NOTE 1: NATURE OF ACTIVITIES AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

Minnesota Ovarian Cancer Alliance (the Organization) is a nonprofit corporation which raises awareness about ovarian cancer and educates the at-risk and general population about the disease. The Organization also contributes grants for research toward better treatment, diagnosis, and a cure.

Tax Status

The Organization is exempt from income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code and comparable state law, and contributions to it are tax deductible within the limitations prescribed by the Code.

Income Taxes

The income received by the Organization is exempt from taxation under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code. The Financial Accounting Standards Board issued new guidance on accounting for uncertainty in income taxes. The Organization adopted this new guidance for the year ended December 31, 2009. Management evaluated the Organization's tax positions and concluded that the Organization had taken no uncertain tax positions that require adjustment to the financial statements to comply with the provisions of this guidance. With few exceptions, the Organization is no longer subject to income tax examinations by the U.S. federal, state, or local tax authorities for years before 2006.

Promises to Give

Unconditional promises to give are recognized over the passage of time as stated in the pledges. The pledges are to be received over a specific time period and will be released from temporarily restricted net assets as the time condition passes. The total outstanding promises to give as of December 31, 2009 were \$0.

Contributions

The Organization adopted SFAS No. 116, *Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made*. In accordance with SFAS No. 116, contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

The Organization reports gifts of cash and other assets as restricted support if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the Statement of Activities as net assets released from restrictions. However, donor-restricted contributions whose restrictions are met in the same reporting period are reported as unrestricted support.

Contributed Goods and Services

Contributed goods and services have been reflected in the accompanying financial statements in the amount of \$14,074 for professional services, \$2,000 for the Molly Cade Memorial Golf Tournament, \$998 for office equipment, \$42,614 for advertising and supplies for Walk/Run event, \$51,933 for 10th Anniversary, and \$6,784 for miscellaneous goods and services for the year ended December 31, 2009.

Investments

The Corporation has adopted SFAS No. 124, *Accounting for Certain Investments Held by Not-for-Profit Organizations*. Under SFAS No 124, investments in marketable securities with determinable fair values and all investments in debt securities are reported at their fair values in the statement of financial position. Investment income and realized and unrealized gains and losses are recognized in net assets in the reporting period in which the gains and losses are recognized.

Property and Equipment

Property and equipment, which consists of a building, building improvements, land, donated computers, furniture, and website design is recorded at fair market value at the date of donation and is depreciated over its estimated useful life using the straight-line method of depreciation. Accumulated depreciation as of December 31, 2009 was \$103,253.

Functional Expense Allocation

The Organization's financial statements segregate expenses by function, including program services and management and general. Expenses are charged directly to specific functions when practicable. Expenses not identified as relating to specific functions are allocated on an appropriate basis.

Financial Statement Presentation

The Organization has adopted SFAS No. 117, *Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations*. Under SFAS No. 117, the Organization is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted net assets, temporarily restricted net assets, and permanently restricted net assets. In addition, the Organization is required to present a statement of cash flows.

Statement of Cash Flows

For purposes of the statement of cash flows, the Organization considers all highly liquid investments with an original maturity of three months or less when purchased to be cash equivalents. Certificates of deposit with original maturities over three months are classified as short-term investments. Cash equivalents and short-term investments are stated at market value. At times, cash may be in excess of FDIC insurance limits.

Estimates

Management uses estimates and assumptions in preparing the financial statements in accordance with U.S. generally accepted accounting principles. Those estimates and assumptions affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, the disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities, and the reported revenue and expenses. Actual results could vary from the estimates that were used.

Reclassification

Certain accounts in the prior year financial statements have been reclassified for comparative purposes to conform to the presentation on the current year financial statements.

NOTE 2: INVESTMENTS

Investments are stated at fair value. Investments consist of the following at December 31, 2009:

NOTE 3: FAIR VALUE OF FINANCIAL INSTRUMENTS

Effective January 1, 2008, the Company adopted FASB Statement No. 157, *Fair Value Measurements*, which provides a framework for measuring fair value under generally accepted accounting principles. FASB Statement No. 157 applies to all financial instruments that are being measured and reported on a fair value basis. FASB Statement No. 157 requires new disclosure that establishes a framework for measuring fair value in GAAP, and expands disclosure about fair value measurements. This statement enables the reader of the financial statements to assess the inputs used to develop those measurements by establishing a hierarchy for ranking the quality and reliability of the information used to determine fair values. The statement requires that assets and liabilities carried at fair value will be classified and disclosed in one of the following three categories:

- Level 1: Valuations for assets and liabilities traded in active exchange markets, such as the New York Stock Exchange. Level 1 also includes U.S. Treasury and federal agency securities and federal agency mortgage-backed securities, which are traded by dealers or brokers in active markets. Valuations are obtained from readily available pricing sources for market transactions involving identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2: Valuations for assets and liabilities traded in less active dealer or broker markets. Valuations are obtained from third party pricing services for identical or similar assets or liabilities
- Level 3: Valuations for assets and liabilities that are derived from other valuation methodologies, including option pricing models, discounted cash flow models and similar techniques, and not based on market exchange, dealer, or broker traded transactions. Level 3 valuations incorporate certain assumptions and projections in determining the fair value assigned to such assets or liabilities

In determining the appropriate levels, the Company performs a detailed analysis of the assets and liabilities that are subject to FASB Statement No. 157. At each reporting period, all assets and liabilities for which the fair value measurement is based on significant unobservable inputs are classified as Level 3.

NOTE 7: NET ASSETS

Each year, as part of its budget development process, the Board of Directors determines the amount of unrestricted net assets to be awarded through a competitive process to research on ovarian cancer. A request for proposals is released in early January. Proposals are due by a set date and then sent out for review by both scientific and consumer reviewers. The Executive Director makes recommendations to the Board based on the reviews. The Board designated \$300,000, awarded \$286,054. The total amount of payments for research in 2009 was \$345,142 of which \$112,642 was for grants awarded in 2009.

The Board of Directors designated \$250,000 of unrestricted net assets for 2010 for research grants.
