THE AMERICORPS FIELD PROGRAM ENGAGES YOUNG ADULTS, AGES 18 TO 25, IN NATURAL RESOURCE, ENERGY CONSERVATION AND EMERGENCY RESPONSE WORK THROUGHOUT MINNESOTA AND IOWA. DURING THE SECOND HALF OF 2009 (FY09 6 MOS. PERIOD), 100 PARTICIPANTS COMPLETED 10.5 MONTH FIELD TERMS AND 40 COMPLETED 3-MONTH NATIONAL FOREST TRAILS TERMS, TOTALING 96,335 HOURS OF SERVICE. CORPS MEMBERS REMOVED INVASIVES FROM 6,136 ACRES, PLANTED 16,444 TREES AND SHRUBS, CONDUCTED PRESCRIBED BURNS ON 1,186 ACRES OF PRAIRIE, COMPLETED 2,414 MILES OF TRAILWORK AND INSTALLED ENERGY-SAVING DEVICES IN 387 HOMES. THEY RECEIVE A MONTHLY STIPEND, HEALTH INSURANCE, AND AN EDUCATION AWARD FOR COLLEGE EXPENSES. BESIDE CAREER AND WORK-SKILLS TRAINING, CORPS MEMBERS RECEIVE PROFESSIONAL CERTIFICATIONS IN WILDFIRE SUPPRESSION, CHAIN-SAW SAFETY AND FIRST AID.

THE RESIDENTIAL SUMMER YOUTH CORPS, BASED AT ST. CROIX STATE PARK, ENGAGES DIVERSE YOUTH, AGES 15-18, IN ENVIRONMENTAL-RESTORATION PROJECTS OVER EIGHT WEEKS OF THE SUMMER. HALF OF THE 85 YOUTH ARE FROM THE TWIN CITIES AREA AND HALF FROM GREATER MINNESOTA. PARTICIPANTS RECEIVE A LIVING STIPEND AS WELL AS ROOM AND BOARD. YOUTH BEGIN AT A BASE CAMP, THEN "SPIKE CAMP" THROUGHOUT THE REGION AS THEY WORK. IN ADDITION TO NATURAL-RESOURCE WORK EXPERIENCE, THEY LEARN SKILLS SUCH AS CIVIC LEADERSHIP AND RESUME WRITING. YOUTH PARTICIPANTS ARE SUPPORTED BY 26 CREW LEADERS AND 7 ASSISTANTS. THIS PAST YEAR, YOUTH CREWS COMPLETED 14,863 HOURS OF SERVICE INCLUDING BUILDING AND MAINTAINING 42 MILES OF TRAIL, MANAGING EXOTIC PLANT SPECIES ON 684 ACRES, AND ENGAGING IN 1,390 HOURS OF ENVIRONMENTAL EDUCATION.

YOUTH OUTDOORS IS A SERVICE-LEARNING PROGRAM FOR SAINT PAUL YOUTH, AGES 15-18 FROM LOW-INCOME HOUSEHOLDS. DURING EACH 12-WEEK SEMESTER, 24 YOUTH AND 8 CREW LEADERS WORK IN FOUR CREWS AFTER SCHOOL AND SATURDAYS. THEY COMPLETE NEIGHBORHOOD REVITALIZATION AND ENVIRONMENTAL PROJECTS WHILE EARNING A STIPEND. ABOUT 25 PERCENT OF EACH 12-HOUR WEEK IS SPENT IN EDUCATIONAL ACTIVITIES WITH A STRONG FOCUS ON SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND MATH CURRICULUM, AND IN CAREER-SKILLS TRAINING. MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS DURING THE FALL 2009 SEMESTER INCLUDE CONDUCTING 40 WILDLIFE SURVEYS, REMOVING INVASIVE SPECIES FROM 87 ACRES, PLANTING 3,700 TREES AND SHRUBS, LEADING VOLUNTEERS IN MORE THAN 450 HOURS OF VOLUNTEER SERVICE, AND IMPROVING YOUTH SKILLS AND SELF-IMAGE.
