Part III, Line 8 The Medicare allowable cost reported in the UHS Medicare Cost report, as reflected in the amount reported in Part III, li 6, is derived from the actual expense data from the UHS general ledger UHS allocates those expenses to patients at the procedure level based on a cost to charge ratio The shortfall of \$3,582,158 as reported in Part III, line 7, should be treated as a community benefit because absent the Medicare program, it is likely many of the individuals would qualify for charity care or other needs-based government programs accepting payment below cost to treat these individuals, the burdens of government are relieved with respect to these individuals. If Revenue ruling 69-545, which established the community benefit standard for nonprofit hospitals, states that if a hospital serves patient with government health benefits, including Medicare, then this is an indication that the hospital operates to promote the health of the community. Also, there is a significant possibility that continued reduction in reimbursement may actually create difficulties in access these individuals, and the amount spent to cover the Medicare shortfall is money not available to cover charity care and other community benefit needs.

The organization's collection policy contains provisions on the collection practices to be followed for patients who are known to qualify for charity care or financial assistance. The organization maintains collection practices that apply to all patients, charity care and non-charity care patients, consistently and fairly regardless of insurance status. Practices include no abusive phone calls Financial counselors diligently work with patients and evaluate new information learned during the collection process to determine if collection activities should be ceased or if the patient qualifies for financial assistance.
