the Board of Trustees. After the death, incapacity, or resignation of

KENNETH E. deLASKI, there shall be no Managing Trustee position. The Managing Trustee shall have the authority to add, elect, remove and replace a Trustee from and to the Board of Trustees, and the authority to appoint, remove and replace an officer of the Corporation, from time to time and for any reason, regardless of any remaining term in office.

Section 2. Number, Tenure and Election.

a. Number. The number of Trustees may, in the sole discretion of the Managing Trustee, or if there is no Managing Trustee, by vote of a majority of the entire Board of Trustees, be decreased to not less than one (1) or increased to a number not exceeding fifteen (15).

b. Tenure. Each Trustee shall hold office for a term of three (3) year(s) and until a successor shall have been elected and qualify. Notwithstanding the foregoing, upon the Managing Trustee's death, SARAH E. GORACKE, DAPHNE JEAN deLASKI, and DANA NANCY deLASKI, upon election to the Board of Trustees, shall each have a lifetime tenure on the Board of Trustees, subject to Section 9.

c. Election. The Board of Trustees shall be elected by the Managing Trustee, in the Managing Trustee's sole discretion, from time to time. If there is no Managing Trustee, the Board of Trustees shall be elected by the Trustees holding office from time to time, provided that upon the Managing Trustee's death, DAPHNE JEAN deLASKI, and DANA NANCY deLASKI, if, or upon reaching, age twenty-eight (28) shall be automatically elected to the Board of Trustees, subject to Section 9.

Section 3. Regular Meetings.

A regular annual meeting of the Board of Trustees shall be held during the month of November in each year, on a day and at a time and place to be determined by the President or the Trustees. Other regular meetings shall be held on such dates and at such times as may be designated from time to time by the President or by the Trustees. The Board of Trustees shall keep minutes of its meetings and a full account of its transactions.

Section 4. Special Meetings.

Special meetings of the Board of Trustees may be called by the President or by any one Trustee.

Section 5. Place of Meetings.

The Board of Trustees may hold its regular and special meetings at such place within or without the Commonwealth of Virginia as it may from time to time determine. In the absence of such determination, regular and special meetings of the Board of Trustees shall be held at the principal business office of the Corporation.

Section 6. Notice.

Notice of the place, day and hour of every regular and special meeting shall be given to each Trustee:

a. By notice in writing mailed, postage prepaid, not later than the third day before the day set for the meeting and addressed to the Trustee's last known post office address according to the records of the Corporation;

b. By electronic or telephonic communication or by notice in writing delivered personally or left at the Trustee's residence or usual place of business not later than the second day before the day set for the meeting.

No notice of the time, place or purpose of any meeting need be given to any Trustee who, in writing executed and filed with the records of the meeting either before or after the holding thereof, waives such notice or who attends the meeting.

Section 7. Quorum.

A majority of the Board of Trustees shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at every meeting; but if at any meeting there be less than a quorum present, a majority of those present may adjourn the meeting from time to time, but not for a period in excess of 30 days, without notice other than by announcement at the meeting, until a quorum shall attend. At any such adjourned meeting at which a quorum shall be present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally called. Except as otherwise provided in the Charter or these Bylaws, the action of a majority of the Trustees present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the action of the Board of Trustees.

Section 8. Vacancies.

Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Trustees or created by an increase in the number of Trustees may be filled by the Managing Trustee, or if there is no Managing Trustee, by a majority of the remaining Trustees. A Trustee elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of the predecessor in office, if such predecessor held a definite term of years.

Section 9. Resignation and Removal.

a. Resignation. A Trustee may resign at any time by notifying the President or Secretary of the Corporation in writing, specifying the effective date of the resignation. If no effective date is specified, such resignation shall take immediate effect.

b. Removal. The Managing Trustee may remove any Trustee from the Board of Trustees in the Managing Trustee's sole discretion. If there is no Managing Trustee, at any meeting of the Trustees called for a purpose, any Trustee other than SARAH E. GORACKE, DAPHNE JEAN deLASKI, and DANA NANCY deLASKI may, by vote of a majority of the other Trustees, be removed from office, with or without cause, and another may be elected in the place of the person so removed to serve for the remainder of the term. If there is no Managing Trustee, SARAH E. GORACKE, DAPHNE JEAN deLASKI and/or DANA NANCY deLASKI may be removed if the Board of Trustees determines by a majority vote that such person's present behavior is substantially detrimental to the Corporation including circumstances involving her addiction or any other significant mental disability, illegal activities, or incarceration.

Section 10. Compensation.

Trustees shall receive no compensation for their services as such but may, by resolution of the Board of Trustees, be allowed reimbursement for their expenses actually and reasonably incurred on behalf of the Corporation.

Section 11. Informal Action by Trustees.

Any action of the Trustees may be taken without a meeting if a consent in writing setting forth the action taken is signed or given by electronic transmission by all Trustees and filed in paper or electronic form with the minutes of the Corporation.

Section 12. Telephone Conference.

Members of the Board of Trustees or any committee thereof may participate in a meeting of the Board of Trustees or such committee by means of a conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meetings can hear each other at the same time and participation by such means shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

ARTICLE II. OFFICERS

Section 1. In General.

The officers of the Corporation shall consist of a President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, and whenever deemed advisable by the Managing Trustee or, if there is no Managing Trustee, by the Board of Trustees, one or more Vice-Presidents, Assistant Secretaries, or Assistant Treasurers.

The President shall be chosen from among the Trustees. Any two offices, except those of President and Vice-President, may be held by the same person, but no officer shall execute, acknowledge or verify any instrument in more than one capacity, when such instrument is required to be executed, acknowledged or verified by any two or more officers. All officers shall hold their offices for a term of one (1) year and until their successors shall be elected and qualify. The Managing Trustee, or if there is no Managing Trustee, the Board of Trustees, may from time to time appoint such other agents and employees, with such powers and duties as the Board of Trustees may deem proper.

Section 2. President.

The President shall be the Chief Executive Officer of the Corporation and shall, when present, preside at all meetings of the Trustees. The President shall have general management and direction of the activities of the Corporation and all powers ordinarily exercised by the president of a corporation, shall have authority to employ an administrator or other persons at salaries fixed by resolution of the Board of Trustees to assist in the general management and direction of the activities of the Corporation, and shall have authority to sign and execute, in the name of the Corporation, all deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts or other instruments to be executed on the Corporation's behalf.

Section 3. Vice-President.

In the absence of the President or in the event of his or her inability or refusal to act, the Vice-President (if any, or in the event there be more than one Vice-President, the Vice-Presidents in the order of their election or designated seniority) shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting, shall have and may exercise all the powers of the President. Any Vice-President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the President or by the Board of Trustees.

Section 4. Secretary.

The Secretary shall keep minutes of the meetings of the Board of Trustees, see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these Bylaws or as required by law, be custodian of the corporate records and of the seal of the Corporation, and in general perform all duties incident to the office of secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the President or by the Board of Trustees.

Section 5. Treasurer.

If required by the Board of Trustees, the Treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of the duties of the office in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Trustees shall determine, the cost of which shall be borne by the Corporation. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of all funds and securities of the Corporation, receive and give receipts for monies due to the Corporation, and deposit all such monies in the name of the Corporation in such banks or other depositories as shall from time to time be selected by the Board of Trustees. In general, the Treasurer shall perform all the duties incident to the office of treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned by the President or by the Board of Trustees.

Section 6. Assistant Officers.

Each Assistant Secretary and Assistant Treasurer (if any) shall hold office for such period and shall have such authority and perform such duties as the Board of Trustees may prescribe.

Section 7. Compensation.

No officers shall receive any compensation for their services as such but may, by resolution of the Board of Trustees, be allowed reimbursement for their expenses, actually and reasonably incurred on behalf of the Corporation.

Section 8. Resignation and Removal.

An officer may resign at any time by notifying the President or Secretary of the Corporation in writing specifying the effective date of the resignation. If no effective date is specified, the resignation shall take immediate effect. The Managing Trustee, or if there is no Managing Trustee, the Board of Trustees, shall have the power to set the term of any officer and at any regular or special meeting to remove any officer with or without cause. The Managing Trustee, or if there is no Managing Trustee, the Board of Trustees, may authorize any officer to remove subordinate officers.

Section 9. Vacancies.

The Managing Trustee, or if there is no Managing Trustee, the Board of Trustees, at any regular or special meeting shall have the power to fill a vacancy occurring in any officership.

ARTICLE III. COMMITTEES

Section 1. Executive Committee of Trustees.

The Board of Trustees, by resolution adopted by a majority of the Trustees in office, may designate from among its members an Executive Committee consisting of such number of Trustees as may be specified in the resolution, which Committee, to the extent provided in such resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Trustees in the management of the Corporation, except that such Committee shall have no authority to amend, alter, or repeal the Bylaws; to elect, appoint or remove any Trustee or officer of the Corporation; or to approve any charter document required to be filed with the State Corporation Commission of Virginia.

Section 2. Other Committees.

The Board of Trustees may by resolution constitute and appoint such other committees to perform such other duties and functions as the Board of Trustees may deem appropriate.

Section 3. Term of Office.

Each member of every committee shall continue in office at the pleasure of the Board of Trustees.

Section 4. Chairman.

One member of each committee shall be appointed chairman, either directly by the Board of Trustees or in such other manner as the Board of Trustees may prescribe.

Section 5. Quorum.

Unless otherwise provided in the resolution of the Board of Trustees designating a committee, a majority of the whole committee shall constitute a quorum and the act of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the committee.

Section 6. Rules.

Each committee may adopt rules for its own governance not inconsistent with the Articles of Incorporation, with these Bylaws, with rules adopted by the Board of Trustees, or with any applicable law of the Commonwealth of Virginia.

ARTICLE IV. CONTRACTS, CHECKS, DEPOSITS AND GIFTS

Section 1. Contracts.

The Board of Trustees may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation, in addition to the officers so authorized by these Bylaws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

Section 2. Checks, Drafts, Etc.

All checks, drafts or orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Corporation, shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the Corporation, and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Trustees.

Section 3. Deposits.

All funds of the Corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Corporation in such banks or other depositories as the Board of Trustees may select.

Section 4. Gifts.

The Board of Trustees may accept on behalf of the Corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Corporation.

ARTICLE V. SUNDRY PROVISIONS

Section 1. Fiscal Year.

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be the calendar year unless some other fiscal year be specified by resolution of the Board of Trustees.

Section 2. Seal.

The seal of the Corporation shall be circular in form with the name of the Corporation inscribed around the outer edge, and in the center shall be inscribed the word "Virginia" and the year of incorporation.

Section 3. Indemnification.

To the maximum extent permitted by the Virginia Nonstock Corporation Act and the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as from time to time amended, the Corporation shall indemnify its currently acting and its former Trustees, officers, agents and employees.

Section 4. Amendments to Bylaws.

These Bylaws may be altered, amended or repealed and new Bylaws may be adopted, by the Managing Trustee, in the Managing Trustee's sole discretion, or if there is no Managing Trustee, by two-thirds of the entire Board of Trustees at any regular meeting or at any special meeting called for that purpose.

Section 5. Signed Counterparts.

This instrument may be, but need not be, executed in counterparts, and each counterpart is to be an original of this instrument, but all counterparts taken together shall be deemed one and the same instrument.

WE, the Board of Trustees hereby amend and restate the provisions of the Bylaws of the Corporation, as set forth herein.
