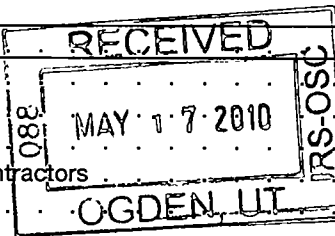

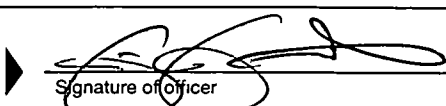

Part III: Statement of Program Service Accomplishments**Our Primary Exempt Purpose**

OneWay Ministries exists to advance the gospel of Jesus Christ around the world.

Line 28 Our **International Ministries** program aims to partner cross-culturally with Christians in other nations in an effort to train Christian leaders and advance the gospel globally. *This program service includes foreign grants.*

In the year 2009, through our grant giving, we provided financial support for full-time missionaries Ray and Cynthia Mensah in Botswana. The Mensahs evangelize, church plant, minister to local pastors, and co-ordinate and teach at the Livingstone School of Missions.

We sent two teams of short term missionaries to partner with our co-workers, Ray and Cynthia Mensah, in Botswana. The team that went in March was comprised of over twenty college athletes who worked alongside the missionary team in Botswana to run sports camps and share the gospel message with children and adolescents in the Maun area.

The team that travelled to Botswana in June boosted the missions training work of Ray Mensah and his team of full-time missionaries as they led the Livingstone School of Missions. This training school is spearheaded by Mr. Mensah and accomplishes the purpose of training young adults to confidently and accurately bring the message of the gospel of Jesus Christ to the many villages situated in the northern region of Botswana. The short term missionaries who joined with Mr. Mensah aided in teaching and leading worship.

A third short term missions trip was taken in July to help gather resources for our Prayercast ministry (see below). The team traveled throughout Europe recording the prayers of missionaries throughout the continent, as well as recording video images to accompany the prayers.

Total International Ministries Expenses**\$138,852**

Line 29 Our **OneWay Studios** program is a media facility dedicated to the creation of media tools that will advance the gospel through evangelism, teaching and worship. We also aim to train young people in studio ministry.

In 2009, we recorded a worship album, "Shine." It served as a gift to regular donors and also as a resource others could receive when they donated to the ministry. The album was also distributed to missionaries stationed throughout the world as an encouragement to them as they serve in the name of Jesus Christ.

We developed two ministries within OneWay Studios in 2009. The first is Prayercast. Prayercast (www.prayercast.com) seeks to coordinate and activate world-changing prayer. Our hope is that souls would be saved as the community of Christians around

the world unites in prayer. Prayercast harnesses the fluidity of the internet with the strategic use of media, music and prayer. In 2009, we produced over 20 prayercasts.

The second ministry developed under OneWay Studios is OneVoice. OneVoice exists to record and widely distribute the Bible via audio content from people groups to their own peoples. It is estimated that over 60% of the world's population do not read. OneVoice aims to meet this need by recording on and distributing portable audio devices containing the gospel message of Jesus Christ. We distributed approximately 400 OneVoice units in Botswana in 2009.

As part of the OneWay Studios program, we organized a concert in December of 2009 as a means of gathering the friends and family of OneWay Ministries for a time of worship.
