AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

OF

THE ETHEL AND JAMES FLINN FOUNDATION

(A Michigan Nonprofit Corporation)

ARTICLE I

Members

- Section 1. Members. The Corporation is organized on a membership basis. The Members of this Corporation will consist of those persons elected as Members in the manner set forth in the Articles of Incorporation. Members will serve for a term of three years.
- Section 2. Resignation, Removal and Vacancies. A Member may resign by written notice to the Corporation. The resignation will be effective upon its receipt by the Corporation or a subsequent time as set forth in the notice of resignation. A Member may be removed, either with or without cause, by the affirmative vote of a 3/4ths of all Members entitled to vote. The remaining Members may fill any vacancies in the membership as a result of death, resignation, removal or otherwise by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Members though less than a quorum of the Board.
- Section 3. Annual Meeting. The annual meeting of the Members of the Corporation will be held on the second Tuesday of December of each year, or on such other date and at such place as designated by the notice of such meeting for the purpose of electing Trustees and for the transaction of other business properly brought before the meeting.
- Section 4. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Members may be called by the Chair of the Board and will be called by the Chair of the Board or Secretary at the direction of not less than two Trustees or at the request in writing of at least two of the Members entitled to vote at the meeting. Special meetings will be held at the principal office of the Corporation unless otherwise directed by the Members and stated in the notice of meeting. Any request for a special meeting must state the purpose or purposes of the proposed meeting.
- Section 5. Notice of Meetings. Except as otherwise provided by these bylaws or by law, written notice containing the time, place and purpose of a meeting of the Members will be given either personally or by mail to each Member of record entitled to vote at the meeting not less than 10 days nor more than 60 days before the meeting. No notice of an adjourned meeting need be given if the time and place to which the meeting is adjourned is announced at the meeting. At the adjourned meeting, the only business that may be transacted is business which might have been transacted at the original meeting, unless the Members fix a new record date for the adjourned meeting.

Meetings may be held without notice if all Members are present in person or if notice of the meeting is waived in writing, either before or after the meeting, by all Members not present at the meeting.

- Section 6. Quorum. A majority of the Members will constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. The Members present in person or by proxy at the meeting may continue to transact business until adjournment, notwithstanding the withdrawal of enough Members to leave less than a quorum. The vote of a majority of the Members present at the meeting at which a quorum is present constitutes the action of the Members, unless a greater number is required by other sections of these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation. Whether or not a quorum is present, the meeting may be adjourned by a vote of the Members present.
- Section 7. Conduct of Meetings. Meetings of the Members will be presided over by the Chair of the Board. The Secretary or an Assistant Secretary of the Corporation or, in their absence, a person chosen at the meeting will act as Secretary of the meeting.
- Section 8. Participation by Conference Telephone. A Member may participate in a meeting by a conference telephone or similar communications equipment by which all persons participating in the meeting may hear each other if all participants are advised of the communications equipment and the names of the participants in the conference are divulged to all participants. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this section will constitute presence in person at the meeting.
- Section 9. Voting. Each Member entitled to vote at any meeting of Members will have the right to cast one vote in person or by proxy.
- Section 10. Action by Unanimous Written Consent. Any action required or permitted to be taken at an annual or special meeting of the Members may be taken without a meeting, without prior notice and without a vote, if all of the Members entitled to vote therein consent in writing to the action so taken. Written consents will be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Members.

ARTICLE II

Trustees

Section 1. Number, Qualification and Term of Office. The property, activities and affairs of the Corporation will be managed by its Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees of this Corporation will consist of not less than three nor more than nine persons as determined by the Members.

The terms of the Trustees will be staggered so that at each annual meeting, approximately one-third of the Trustees will be elected. The members of the first Board of Trustees will be divided as nearly as possible into three classes of equal size: the first class to serve a one-year term, the second class to serve a two-year term and the third class to serve a three-year term. Thereafter, the term of office of any Trustee will be for three years from the date of his or her

election or appointment by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Members entitled to vote and present in person or by proxy at a meeting of the Members and continue until his or her successor has been elected and qualified. Each Trustee may serve a maximum of three (3) consecutive three (3) year terms effective January 1, 2010. Trustees appointed by the Board of Trustees to fill unexpired terms, shall stand for election at the annual meeting for which the vacated term was due to expire, and service provided for the unexpired term shall not be counted as an elected term. After serving three consecutive terms, a person will be eligible to serve as Trustee for three additional consecutive terms one year after the end of his or her third consecutive term."

Section 2. Resignation, Removal and Vacancies. A Trustee may resign by written notice to the Corporation. The resignation will be effective upon its receipt by the Corporation or a subsequent time as set forth in the notice of resignation. A Trustee may be removed, either with or without cause, by the affirmative vote of 3/4ths of all Members entitled to vote.

If a vacancy has occurred in the Board of Trustees as a result of death, resignation, removal or otherwise, the vacancy may be filled by the affirmative vote of a majority of the remaining Trustees though less than a quorum of the Board.

- Section 3. General Powers as to Negotiable Paper. The Board of Trustees may, from time to time, authorize the making, signature or endorsement of checks, drafts, notes and other negotiable paper or other instruments for the payment of money and designate the persons who will be authorized to make, sign or endorse the same on behalf of the Corporation.
- Section 4. Powers as to Other Documents. All material contracts, conveyances and other instruments may be executed on behalf of the Corporation by the Chair of the Board or Executive Director, and, if necessary, attested by the Secretary or the Treasurer.
- Section 5. Regular Meetings. Regular meetings of the Board of Trustees may be held without notice if the time and place of the meeting has been determined by resolution of the Board. A regular meeting of the Board of Trustees will be held immediately after the annual meeting of the Members at the same place for the purpose of electing officers for the ensuing year. At least one regular meeting of the Board must be held each year.
- Section 6. Special Meetings. Special meetings of the Board of Trustees may be called by the Chair of the Board and will be called by the Chair of the Board or Secretary at the direction of not less than two Trustees or as may otherwise be provided by law. Special meetings will be held at the principal office of the Corporation unless otherwise directed by the Chair of the Board or Secretary and stated in the notice of meeting. Any request for a meeting by Trustees must state the purpose or purposes of the proposed meeting.
- Section 7. Notice of Meeting. Except as otherwise provided by these Bylaws or by law, written notice containing the time and place of all meetings of the Board of Trustees will be given either personally or by mail to each Trustee not less than ten days before a regular meeting and not less than two days before a special meeting. Notice of a regular meeting need not state

the purpose or purposes of the meeting nor the business to be transacted at the meeting. Notice of a special meeting must state the purpose or purposes of the meeting.

Attendance of a Trustee at a meeting constitutes a waiver of notice of the meeting, except where the Trustee attends the meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting was not lawfully called or convened.

- Section 8. Quorum and Voting. A majority of all the Trustees will constitute a quorum at any meeting. The Trustees present in person or by proxy at the meeting may continue to transact business until adjournment, notwithstanding the withdrawal of enough Trustees to leave less than a quorum. The vote of a majority of the Trustees present at a meeting at which a quorum is present constitutes the action of the Board of Trustees, unless the vote of a larger number is required by law or by other sections of these Bylaws or the Articles of Incorporation. Whether or not a quorum is present, the meeting may be adjourned by a vote of the Trustees present.
- <u>Section 9</u>. <u>Voting</u>. Each Trustee entitled to vote at any meeting of Trustees will have the right to cast one vote in person or by proxy.
- Section 10. Conduct of Meetings. Meetings of the Trustees will be presided over by the Chair of the Board. The Secretary or an Assistant Secretary of the Corporation or, in their absence, a person chosen at the meeting will act as Secretary of the meeting.
- Section 11. Action by Unanimous Written Consent. Any action required or permitted to be taken at an annual or special meeting of Trustees may be taken without a meeting, without prior notice and without a vote, if all of the Trustees consent in writing to the action so taken. Written consents will be filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Trustees.
- Section 12. Telephonic Conferences. A Trustee may participate in a meeting of Trustees by conference telephone or similar communications equipment by which all persons participating in the meeting may hear each other if all participants are advised of the communications equipment and the names of the participants in the conference are divulged to all participants. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this section constitutes presence in person at the meeting.
- Section 13. Compensation. Trustees will serve without compensation but may be reimbursed for actual, reasonable and necessary expenses incurred by a Trustee in his or her capacity as a Trustee.

ARTICLE III

Officers

Section 1. Election or Appointment. The Board of Trustees will elect a Chair of the Board, a Secretary and a Treasurer of the Corporation at each annual meeting and may elect a Vice Chair, Assistant Secretary, Assistant Treasurer and Executive Director. The same person

may hold any two or more offices, but no officer will execute, acknowledge or verify any instrument in more than one capacity. The Trustees may also appoint any other officers and agents as they deem necessary for accomplishing the purposes of the Corporation.

Section 2. Term of Office. The term of office of all officers will commence upon their election or appointment and will continue until the next annual meeting of the Corporation and until their respective successors are chosen or until their resignation or removal. Any officer may be removed from office at any meeting of the Trustees, with or without cause, by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Trustees then in office, whenever in their judgment the best interest of the Corporation will be served.

An officer may resign by written notice to the Corporation. The resignation will be effective upon its receipt by the Corporation or at a subsequent time specified in the notice of the resignation.

- <u>Section 3</u>. <u>Compensation</u>. Any officer who is an employee of the Corporation will receive reasonable compensation for his or her services as fixed by the Board of Trustees. No officer is prevented from receiving compensation by reason of the fact that he or she is also a Trustee of the Corporation.
- Section 4. Chair of the Board. The Chair of the Board will preside at meetings of the Trustees and in his or her absence, the Trustees present at the meeting will designate another presiding officer. The Chair of the Board will assist the Executive Director to see that all orders and resolutions of the Board of Trustees are carried into effect.
- Section 5. <u>Vice Chair</u>. The Vice Chair will, in the absence or disability of the Chair of the Board, perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Chair of the Board and will perform any other duties prescribed by the Board of Trustees or the Chair of the Board.
- Section 6. The Secretary. The Secretary will attend all meetings of the Board of Trustees and record the minutes of all proceedings in a book to be kept for that purpose. The Secretary will give or cause to be given notice of all meetings of the Board of Trustees for which notice may be required and will perform any other duties prescribed by the Board of Trustees.
- Section 7. The Treasurer. The Treasurer will oversee the financial activities of the Corporation. The Treasurer will perform all duties incident to the office of Treasurer and other administrative duties as may be prescribed by the Board of Trustees. All books, papers, vouchers, money and other property of whatever kind belonging to the Corporation which are in the Treasurer's possession or under his or her control will be returned to the Corporation at the time of his or her death, resignation or removal from office.
- Section 8. Assistant Secretaries and Assistant Treasurers. The Assistant Secretary and the Assistant Treasurer, respectively, in the absence of the Secretary or Treasurer, as the case may be, will perform the duties and exercise the powers of the Secretary or Treasurer and will perform any other duties prescribed by the Board of Trustees.

Section 9. Executive Director. The Executive Director will be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and will see that all orders and resolutions of the Board of Trustees are carried into effect. The Executive Director will be the principal operating officer of the Corporation and will have general and active management of the activities of the Corporation. The Executive Director, subject to the control of the Board, will supervise and control all of the property and affairs of the Corporation and will have the general duties incident to the office of the Executive Director and other duties as may be prescribed by the Board. Within this authority and in the course of his or her duties, he or she will sign, execute, acknowledge or verify instruments of any nature which the Board has authorized to be signed, executed, acknowledged or verified, except in cases where expressly delegated by the Board or by these Bylaws to some other officer or agent of the Corporation. The Executive Director is responsible for ensuring compliance with the requirements of the applicable Internal Revenue Code provisions and Regulations thereunder so as to maintain the Corporation's exemption from tax under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code and its classification as a private foundation under Section 509(a) of the Code.

ARTICLE IV

Committees

- Section 1. Executive Committee. The Board of Trustees may establish an Executive Committee consisting of two or more members of the Board. The Executive Committee, subject to those limitations as may be required by law or imposed by resolution of the Board of Trustees, may exercise all powers and authority of the Board of Trustees in the management of the business and affairs of the Corporation between meetings of the Board of Trustees, except that such Executive Committee will not have power or authority to:
 - (a) Amend the Articles of Incorporation;
 - (b) Adopt an agreement of merger or consolidation;
 - (c) Recommend to Members the sale, lease or exchange of all or substantially all of the Corporation's property and assets;
 - (d) Recommend to Members the dissolution of the Corporation or a revocation of a dissolution;
 - (e) Amend the Bylaws of the Corporation;
 - (f) Fill vacancies on the Board;
 - (g) Fix compensation of the Trustees for serving on the board or on a committee; or

- (h) Terminate membership.
- Section 2. Other Committees. The Board of Trustees may designate other committees as deemed appropriate. The committees will have the authority as delegated to them by the Board of Trustees.
- Section 3. Procedure. All committees, and each member thereof, will serve at the pleasure of the Board of Trustees. The Board of Trustees will have the power at any time to increase or decrease the number of members of any committee, to fill vacancies thereon, to change any member thereof, and to change the functions or terminate the existence or any committee. Regular or special meetings of any committee may be held in the same manner provided in these Bylaws for regular or special meetings of the Board of Trustees, and a majority of any committee will constitute a quorum at the meeting.

ARTICLE V

Indemnification

Indemnification. The Corporation will, to the fullest extent now or Section 1. hereafter permitted by law, indemnify any Trustee or officer of the Corporation (and, to the extent provided in a resolution of the Board of Trustees or by contract, may indemnify any volunteer, employee or agent of the Corporation) who was or is a party to or threatened to be made a party to any threatened, pending, or completed action, suit or proceeding by reason of the fact that the person is or was a Trustee, officer, volunteer, employee or agent of the Corporation. or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a trustee, officer, partner, volunteer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise, whether for profit or not for profit, against expenses including attorneys' fees (which expenses may be paid by the Corporation in advance of a final disposition of the action, suit or proceeding as provided by law), judgments, penalties, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by the person in connection with action, suit or proceeding if the person acted (or refrained from acting) in good faith and in a manner the person reasonably believed to be in or not opposed to the best interests of the Corporation or its Members, and with respect to any criminal action or proceeding, if the person had no reasonable cause to believe his or her conduct was unlawful.

The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance on behalf of any such person against any liability (including penalties, taxes, expenses of correction, judgments, settlements or expenses) asserted against him or her and incurred by him or her in any such capacity or arising out of his or her status as such, whether or not the Corporation would have the power to indemnify him or her against such liability under the provisions of this Article or under the provisions of Sections 561 through 565 of the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act.

Section 2. Rights to Continue. This indemnification will continue as to a person who has ceased to be a Trustee or officer of the Corporation. Indemnification may continue as to a person who has ceased to be a volunteer, employee or agent of the Corporation to the extent provided in a resolution of the Board of Trustees or in any contract between the Corporation and the person. Any indemnification of a person who was entitled to indemnification after such person ceased to be a Trustee, officer, volunteer, employee or agent of the Corporation will inure to the benefit of the heirs and personal representatives of that person.

ARTICLE VI

Policies

Section 1. Governance Policies The Board of Trustees will adopt a conflicts of interest policy and such other policies as are appropriate for the governance of the Corporation.

ARTICLE VII

Miscellaneous

- Section 1. Fiscal Year. The fiscal year of the Corporation will end on the last day of December.
- Section 2. Amendments. These Bylaws may be amended or repealed by the affirmative vote of a majority of the Trustees then in office.
