

The criteria used to determine scholarship acceptance is basis on the information contained in your scholarship application and other pertinent data available. This determination is based on information supplied by each applicant along with other factors gathered by the Shunk Scholarship Committee. If, in the opinion of the Scholarship Committee, any of the above factors change during the time the recipient is enrolled in the scholarship program, then the scholarship may be rescinded.

THE SCHOLARSHIP IS NOT AUTOMATICALLY RENEWED EACH YEAR.

Whether the applicant continues the scholarship privilege will be determined by the Scholarship Committee providing the applicant agrees to and carries out the following stipulations:

- 1) To make arrangements to see the Contact Person at LEAST ONCE A YEAR;
- 2) To notify the Shunk Association that the applicant intends to return to college each fall for the length of the scholarship or until a baccalaureate or associate degree is obtained, whichever comes first.
- 3) Keep the Shunk Association informed, periodically about school progress;
- 4) See that a copy of the applicant's transcript is sent to the Shunk Association after EACH grading period;
- 5) Notify the Shunk Association immediately if the applicant decides to discontinue his/her college career;
- 6) Notify the Shunk Association immediately if the applicant does not need further financial assistance.

There are no stipulations concerning a required point average. It is felt if your grades are acceptable to the college or university attended, the grades will be acceptable to the Shunk Association. If, however, the applicant is suspended from school FOR ANY REASON, including grades, the scholarship is automatically terminated and will not be reinstated. The applicant may, however, re-apply by securing another application and submitting it again through the guidance counselors of the applicant's high school.

When it is necessary for the applicant to send a large amount of money to the college or university, the Contact Person should be notified either by phone or by letter to the address and phone number listed above. A check will be sent or the applicant may come and pick it up. If we have not had our annual interview the check MUST be picked up. In other words, no interview, no grades sent, no check!!

The check will be MADE PAYABLE TO THE COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY the applicant will attend. IT WILL NOT BE MADE PAYABLE TO ANY INDIVIDUAL.

The scholarship may be used for fees, tuition, books etc. Scholarship assistance may be used in order that the recipient may attend any ACCREDITED college or university.

The recipient may receive financial assistance from other sources providing that assistance does not equal the total cost of the year's expenses at the recipients chosen college or university. In other words, if the recipient is offered a "full scholarship" then the Shunk Association's scholarship will not be awarded. The recipient should understand, however, that receiving the Shunk Association scholarship could, in some cases, hinder or decrease other sources of financial assistance.
