BY-LAWS

OF

DR. SCHOLL FOUNDATION

ARTICLE I

Purposes and Powers

The purposes of the corporation as stated in its Articles of Incorporation are exclusively charitable within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

The corporation also has such powers as are now or may hereafter be granted by the General Not-For-Profit Corporation Act of the State of Illinois.

ARTICLE II

Offices

The corporation shall have and continuously maintain in the State of Illinois a registered office and a registered agent whose office is identical with such registered office, and may have other offices within or without the State of Illinois as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

ARTICLE III

No Members

SECTION 1. The corporation shall have no members.

ARTICLE IV

Board of Directors

SECTION 1. GENERAL POWERS. The affairs of the corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors.

SECTION 2. NUMBER, TENURE, AND QUALIFICATIONS.

The number of directors shall be no less than seven nor more than eleven and shall be divided into three classes, each class to be as nearly equal as possible. Directors shall serve for terms of three years, and one class of directors shall be elected at each annual meeting of the corporation. Each director shall hold office until the annual meeting in the year in which his or her term expires and until his or her successor shall have been elected and qualified. Directors need not be residents of the State of Illinois or of the United States.

SECTION 3. RESIGNATION; REMOVAL. A director may resign at any time by written notice delivered to the President or Secretary of the corporation. A director may be removed, with or without cause, by the affirmative vote of a majority of directors then in office at a meeting of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 4. REGULAR MEETINGS. The annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held either within

or without the State of Illinois on such date and at such time and place in either the month of February or March as may be fixed by the Board of Directors, for the purpose of electing directors and for the transaction of such other business as may come before the meeting.

The Board of Directors may provide by resolution the date, time and place, either within or without the State of Illinois, for holding of additional regular meetings of the Board of Directors.

SECTION 5. SPECIAL MEETINGS. Special meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by or at the request of the Chairman, the President or any two directors. The person or persons authorized to call special meetings of the Board may fix any place, either within or without the State of Illinois, as the place for holding any special meeting of the Board called by them.

SECTION 6. NOTICE. Notice of any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors shall be given at least five (5) days prior thereto; provided that notice of a meeting called for the purpose of removing a director shall be given at least twenty (20) days prior thereto. Notice shall be delivered personally or sent by express mail, courier, facsimile or email to each director at his or her address as shown by the records of the corporation. Notice shall be deemed given by facsimile or e-mail at the time of

transmission, and by express mail or courier at the time of delivery to the recipient's address.

Any director may waive notice of any meeting. The attendance of a director at any meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

Neither the business to be transacted at, nor the purpose of, any regular or special meeting of the Board need be specified in the notice or waiver of notice of such meeting, unless specifically required by law or these by-laws.

SECTION 7. QUORUM. A majority of the Board of Directors shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business at any meeting of the Board, provided that if less than a majority of the directors are present at said meeting, a majority of the directors present may adjourn the meeting from time to time without further notice.

SECTION 8. MANNER OF ACTING. The act of a majority of the directors present at a meeting at which a quorum is present shall be the act of the Board of Directors, except where otherwise provided by law or these by-laws.

SECTION 9. VACANCIES. Any vacancy occurring in the Board of Directors or any directorship to be filled by reason of an increase in the number of directors, shall be filled by the Board of Directors. A director

elected to fill a vacancy shall be elected for the unexpired term of his or her predecessor in office.

SECTION 10. COMPENSATION. Directors as such may receive reasonable compensation and reasonable expenses for each meeting of the Board of Directors attended and for the rendition of other services to the corporation. The amount of such compensation shall be determined from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors. No director shall be prevented from receiving such compensation by reason of being an officer.

SECTION 11. MANDATORY RETIREMENT. Upon reaching his or her seventy-fifth birthday, a director shall not be eligible for reelection to the Board of Directors; provided, however, that in special situations as determined by the Board of Directors a director may be exempt from mandatory retirement and may be reelected on an annual basis.

SECTION 12. DIRECTOR EMERITUS. The Board of Directors may elect one or more persons to the position of Director Emeritus; such a Director Emeritus may attend regular meetings of the Board of Directors but shall have no vote at said meetings.

SECTION 13. ACTION WITHOUT A MEETING. Any action required by law or these by-laws to be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors, or any other action which may be taken at a meeting of the Board of Directors, may be taken without a meeting, if a consent in writing setting forth the action so taken shall be signed by all directors entitled to vote in respect of

the subject matter thereof. Such consent shall have the same force and effect as a unanimous vote and may be stated as such in any document filed with the Secretary of State under the General Not-for-Profit Corporation Act of Illinois.

SECTION 14. PARTICIPATION AND COMMUNICATION IN MEETINGS. Directors entitled to vote may participate in and act at any meeting through the use of a conference telephone or video or communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can communicate with each other. Participation in such meeting shall constitute attendance and presence in person at the meeting of the person so participating.

SECTION 15. COMMITTEES OF DIRECTORS. The Board of Directors, by resolution adopted by a majority of the directors in office, may designate and appoint one or more committees, each of which shall consist of two or more directors, which committees, to the extent provided in said resolution and as permitted by law, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management of the corporation; but the designation of such committees and the delegation thereto of authority shall not operate to relieve the Board of Directors, or any individual Director, of any responsibility imposed upon it or them by law.

ARTICLE V

Officers

SECTION 1. OFFICERS. The officers of the corporation shall be a Chairman of the Board, a President, one or more Vice-Presidents (the number thereof to be determined by the Board of Directors), a Treasurer, a Secretary and such other officers as may be elected in accordance with the provisions of this article. Board of Directors may elect such other officers, including one or more Assistant Secretaries and one or more Assistant Treasurers, as it shall deem desirable, such officers to have the authority to perform the duties prescribed, from time to time, by the Board of Directors. The Chairman and President shall be elected from among the corporation's directors, and other officers may, but need not, be directors. Any two or more offices may be held by the same person, except the offices of President and Secretary.

SECTION 2. ELECTION AND TERM OF OFFICE. The officers of the corporation shall be elected annually by the Board of Directors at the regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors. If the election of officers shall not be held at such meeting, such election shall be held as soon thereafter as convenient. Vacancies may be filled or new offices created and filled at any meeting of the Board of Directors. Each officer shall hold office until their successor shall have been duly elected and shall have qualified.

SECTION 3. RESIGNATION; REMOVAL. An officer may resign at any time by written notice delivered to the President or Secretary of the corporation. Any officer or agent elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed, with or without cause, by the Board of Directors whenever in its judgment the best interests of the corporation would be served thereby, but such removal shall be without prejudice to the contract rights, if any, of the person so removed.

SECTION 4. VACANCIES. A vacancy in any office because of death, resignation, removal, disqualification or otherwise, may be filled by the Board of Directors for the unexpired portion of the term.

SECTION 5. COMPENSATION. The Board of Directors shall have authority to establish reasonable compensation of all officers for their services to the corporation. The amount of such compensation shall be determined from time to time by resolution of the Board of Directors. No officer shall be prevented from receiving such compensation by reason of being a director.

SECTION 6. CHAIRMAN. The Chairman of the Board shall have authority to determine the agenda for meetings of the Board of Directors and, when present, shall preside at such meetings. The Chairman shall maintain contact with the President and with the corporation's affairs and shall bring to the Board's attention any matter that he or she believes requires Board attention.

SECTION 7. PRESIDENT. The President shall be the principal executive officer of the corporation and shall, in general, supervise and control all of the business and affairs of the corporation. In the Chairman's absence, the President shall preside at Board meetings.

The President may sign with the Secretary or other proper officer of the corporation authorized by the Board of Directors, any deeds, mortgages, bonds, contracts, or other instruments which the Board of Directors have authorized to be executed, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors or these by-laws or by statute to some other officer or agent of the corporation; and, in general, shall perform all duties incident to the office of President and such other duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Directors from time to time.

SECTION 8. VICE-PRESIDENT. In the absence of the President, or in the event of his or her inability or refusal to act, the Vice-President (or in the event there be more than one Vice-President, the Vice-President in the order of their election) shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President. Any Vice-President shall perform such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President or by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 9. TREASURER. If required by the Board of Directors, the Treasurer shall give a bond for the faithful discharge of his or her duties in such sum and with such surety or sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Treasurer shall have charge and custody of and be responsible for all funds and securities of the corporation; receive and give receipts for moneys due and payable to the corporation from any source whatsoever, and deposit all such moneys in the name of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as shall be selected in accordance with the provisions of Article VII of these by-laws; and in general perform all the duties incident to the office of Treasurer and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President or by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 10. SECRETARY. The Secretary shall keep the minutes of the meetings of the Board of Directors in one or more books provided for that purpose; see that all notices are duly given in accordance with the provisions of these by-laws or as required by law; be the custodian of the corporate records; keep a register of the post office address of each director which shall be furnished to the Secretary by such director; and, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of Secretary and such other duties as from time to time may be assigned to him or her by the President or by the Board of Directors.

SECTION 11. ASSISTANT TREASURERS AND ASSISTANT SECRETARIES. If required by the Board of Directors, the Assistant Treasurers shall give bonds for the faithful discharge of their duties in such sums and with such sureties as the Board of Directors shall determine. The Assistant Treasurers and Assistant Secretaries, in general, shall perform such duties as shall be assigned to them by the Treasurer or the Secretary or by the President or the Board of Directors.

SECTION 12. OTHER OFFICERS OR AGENTS. The Board of Directors may appoint an Executive Director and Associate Director and other agents and employees to perform such duties and responsibilities as may be assigned. Such assignments may be altered, changed, revised and otherwise amended at any regular or special meeting of the Board of Directors.

ARTICLE VI

Indemnification

SECTION 1. INDEMNIFICATION. Each person who at any time is or shall have been a director, officer, employee or agent of this corporation, or is or shall have been serving at the request of the corporation as a director, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, shall be indemnified by this corporation in accordance with and to the full extent permitted by the General Not-for-Profit Corporation Act of Illinois as

in effect at the time of adoption of this by-law or as amended from time to time.

SECTION 2. NON-EXCLUSION. The indemnification provided hereby shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which anyone seeking indemnification may be entitled under any by-laws, agreement, vote of members or disinterested directors or otherwise, both as to action in his or her official capacity and as to action in another capacity while holding such office.

SECTION 3. INSURANCE. The corporation shall purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any and all of its directors or officers or former directors or officers or any person who has served at its request or by its election as a director or officer of another corporation against any liability, or settlement based on asserted liability, incurred by them by reason of being or having been directors or a director or officer of the corporation, or of such other corporation, whether or not the corporation would have the power to indemnify them against such liability or settlement under the provisions of this by-law.

SECTION 4. EXCEPTION. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary that may be stated in this by-law, the corporation shall not indemnify its directors and officers for the payment of any tax that may be imposed against said directors or officers under Chapter 42 of the Internal Revenue Code.

SECTION 5. EXPENSES FOR DEFENSE OF CHAPTER 42 INTERNAL REVENUE CODE PROCEEDINGS. The corporation

does indemnify its directors and officers with respect to their defense in a judicial or administrative proceeding involving Chapter 42 of the Internal Revenue Code against all expenses (other than taxes, penalties or expenses of correction), including attorney fees, if such expenses are reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with such proceeding and he or she is successful in such defense, or such proceeding is terminated by settlement, and he or she has not acted willfully and without reasonable cause with respect to the act or failure to act which led to liability for a tax under Chapter 42 of the Internal Revenue Code.

ARTICLE VII

Contracts, Checks, Deposits and Funds

SECTION 1. CONTRACTS. The Board of Directors may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation, in addition to the officers so authorized by these by-laws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.

SECTION 2. CHECKS, DRAFTS, ETC. All checks, drafts or other orders for the payment of money, notes, or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the corporation shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents of the corporation and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Board of Directors. In the absence

of such determination by the Board of Directors, such instruments shall be signed by the Treasurer or an Assistant Treasurer and countersigned by the President or a Vice-President of the corporation.

SECTION 3. DEPOSITS. All funds of the corporation shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the corporation in such banks, trust companies or other depositories as the Board of Directors may select.

SECTION 4. GIFTS. The Board of Directors may accept on behalf of the corporation any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the corporation.

ARTICLE VIII

Books and Records

The corporation shall keep correct and complete books and records of account and shall also keep minutes of the proceedings of its Board of Directors and committees having any of the authority of the Board of Directors, and shall keep at the registered or principal office a record giving the names and addresses of the directors entitled to vote. All books and records of the corporation may be inspected by any director, or his or her agent or attorney for any proper purpose at any reasonable time.

The books and records of the corporation shall be audited at least once each year and at such other times as the Board may determine.

ARTICLE IX

Fiscal Year

The fiscal year of the corporation shall begin on the first day of January and end on the last day of December in each year.

ARTICLE X

Waiver of Notice

Whenever any notice whatever is required to be given under the provisions of the General Not-for-Profit Corporation Act of Illinois or under the provisions of the Articles of Incorporation or the by-laws of the corporation, a waiver thereof in writing signed by the person or persons entitled to such notice whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent to the giving of such notice.

ARTICLE XI

Amendments to By-Laws

The power to alter, amend, or repeal the by-laws or adopt new by-laws shall be vested in the Board of Directors. Such action shall be taken at a regular or special meeting by the affirmative vote of a majority of directors then in office. The by-laws may contain any provisions for the regulation and management of the affairs of the corporation not inconsistent with law or the Articles of Incorporation.
