

## **Allocation of Costs Between Programs, Program Descriptions, and Program Accomplishments in 2009:**

### **Program I: Public Policy Initiatives and Market Based Solutions (25%)**

The Center for Sustainable Economy helps communities, public agencies, and businesses develop land use, economic development, and management plans and policies that protect and restore natural areas, reduce carbon emissions, bolster economic welfare, and enhance social equity. We have worked with forest and wildlands protection organizations throughout the United States to design map-based reserve systems based on principles of conservation biology as well as economic transition plans based on ecological restoration. We have worked with neighborhood coalitions and community groups to develop and promote ordinances for protection of open space and scenic corridors, affordable housing, and living wages. We have worked with community organizations to identify and implement policies that promote local self reliance.

#### Accomplishments in 2009 include:

- **Washington State Department of Ecology (DOE) Industrial Footprint Project.** CSE completed its work with Earth Economics to design an Industrial Footprint sustainability scoring system for use by DOE to encourage energy conservation, water conservation, local purchasing, and other sustainability initiatives by pulp and paper mills.

### **Program II: Analyzing the Benefits and Costs of Natural Resource Management Decisions (25%)**

CSE's economists help expose the true costs associated with both public and private sector decisions to deplete natural capital, exacerbate sprawl, and increase air and water pollution. Conversely, we document the true benefits associated with protection of natural areas, ecological restoration, and other sustainable land management activities. Because many of these benefits and costs are not experienced as market transactions, we employ a range of techniques for assessing non-market impacts in addition to more traditional techniques such as regional modeling that consider effects on jobs and income.

To inform our economic analysis, CSE works with biologists, environmental planners, hydrologists, and geographic information specialists to document the direct, indirect, and cumulative environmental impacts of intensive land uses such as logging, grazing, mining, oil and gas leasing, road building, and urban development. We also work with counties, cities, and businesses to calculate and identify measures they can take to reduce their ecological footprint.

#### Accomplishments in 2009 include:

- **Coal to liquids.** CSE completed work on an economic critique of plans to develop a coal to liquids industry in Alaska. The work was completed for the Northern Alaska Environmental Center.

- **Izembek Road Project.** CSE began work with The Wilderness Society to critique the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service's Environmental Impact Statement for the Izembek Road Project. Under direction from Congress, USFWS is considering a land exchange and road project that would traverse the heart of the Izembek National Wildlife Refuge in southwest Alaska.
- **Forest restoration economics.** Working with Restoration Technologies Group, CSE published a model net public benefits analysis of proposed forest restoration activities in the Signal Peak area on the Gila National Forest in New Mexico. The analysis serves as a framework for quantifying the economic benefits and impacts of restoration forestry.

### **Program III: Sustainability On-Line (50%)**

Center for Sustainable Economy has teamed up with award-winning web developer Kinga Dow Productions and other non-profit partners to provide interactive tools for government, business, and educators seeking to utilize the vast power of the web to promote sustainable decision making and advance environmental education. We offer four major categories of on-line solutions: footprint calculators to promote green products, sustainability challenges for branches, franchises, or chains, on-line courses and interactive lesson plans, and sustainability reporting and company green pages.

#### Accomplishments in 2009 include:

- **San Jose State Ecological Footprint Challenge.** CSE developed a first of a kind ecological footprint challenge for students at San Jose State University. The challenge adapted our international ecological footprint quiz for use by students who took the quiz twice during the course of the 2009 – 2010 school year. Results were stored on a back end database capable of showing how scores improved over time and what choices students made to each of the 27 questions. The University is using the quiz to promote its campus wide sustainability initiatives.
- **Finnish Public Broadcasting (YLE) Footprint Quiz.** YLE contracted with CSE for a customized version of our international ecological footprint quiz to promote sustainable lifestyle choices by its listeners throughout Finland.
