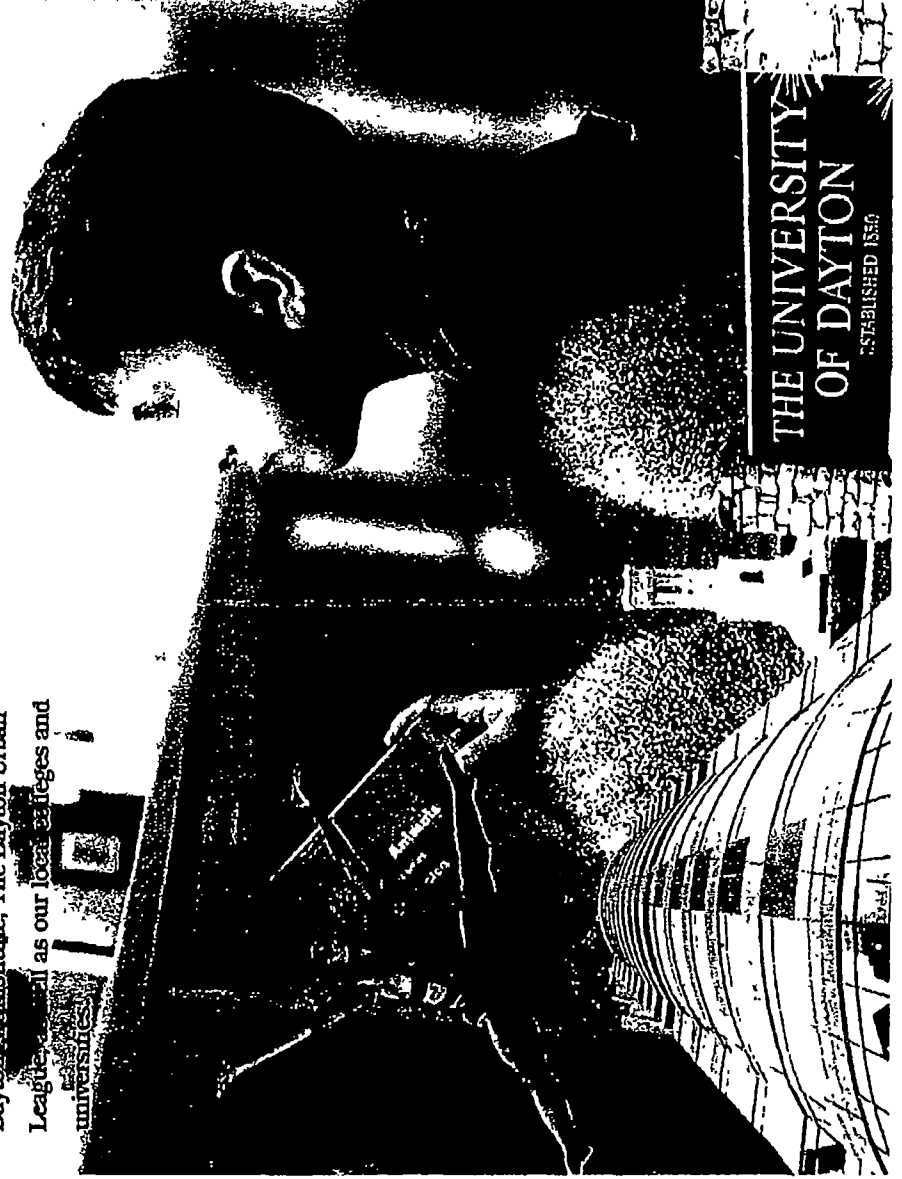

2. Overall community support.
3. Financial viability and health of the organization.
4. Past DP&L Foundation support.

The Foundation does not generally fund:

1. Individuals.
2. Religious organizations.
3. National organizations outside of West Central Ohio.
4. Other foundations.
5. Capital campaigns.
6. Endowment or developmental funds.
7. Fraternal, labor or veteran organizations.
8. Hospital operating needs.
9. Sports leagues.
10. Telephone or mass mail solicitation.

Contributions are planned annually so submitting a request as far in advance as possible is recommended.

Applying for DP&L Foundation Support

There is no formal application form.

Requests should be made in writing and include:

- A description of the organization's history, structure, purpose and the program or project for which support is needed.
- Status and results of programs previously funded by The DP&L Foundation.
- A list of other donors and the level of support received or requested.
- A copy of the IRS ruling classifying the organization as tax exempt [section 501 (c) (3)] and not a private foundation [section 509 (a)] of the 1954 IRS Code as amended.
- A copy of the organization's most recent Form 990.
- An independent financial audit.
- A financial budget.
- Sources of income.
- Expenditures by program, administration and fundraising.
