### AMENDED AND RESTATED BYLAWS

**OF** 

### JOY C. HINSON-RIDER FOUNDATION

The following Amended and Restated Bylaws replace in their entirety the Bylaws of the Joy C. Hinson-Rider Foundation adopted March 7, 1994, and amended June 17, 1998.

### ARTICLE I

### **CORPORATE NAME**

The name of this corporation shall be the JOY C. HINSON-RIDER FOUNDATION (the "Corporation").

### ARTICLE II

### **PURPOSES AND LIMITATIONS**

The purposes of the Corporation are as set forth in Article II of the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation.

### ARTICLE III

### **DIRECTORSHIP CORPORATION**

The Corporation is a nonstock corporation organized upon a directorship basis under the Michigan Nonprofit Corporation Act (the "MNCA"). All matters which are subject to membership vote or other action under the MNCA in the case of a membership corporation shall be subject to duly authorized action by the Board of Directors of the Corporation.

### ARTICLE IV

### **BOARD OF DIRECTORS**

- 1. The business, property, and affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors. In addition to the power and authority expressly conferred upon it by these Bylaws and the Articles of Incorporation, the Board of Directors may take any lawful action on behalf of the Corporation which is not by law or by the Articles of Incorporation or by these Bylaws required to be taken by some other party.
- 2. The number of Directors shall be not less than three (3). Directors shall hold office for the term of one (1) year and/or until their successors are elected and qualified. All Director positions shall initially be filled by a vote of the incorporator. Thereafter, at each annual meeting, the Directors shall, by an affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors, elect the Directors for the next year.
- 3. Vacancies in the Board of Directors shall be filled by the remaining members of the Board of Directors and each person so elected shall be a Director until a successor is elected by the Directors, who may make such election at the next annual meeting of the Directors or at any special meeting duly called for that purpose. In the event of the vacancy of all members of the Board of Directors, a Director shall be appointed by the then sitting chief judge of that court, or division of a court, of Kalamazoo County, Michigan, having jurisdiction over the administration of trusts and estates of

decedents. Such Director so appointed shall, upon assumption of duties, appoint the remaining Directors.

- 4. Members of the Board of Directors may receive such reasonable compensation for their services as Directors as the Board of Directors may by resolution determine. In determining the amount of compensation to be paid, the Directors shall use the procedures set forth in Section 4958 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Code"), and the Regulations promulgated thereunder.
- 5. A Director may resign by giving written notice to the President of the Corporation which notice shall be immediately forwarded to the Board of Directors. Unless otherwise specified in the resignation, the resignation shall take effect upon receipt by the President, and the acceptance of the resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- 6. Any Director may be removed at any time, with or without cause, by an affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors.
- 7. A Director shall discharge the duties of that position in good faith and with that degree of diligence, care, and skill which an ordinarily prudent person would exercise under similar circumstances in a like position. In discharging the duties, a Director, when acting in good faith, may rely upon the opinion of counsel for the Corporation, upon the report of an independent appraiser selected with reasonable care by the Board of Directors, or upon financial statements of the Corporation represented to the Director as correct by the President or the officer of the Corporation having charge of its books of account, or as stated in a written report by an independent public or certified public accountant or firm of accountants fairly to reflect the financial condition of the Corporation.
- 8. A contract or other transaction between the Corporation and one or more of its Directors, or between the Corporation and a domestic or foreign corporation, domestic or foreign business corporation, firm or association of any type or kind, in which one or more of its Directors are directors, or are otherwise interested, is not void or voidable solely because of such common directorship or interest, or solely because such Directors are present at the meeting of the Board of Directors or committee thereof which authorizes or approves the contract or transaction, or solely because their votes are counted for such purpose if any of the following conditions is satisfied:
  - (a) The contract or other transaction is fair and reasonable to the Corporation when it is authorized, approved, or ratified.
  - (b) The material facts as to the Director's relationship or interest and as to the contract or transaction are disclosed or known to the Board of Directors or committee, and the Board of Directors or committee authorizes, approves, or ratifies the contract or transaction by a vote sufficient for the purpose without counting the vote of any common or interested Director.
- 9. Any contract or other transaction between the Corporation and one or more of its Directors or other person who is a Disqualified Person (herein a "Disqualified Person"), as defined in Section 4958 of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder, or between the Corporation and a domestic or foreign corporation, domestic or foreign business corporation, firm or association of any type or kind, in which one or more Disqualified Persons are directors, or are otherwise interested, must not constitute an excess benefit transaction pursuant to Section 4958 of the Code and the

Regulations promulgated thereunder, and any such contract or transaction shall comply with the requirements of Section 4958 and its Regulations. Any economic benefit that is provided to a Disqualified Person for the performance of services shall be documented with written substantiation that is contemporaneous with the transfer of the economic benefit.

10. The Board of Directors may approve a Conflicts of Interest Policy that establishes policies and procedures for determining when a Director or other person involved with the Corporation has a conflict of interest and which specifies procedures for reviewing and voting upon any contract or transaction with such an interested person or with an entity in which such person has an interest. The policies and procedures approved by the Board of Directors may be stricter than those set forth in the MNCA or in these Bylaws, including Section 8 above.

### ARTICLE V

### MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 1. The Board of Directors may set the time and place for regular meetings of the Board of Directors as is necessary to conduct the business of the Corporation.
- 2. The regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held each year on the second Tuesday in June or such other date as the Board of Directors may designate.
- 3. A special meeting of the Board of Directors may be called at any time by any two (2) Directors.
- 4. All meetings shall be held at the Corporation's principal office or at such other place as shall be determined by the Board of Directors.
- 5. All meetings shall be held at such time, date, and place as may be designated in the notice therefore.
- 6. At all meetings, a majority of the members of the Board of Directors, or a committee thereof, shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business. Unless otherwise specifically required by these Bylaws, the Articles of Incorporation, or Michigan law, the vote of a majority of the members present at a meeting at which a quorum is present constitutes the action of the Board of Directors, or a committee thereof.
- 7. A member of the Board of Directors, or a committee thereof, may participate in a meeting by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in a meeting can hear each other. Participation in a meeting pursuant to this section constitutes presence in person at the meeting of such participant.
- 8. Any action required or permitted to be taken at any meeting of the Board of Directors, or a committee thereof, may be taken without a meeting, if before or after the action, all members of the Board of Directors then in office, or all members of the committee then in office, consent to the action in writing or by electronic transmission and such written consent is filed with the minutes of the proceedings of the Board of Directors or committee thereof.
- 9. As used in these Bylaws, electronic transmission refers to any form of communication that does not directly involve the physical transmission of paper, creates a record that may be retained and retrieved by the recipient and may be directly reproduced in paper form by the recipient through an

automated process. As used in these Bylaws, "written" or "writing" will include communication by electronic transmission, including but not limited to facsimile and e-mail communications. Notices of meetings, waivers of notice of meetings, proxies, and written consents may be transmitted by electronic transmission. When a notice or communication is transmitted electronically, the notice or communication is deemed to be given when electronically transmitted to the person entitled to the notice or communication in a manner authorized by the person. A person will be deemed to have authorized the use of communication by such method of electronic transmission upon providing the Corporation with a valid facsimile number, e-mail address, or other electronic transmission contact information.

### ARTICLE VI

### NOTICES OF MEETINGS OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- 1. Notice of all meetings of the Board of Directors shall be given not less than twenty-four (24) hours prior to the time fixed therefore by personal delivery, by telephone, or by electronic transmission, and if by United States mail not less than five (5) days prior to such time; provided, however, that if a purpose of a meeting is to vote to amend the Corporation's Articles of Incorporation then the number of days of advance notice for the meeting and the contents of the notice shall be as required by the MNCA.
- 2. The necessity for the giving of any notice of any meeting of the Board of Directors may be waived by any member who signs a proper written waiver, and such waiver shall be sufficient if signed before, at the time of, or after such meeting. Such waiver shall be sufficient if delivered in original form or by electronic transmission. Attendance of a Director at a meeting constitutes a waiver of notice of the meeting, except where a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.
- 3. All meetings at which all persons entitled to participate therein are present either in person or by conference telephone shall be regular in all respects, regardless of any irregularity in the giving of notice thereof.
- 4. All notices of all meetings shall be in a form such as to reasonably advise all Directors of the matters proposed for consideration at the meeting; providing, however, that it shall be presumed without any written notice that (1) the election of Directors and officers will take place at the regular annual meeting of the Board of Directors, and (2) applications for and orders directing distribution of distributable funds of the Corporation may be considered at any and all meetings of the Board of Directors.
- 5. Notices given by mail, telephone, or electronic transmission shall be subject to the following:
  - (a) A notice given by mail shall be mailed to the person entitled to receive notice at the address designated by that person for that purpose, or if none is designated, at that person's last known address. The notice is given when deposited, with postage prepaid, in a post office box or official depository under the excusive care and custody of the United States Postal Service. The mailing shall be registered, certified, or other first class mail except where otherwise provided in the MNCA.

- (b) A notice given by telephone shall be given by calling the person entitled to receive notice at the telephone number designated by that person for that purpose, or if none is designated, at that person's last known telephone number. The notice is deemed given if told to the person directly, or in the event of the inability to contact the person by telephone, such telephone notice shall be sufficient if word thereof is left with a responsible person either at the home or place of business of the person entitled to receive notice.
- (c) A notice given by electronic transmission shall be sent to the person entitled to receive notice by any means of electronic transmission authorized pursuant to Article V, Section 9 above.

### ARTICLE VII

### **OFFICERS**

- 1. At the Annual Meeting, the Board of Directors shall select a President, a Vice President, a Secretary, and a Treasurer, and may select a Chairperson of the Board, one or more additional Vice Presidents, Assistant Secretaries, and Assistant Treasurers, who shall be elected by the Board of Directors at its regular annual meeting. The term of office shall be for one (1) year or until their successors are chosen. No one of such officers, except the President and, if elected, the Chairperson of the Board, need be a Director. Any two of the above offices, except those of President and Vice President, may be held by the same person, but no officer shall execute, acknowledge, or verify any instrument in more than one capacity. The Board of Directors may fix the salaries of the officers of the Corporation.
- 2. The Board of Directors may also appoint such other officers and agents (including agents having custody of the Corporation's assets) as it may deem necessary for the transaction of the business of the Corporation. All officers and agents shall respectively have such authority and perform such duties in the management of the property and affairs of the Corporation as may be designated by the Board of Directors.
- 3. The Board of Directors may secure the fidelity of any or all of such officers by bond or otherwise.
- 4. Officers may receive such reasonable compensation for their services as Officers as the Board of Directors may by resolution determine. In determining the amount of compensation to be paid, the Directors shall use the procedures set forth in Section 4958 of the Code and the Regulations promulgated thereunder.
- 5. Any Officer may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Board of Directors or to the President of the Corporation. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein; and, unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- 6. Any of the Officers designated in Section 1 of this Article VII may be removed by the Board of Directors, whenever in its judgment the best interests of the Corporation will be served thereby.
- 7. An Officer shall discharge the duties as an officer, and shall be entitled to rely on reports, etc., in the same manner as specified for a Director in Article IV, Section 7.

### ARTICLE VIII

### **DUTIES OF OFFICERS**

- 1. The President shall be the chief executive officer of the Corporation and have the general powers and duties of supervision and management usually vested in the office of the president of a corporation. The President shall preside over all meetings of the Board of Directors. The President shall be selected by and from the membership of the Board of Directors. The President shall see that all orders and resolutions of the Board of Directors are carried into effect. The President shall be an ex-officio member of all standing committees.
- 2. At least one Vice President shall be chosen. Such Vice Presidents, in the order of their seniority, shall perform the duties and exercise the powers of the President during the absence or disability of the President.
- 3. The Secretary or Assistant Secretary shall keep, maintain, and preserve the books and records of the Corporation and the minutes of various meetings of the Board of Directors, and the Secretary or Assistant Secretary shall have such further and other duties, responsibilities, and powers as are customarily incident to that office or as may be prescribed, from time to time, by the Board of Directors.
- 4. The Treasurer or Assistant Treasurer shall have such duties, responsibilities, and powers as are customarily incident to that office or as may be prescribed, from time to time, by the Board of Directors.

### ARTICLE IX

### **OPERATING PROCEDURE**

- 1. The distribution of funds in furtherance of the charitable purposes of the Corporation shall be and remain subject at all times to the control of the Board of Directors, except to the extent delegated to a committee in compliance with Article X.
- 2. With regard to the use and distribution of funds and properties as from time to time received and accepted by the Corporation, the Board of Directors will recognize and follow any specific direction and any request or suggestion given by the donor, but the right is reserved to deviate therefrom in the event and to the extent that any such direction, request, or suggestion does not appear workable or practical or following such request may jeopardize the tax-exempt status of the Corporation.
- 3. The books of the Corporation and, so far as is applicable to the funds of the Corporation, the books of each authorized agent having custody of the Corporation's assets may be audited once each year. If the Board of Directors elects to have an annual audit, the Board of Directors shall select a certified public accountant for the purpose of such audit. If an audit report is obtained, a copy of such audit report shall be furnished to each member of the Board of Directors as soon as it reasonably may be delivered after the receipt thereof by the Secretary of the Corporation, and a copy thereof shall be retained by the Secretary as a part of the Corporation's records.

### ARTICLE X

### COMMITTEES

- 1. The Board of Directors, by an affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors, may designate one or more committees, each committee consisting of one or more Directors. The Board of Directors may also designate one or more Directors as alternate committee members who may replace an absent or disqualified member at a committee meeting. If a committee member is absent or disqualified from voting, then members present at a meeting who are not disqualified from voting may, whether or not they constitute a quorum, unanimously appoint an alternate committee member to act at the committee meeting in place of the absent or disqualified member. All committees designated by the Board of Directors shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors.
- 2. Any committee shall exercise such powers and perform such duties as are stated in these Bylaws or as the Board of Directors may, from time to time authorize, including any or all powers and authority of the Board of Directors in the management and affairs of the Corporation; however, no committee shall have power or authority to:
  - (a) Amend the Articles of Incorporation.
  - (b) Adopt an agreement of merger or consolidation.
  - (c) Amend the Bylaws of the Corporation.
  - (d) Fill vacancies in the Board of Directors.
  - (e) Fix compensation of the Directors for serving on the Board of Directors or on a committee.
  - (f) Take any other action prohibited by law, the Articles of Incorporation, or these Bylaws.
- 3. The Board of Directors may adopt rules regarding the conduct of committees and their meetings, including rules for the calling of meetings, quorum requirements and voting. To the extent it is not inconsistent with the rules adopted by the Board of Directors, each committee may establish its own rules to govern the conduct of its activities.

### ARTICLE XI

### **DISSOLUTION**

In the event of the dissolution of the Corporation, all of its assets shall be distributed as provided in the Articles of Incorporation.

### **ARTICLE XII**

### **CORPORATE SEAL**

The Board of Directors may, in its discretion, adopt a suitable corporate seal, which seal, if any, shall be in the charge of and shall be used by the Secretary.

### **ARTICLE XIII**

### AMENDMENT OF BYLAWS

These Bylaws may be amended or revoked, in whole or in part, and from time to time, by an affirmative vote of a majority of the Directors, providing that the notice of any meeting at which such action is to be considered shall include a detailed description of the proposed action, including the wording of proposed changes to these Bylaws.

### ARTICLE XIV

### **FISCAL YEAR**

The fiscal year of the Corporation shall be from January 1 to December 31.

### ARTICLE XV

### **DIRECTORS AND TRUSTEES**

"Director," as used herein, shall be interpreted to mean "Trustee," as permitted by MCL 450.2106(3), if the Articles of Incorporation use the term "Trustee" in lieu of "Director."

### CERTIFICATE OF SECRETARY
