

The attorneys for The American Lutheran Church of Faegre and Benson have requested that we send the following brief to you in relationship to the 501(C)(3) status and the filing of Form 990.

During 1985, the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit decided the case of Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota. The court held that an organization which is exempt from taxation as an organization described in Section 501(C)(3) and which is affiliated with a church is exempt from filing Form 990. The attached legal opinion provides more detail and states the decision is binding in Arkansas, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota and South Dakota. Apparently, each Circuit Court would have to act on this to make it a national reality or the Supreme Court would have to act on it.

In an attempt to reduce correspondence with Internal Revenue Service, it is suggested that organizations which are exempt from filing Form 990 file the form this year. They should provide their name, address, and reasons for not filing a complete Form 990. A copy of the suggested format for the return is attached.

Ladies and Gentlemen:

Our opinion has been requested regarding the extent to which ALC entities may rely on the decision of the United States Court of Appeals for the Eighth Circuit in the case of Lutheran Social Services of Minnesota vs. The United States of America decided April 3, 1985 by Circuit Judges Heaney, Ross and Fagg. In that decision the Eighth Circuit struck down part of the government's regulatory definition of "integrated auxiliary." Integrated auxiliaries are exempt from the requirement to file Form 990 with the Internal Revenue Service.

The government's definition of "integrated auxiliary" was set out in Treas. Reg. 51.6033-2(g)(5)(i) as follows:

For purposes of this title, the term "integrated auxiliary of a church" means an organization:

- (a) Which is exempt from taxation as an organization described in section 501(c)(3);
- (b) Which is affiliated (within the meaning of paragraph (g)(5)(iii) of this section) with a church; and
- (c) Whose principal activity is exclusively religious.


The Court held that the IRS' requirement that the organization be "exclusively religious" was not a correct interpretation of the statute and struck down subparagraph (c) of the regulation. Note the decision is not limited to social service organizations.

The decision of the Eighth Circuit is binding on the United States of America within the Eighth Circuit which includes the states of: Arkansas, Iowa, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, and South Dakota. Therefore, entities resident within those states need not file a Form 990 if they meet the requirements set out in Treas. Reg. §1.6033(i)(a) and (b) without regard to whether the entity is "exclusively religious." For entities resident in other states, the Eighth Circuit's decision would in no way change the advice previously given by The ALC to the effect that fully completed Forms 990 should be filed.

In Lutheran Social Service of Minnesota vs. United States, the government conceded that the organization was "affiliated with a church" as required in Treas. Reg. §1.6033(g)(5)(i)(b) and as specifically defined in Treas. Reg. §1.6033(g)(5)(iii). We have attached to this letter the definition of "affiliated with a church" as set out in that regulation. Obviously each ALC entity will have to assess whether it meets the affiliation test in addition to being an organization described in §501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954 as amended. However, the test of "shar[ing] common religious bonds and convictions with" the ALC is quite easy to satisfy.

TREASURY REGULATION §1.6033-2(g)(5)(iii):

For purposes of paragraph (g)(5) of this section, the term "affiliated" means either controlled by or associated with a church or with a convention or association of churches. For example, an organization, a majority of whose officers or directors are appointed by a church's governing board or by officials of a church, is controlled by a church within the meaning of this paragraph. An organization is associated with a church or with a convention or association of churches if it shares common religious bonds and convictions with that church or convention or association of churches.
