Company Spirit - Reynolds College Scholarships

The Reynolds and Reynolds Honor Scholarships for Achievement and Recognition (often referred to as SHARP) provide college tuition assistance for the dependent children of Reynolds associates. The scholarships are funded through the Reynolds and Reynolds Company Foundation.

Guidelines:

The Reynolds Company Foundation provides two types of scholarships:

- \$1,500 non-renewable awards (non-renewed recipients may reapply to the program each year they meet eligibility requirements), and
- \$2,500 renewable awards that recipients may receive for up to four years based on consistent academic achievement.

(Note: Awards are for undergraduate study only. Students cannot receive an award more than four years.)

Eligibility:

The program is open to dependent children of full-time associates of The Reynolds and Reynolds Company (U.S. and Canada) who have been with the company one full year as of March 15, 2010. Applicants must be students who are enrolled or planning to enroll in a full-time course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college, university, or vocational technical school.

Selection Procedure:

The award process is independently managed by ScholarshipAmerica, a national student aid service organization. ScholarshipAmerica reviews all applications and selects the recipients. All awards are made without regard to race, creed, color, sex, religion or national origin.

The following criteria are considered in the selection process:

- Academic achievement and potential (test scores, class ranking, GPA)
- Extracurricular school and community activities, including work experience
- Written statement of goals and aspirations
- Unusual personal or family circumstances
- Applicant Appraisal (Note: Financial need will not be considered.)

Application Procedure:

To apply, students must complete an <u>application form</u> and mail to ScholarshipAmerica along with an official high school or college transcript. The application and supporting materials must be postmarked no later than March 15, 2010.

Applicants are responsible for gathering and submitting all information necessary to the application process. ScholarshipAmerica reserves the right not to process applications found to be incomplete as of the application deadline. All applications are treated confidentially.
