Ronald McDonald House Charities, Inc. (RMHC) has no paid employees. Instead, RMHC relies on unpaid full-time volunteers to run the day-to-day operations of the Charity, as well as numerous other volunteers who assist with various fundraising events and other administrative and program support. The number of volunteers varies at any given time, but RMHC estimates the total number of volunteers to be approximately 100.

(Continued) - Support of Local RMHC Chapters worldwide.

Ronald McDonald House Program Support --- The Ronald McDonald House is a home away from home for families of ill children while being treated at nearby hospitals. In 2009, volunteer field liaisons of RMHC provided ongoing support, including updated program development guidelines for 294 Ronald McDonald Houses, in development or currently in operations by our Local Chapters around the world. In addition, RMHC provided \$1,352,006 in grants for new and expanding Ronald McDonald House programs and for ongoing operational support.

Ronald McDonald Care Mobile Program Support --- In addition to primary and specialty medical care, the Ronald McDonald Care Mobile may provide health education and oral health services, and link children to other community and social service resources. In 2009, RMHC provided cash and non-cash grants, totaling \$1,989,084, that helped to launch four new Ronald McDonald Care Mobile Programs in: Plainfield VT, Cleveland OH, and two in Arkansas. Volunteer field liaisons of RMHC continue to provide support to 39 locally run programs in the United States, New Zealand, Poland, Argentina and El Salvador, providing them with training and updated resource materials.

Ronald McDonald Family Rooms --- In 2009, RMHC provided \$189,109 to launch five new program Ronald McDonald Family Rooms outside the U.S and provided matching funds to run five programs in the

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United States.

In addition, in the U.S., RMHC provided support for two additional programs. First, RMHC directly matches U.S. Local Chapter grants made to local children's organizations thereby increasing the availability and scope of services provided to children throughout the United States. In 2009, these community focused matching grants totaled \$3,247,331. Second, RMHC provided matching grant funds totaling \$1,520,682 that increased secondary educational scholarship funds for Local RMHC Chapter run scholarship programs.

The Board retains the services of an independent CPA firm to review the organization's Form 990 before it is filed with the IRS. Certain management services, such as financial, fundraising and program services are donated free of charge by employees of McDonald's Corporation. In 2009, the total value of the free services and office space was \$3,572,962, of which \$3,578,447 was provided by McDonald's Corporation. RMHC received additional donated services from other donors totaling \$99,538. For tax purposes, the value of donated services and facilities must be excluded from Part VIII and Part IX, and Schedule M of the Form 990.

The Siffermann Group (TSG) was engaged by RMHC in a one year extension of its contract to assist RMHC's independently incorporated U.S. Local Chapters in improving their respective donation box fundraiser. TSG primarily provided counsel on implementation of a new drive thru donation box canister placed in participating McDonald's restaurants. TSG was responsible for providing project management services, coordinating various vendors, and ensuring quality throughout the process. The result of this program is to help build fundraising capacity of Local Chapters, while enhancing security features through the new donation box (namely that funds are collected inside the building by a third party vendor selected and engaged directly by the Local Chapter). Each local RMHC Chapter is responsible for collecting and accounting for donation box proceeds in its own financial statements and federal tax returns. No donation box proceeds are received or collected by TSG. On the advice of outside counsel, in certain states, the services provided by TSG meet the definition of a Professional Fundraising Consultant or Counsel. To the best of RMHC's knowledge, both RMHC and TSG comply with all individual state filing requirements that pertain to engagement of TSG's service in those states on an annual basis. Per TSG's contract, RMHC has agreed to reimburse TSG for all out-of-pocket travel expenditures. In 2009, the additional out-of-pocket travel reimbursements totaled \$26,854, which in accordance with IRS instructions for completing Form 990, Part IX - are excluded from Line 11e and included on Line 24a.

RMHC also engaged the services of Stelter Company, a Professional Fundraising Consulting Company to assist RMHC in establishing a long-term planned giving donation program. The nature of planned giving is that the time frame for receipt of the donation may be years into the future. Therefore, a current snapshot of gross receipts raised through this activity may not accurately reflect the success of the program. RMHC has started to develop a number of donor prospects for future

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planned gifts from the initiation of this program. We believe that this activity is important to the future funding requirements of RMHC, which will allow RMHC to remain active in the future. Contract terms provided for flat fees for consultation services, as well as out-of-pocket travel reimbursements. In addition to their consultation fees, RMHC paid Stelter for all planned giving print materials. In 2009, payments for out-of-pocket costs and print materials produced totaled \$25,179.

In 2009, RMHC conducted two raffles solely within the State of Illinois. The State of Illinois does not issue charitable raffle licenses. Rather, the State of Illinois delegates this responsibility to either the local municipality or, in some cases, the county level of government. RMHC applied for, and received, one raffle license from the Village of Oak Brook, IL, and one raffle license from the City of Schaumburg, IL. In both cases, the raffles conducted complied with all regulations. The proceeds from both events supported the charitable purposes of RMHC.

Note 16: Form 990, Schedule L Transactions With Interested Persons, Part II - Loans To and/or From Interested Persons

Effective January 22, 2002, McDonald's Corporation made available to RMHC an interest free line of credit in the amount of \$5,000,000. As of December 31, 2009, \$3,400,000 was borrowed and is outstanding.
