WE COORDINATE SERVICES FOR THE NEEDS OF ALL WHO SEEK CARE REGARDLESS OF SOCIO-ECONOMIC STATUS. WE PARTNER FOR CREATIVE SOLUTIONS TO MEET THE DIVERSE NEEDS OF INDIVIDUALS, FAMILIES, AND COMMUNITIES.

IN 2009, SHS PROVIDED MEDICAL, DENTAL AND/OR BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE TO NEARLY 74,000 PATIENTS WHO RECEIVED SOME 360,000 UNITS OF SERVICE - OR AN AVERAGE OF 4.8 UNITS PER PATIENT - IN THE FORM OF PROVIDER VISITS AND OTHER DIRECT SERVICES MORE THAN EIGHT IN TEN OF OUR PATIENTS WHO REPORTED INCOME LIVED AT OR BELOW THE FEDERAL POVERTY LEVEL FOR A SINGLE MOM WITH TWO CHILDREN, THAT REPRESENTS A MAXIMUM OF \$1,525 A MONTH OR \$18,310 A YEAR - HARDLY ENOUGH TO LIVE ON MUCH LESS PAY FOR HEALTH CARE SHS SERVED VIRTUALLY EVERY RACIAL AND ETHNIC GROUP MORE THAN HALF OF SHS' PATIENTS ARE AFRICAN AMERICAN, NEARLY A QUARTER ARE WHITE AND MOST OF THE REST ARE HISPANIC/LATINO OR AMERICAN INDIAN/ALASKA NATIVE FREE AND LOW-COST MEDICATIONS SHS SECURED FOR ITS PATIENTS APPROXIMATELY \$1.4 MILLION IN FREE AND VERY LOW-COST MEDICATIONS THROUGH TWO PHARMACEUTICAL PATIENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS AND ITS OWN "SWOPE CARE" IN-HOUSE PRESCRIPTION ASSISTANCE PROGRAM THIS WAS CRITICAL TO MAINTAINING THE HEALTH OF THE NEARLY SIX IN TEN PATIENTS WHO HAVE NO HEALTH INSURANCE TO PURCHASE PRESCRIBED MEDICATIONS AS WELL AS MANY OF THE REST OF SHS' PATIENTS WHO ARE WOEFULLY UNDERINSURED MATERNAL AND CHILDREN'S SERVICES PREGNANT WOMEN IN SHS' TARGET SERVICE AREA OFTEN DO NOT RECEIVE EARLY AND CONSISTENT PRENATAL CARE AS A RESULT, THEY ARE MORE LIKELY THAN OTHER PREGNANT WOMEN TO LOSE THEIR BABIES OR DELIVER PREMATURE AND/OR LOW-BIRTH-WEIGHT INFANTS WITH DEVELOPMENTAL DELAYS AND OTHER EXPENSIVE AND DEBILITATING LONG-TERM HEALTH AND SOCIAL PROBLEMS. SHS PROVIDES INTENSIVE CASE MANAGEMENT AND RELATED SUPPORT SERVICES DESIGNED TO IDENTIFY, ENROLL AND KEEP PREGNANT WOMEN IN ITS PRENATAL PROGRAM IN 2008, SHS ADDED A FULL-TIME WOMEN'S HEALTH SPECIALIST TO ITS OB/GYN STAFF TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO PRENATAL SERVICES. SHS HAS REPORTED THAT WOMEN IN ITS PRENATAL PROGRAM EXPERIENCE A LOWER INCIDENCE OF NEGATIVE OUTCOMES, FIFTEEN PERCENT LOWER THAN THE GENERAL POPULATION. SHS SUPPORTS NEW MOTHERS AFTER BIRTH THROUGH A VARIETY OF PROGRAMS AND SERVICES. FOR EXAMPLE, IT OFFERS CLASSES AND ONE-TO-ONE COUNSELING TO ENCOURAGE WOMEN TO BREASTFEED THEIR BABIES, A STRATEGY THAT IS NOT ONLY COST-SAVING BUT THAT PROVIDES A HOST OF LONG-TERM HEALTH BENEFITS TO BOTH THE MOTHER AND CHILD. SHS PROVIDED HEALTH CARE SERVICES TO MORE THAN 11,000 CHILD AND ADOLESCENT PATIENTS, TREATING EVERYTHING FROM SPRAINS AND CUTS TO COLDS AND THE FLU TO CHRONIC CONDITIONS SUCH AS ASTHMA. BECAUSE THERE ARE SO MANY THINGS THAT CAN IMPAIR THE PHYSICAL, SOCIAL AND INTELLECTUAL DEVELOPMENT OF A CHILD, SHS MAKES EVERY EFFORT TO IDENTIFY THESE POTENTIAL PROBLEMS EARLY SO APPROPRIATE TREATMENT CAN BE INITIATED BEFORE A DEVELOPMENTAL PROBLEM BECOMES A PERMANENT DISABILITY. IN 2009, SHS PROVIDED EARLY SCREENINGS, KNOWN AS EPSDT (EARLY PERIODIC SCREENING, DIAGNOSES AND TESTING) EXAMINATIONS, TO MORE THAN 4,000 CHILDREN TO PROVIDE CHILDREN IN A HIGH-CRIME URBAN AREA WITH A SAFE AND EXCITING HALLOWEEN EXPERIENCE, SHS SPONSORED TREAT TOWN AT THE SHOPS ON BLUE PARKWAY. THE MORE THAN 1,500 CHILDREN WHO ATTENDED THIS ANNUAL EVENT IN 2009 RECEIVED LOTS OF TASTY GOODIES AS WELL AS TOOTH BRUSHES TO PREVENT TOOTH DECAY. ADULT MEDICAL SERVICES. SHS HAS TAKEN A GIANT STEP TOWARD IMPROVING THE LONG-TERM HEALTH OF ITS PATIENTS BY MORE CLOSELY MONITORING THOSE WITH DIABETES AND CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE, TWO HIGH-RISK CHRONIC DISEASES THAT AFFECT A DISPROPORTIONATE SHARE OF ITS PATIENTS. IF NOT PROPERLY MANAGED, DIABETES AND CARDIOVASCULAR DISEASE CAN LEAD TO HEART DISEASE, STROKE AND A NUMBER OF OTHER SERIOUS AND VERY EXPENSIVE-TO-TREAT CONDITIONS. IN 2008, SHS ENHANCED ITS CHRONIC DISEASE MANAGEMENT PROGRAM BY ADDING A CHRONIC DISEASE MANAGEMENT NURSE WHO WORKS ONE-TO-ONE WITH PATIENTS. THIS NURSE MONITORS THE CRITICAL INDICATORS OF PATIENTS' CHRONIC DISEASES, EXPLAINS THE IMPORTANCE OF ADHERING TO MEDICATION REGIMENS, AND ADVISES PATIENTS ABOUT DIET, EXERCISE AND OTHER LIFESTYLE CHANGES THAT ARE KNOWN TO SLOW THE PROGRESSION OF THEIR DISEASE. THE RESULT? THIS NURSE HELPED 1,500 PATIENTS IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF THEIR LIVES IN 2009. THE HOMELESS. IN 2009, SHS ASSISTED SOME 3,700 HOMELESS PEOPLE WITH HEALTH CARE, HOUSING AND OTHER ESSENTIAL SERVICES. SHS STAFF MEMBERS GO TO WHERE THE HOMELESS GATHER, ASSESSING THEIR BASIC NEEDS IN THE FIELD AND INVITING THEM TO VISIT SHS' DEDICATED CLINIC FOR THE HOMELESS AT ITS BLUE PARKWAY COMPLEX. INTAKES ARE PROVIDED TO HELP DETERMINE WHAT SERVICES ONE MIGHT NEED AND WHAT SERVICES ONE MIGHT QUALIFY FOR. CASE MANAGERS HELP TO ASSIST THOSE WHOM NEED HELP OBTAINING PHYSICAL AND MENTAL HEALTH TREATMENT AS WELL AS HOUSING, TRANSPORTATION, AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE. DENTAL CARE IS A PREREQUISITE TO GOOD HEALTH. IN FACT, STUDIES SHOW THAT CHILDREN WITH POOR ORAL HYGIENE ARE AT INCREASED RISK FOR HEART DISEASE, STROKE AND A NUMBER OF OTHER AILMENTS LATER IN LIFE. UNFORTUNATELY, MOST LOW-INCOME PEOPLE DO NOT RECEIVE ADEQUATE DENTAL CARE, AND PUBLIC INSURANCE PROGRAMS, SUCH AS MEDICAID AND MEDICARE, INCREASINGLY LIMIT THE DENTAL SERVICES THEY WILL COVER. IN 2009, SHS PROVIDED COMPREHENSIVE DENTAL CARE (SCREENINGS, EXAMINATIONS, X-RAYS, FILLINGS, EXTRACTIONS, ETC.) TO NEARLY 9,400 ADULTS AND CHILDREN. TO REACH MORE CHILDREN IN HIGH-NEED AREAS, SHS PURCHASED AND EQUIPPED A VAN THAT OPERATES AS A MOBILE DENTAL CLINIC. THE SHS MOBILE DENTAL UNIT SERVED 550 CHILDREN IN GRADES K-6 IN THE OSAGE SCHOOL DISTRICT AS WELL AS YOUNGSTERS IN AREA HEAD START PROGRAMS. MOBILE HEALTH CARE. BESESIDES THE SHS MOBILE DENTAL UNIT, SHS HAS A MOBILE MEDICAL UNIT, A WELL-EQUIPPED CLINIC ON WHEELS STAFFED WITH MEDICAL PROFESSIONALS WHO DELIVER PRIMARY AND PREVENTIVE HEALTH CARE AND SCREENINGS TO PEOPLE WHO MAY HAVE TROUBLE GETTING TO ONE OF THE SHS CLINICS. IN 2009, SHS UTILIZED MOBILE MEDICAL UNIT ENABLING SHS TO SERVE PATIENTS, MANY OF WHOM LIVE IN RURAL AREAS WITH LIMITED ACCESS TO PRIMARY CARE PROVIDERS. BEHAVIORAL HEALTH STUDIES INDICATE THAT AS POVERTY INCREASES, SO DOES DEPRESSION, MENTAL ILLNESS AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE. IN TODAY'S TROUBLED ECONOMY, WHERE THE POOR ARE RAPIDLY LOSING ECONOMIC GROUND GAINED IN PREVIOUS DECADES, IT'S NOT SURPRISING THAT A RECORD NUMBER OF PEOPLE IN THE SHS URBAN CORE TARGET AREA ARE SEEKING MENTAL HEALTH AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES. IN 2009, SHS PROVIDED MENTAL HEALTH AND/OR SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES TO MORE THAN 16,000 PEOPLE WHO HAD NOWHERE ELSE TO TURN. THIS CARE INCLUDED OUTPATIENT THERAPY AND SUPPORT SERVICES FOR THOSE EXPERIENCING SHORT-TERM CRISES AS WELL AS INTENSIVE LONG-TERM SUPPORT PROGRAMMING FOR THOSE WITH SCHIZOPHRENIA OR OTHER SERIOUS AND PERSISTENT MENTAL ILLNESSES. THROUGH IMANI HOUSE AND OTHER PROGRAMS, SHS OFFERS STRUCTURED ADDICTION RECOVERY PROGRAMS ON BOTH AN OUTPATIENT AND INPATIENT BASIS. SHS HELPED TO ESTABLISH AND CURRENTLY OVERSEES MENTAL HEALTH COURT IN KANSAS CITY, JACKSON COUNTY. THESE COURTS ARE A HUMANE AND ECONOMICALLY VIABLE ALTERNATIVE TO THE GROWING TREND OF INCARCERATING PEOPLE WHOSE NON-VIOLENT, MINOR CRIMINAL OFFENSES ARE MORE THE RESULT OF MENTAL ILLNESS THAN AN INTENT TO CAUSE HARM. IN 2008, THE POST-DISCHARGE RECIDIVISM RATE AMONG THOSE WHO COMPLETED THEIR LOCAL MENTAL HEALTH COURT-IMPOSED TREATMENT PLAN WAS 8.7 PERCENT, COMPARED TO 40 PERCENT OR HIGHER FOR THOSE NOT CHANNELED INTO AN AREA MENTAL HEALTH COURT. ADDITIONALLY, THE COST OF MENTAL HEALTH CARE TREATMENT IS TYPICALLY CONSIDERABLY LESS THAN THE COST OF INCARCERATION, WHICH AVERAGES ABOUT \$29,000 A YEAR. TO ENSURE THAT PATIENTS AT AREA COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH CENTERS (CMHCs) HAD ACCESS TO MEDICAL CARE, IN 2009 SHS PROVIDED HEALTH SERVICES TO PATIENTS AT TWO LOCAL CMHCs VIA OUR MOBILE MEDICAL UNIT. THIS IS IMPORTANT BECAUSE EIGHT IN TEN PEOPLE WITH MENTAL HEALTH/SUBSTANCE ABUSE PROBLEMS ALSO HAVE SERIOUS MEDICAL CONDITIONS, SUCH AS DIABETES AND HYPERTENSION, WHICH OFTEN GO UNTREATED, CREATING A ONE-STOP, INTEGRATED HEALTH CARE SYSTEM. IN 2008, SHS MADE SIGNIFICANT PROGRESS IN DEVELOPING AND IMPLEMENTING A MODEL FOR A FULLY INTEGRATED HEALTH CARE DELIVERY SYSTEM. THE REASON? WHEN PATIENTS MUST TRAVEL TO DIFFERENT SITES ON DIFFERENT DAYS TO GET ALL THE MEDICAL, DENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE THEY NEED - THE NORM IN MOST HEALTH CARE SYSTEMS - THEY OFTEN FAIL TO KEEP ONE OR MORE APPOINTMENTS. SHS' INTEGRATED MODEL ALLOWS PATIENTS TO RECEIVE MEDICAL, DENTAL AND BEHAVIORAL HEALTH CARE AT ONE FACILITY DURING A SINGLE VISIT, THEREBY SAVING THEM TIME AND MAXIMIZING THE USE OF SHS' RESOURCES. SHS CONTINUED TO BUILD UPON THE INTEGRATED HEALTHCARE SYSTEM DEVELOPMENT IN 2009, INCLUDING DISCUSSIONS WITH KEY STAKEHOLDERS IN THE COMMUNITY INCLUDING EXPANDING MEDICAL SERVICES IN DIFFERENT GEOGRAPHIC AREAS AROUND KANSAS CITY.

In connection with the sale of FirstGuard in 2004, FirstGuard allocated one-half of the estimated SERP obligation to a rabbi trust established with respect to the SERP, and SCE assumed the balance of the SERP obligation. Mr. Ellis received \$335,000 distribution from the SERP in 2009 in accordance with the terms of that plan. Prior to this distribution, SCE's Compensation Committee retained independent legal counsel, and also engaged an independent compensation consultant to advise and assess the reasonableness of compensation paid pursuant to the FirstGuard sale. Mr. Ellis did not participate in the Compensation Committee's deliberations on that topic.
