

ARTICLE T

MEMBURS

- Section 1. 17 asses of Members. This Corporation shall have four classes at members; individual, Limity, Corporate (or Group) and Honorary.
- Section 2. Plection of Members. Applicants for membership shall be elected upon payment of the applicable amount of dues. Honorary members, persons whose memorious service to the organization merits recognition, may be granted lifetime membership, without dues by a off% vote of the Board of Directors.

OFFICERS

He shall exercise prodent judgment and leadership to insure that all phases of the organization are operating properly.

Section 5. The Vice Provident. In the absence of the President or in the event of his inability or refusal to act, the Vice President shall perform the duties of the President, and when so acting thail have all the powers of the President.

Section 6. The Secretary—The Secretary shall prepare the minutes of the Board of Directors meetings and send copies to all Officers and Directors. He shall also maintain a record of "tendance at Board of Director meetings and handle such correspondence as directed by the President.

Section 7. Assistant Secretary. If an appointment is made to this position, the appointee shall perform such drules as may be assigned to him by the President, Secretary or by the Board of Directors.

Section 8. The Executive Director shall be responsible for the day to day operation of the organization, including maintenance of the current membership roster, preparation and presentation of an annual report at the general membership meeting, and the Executive Director shall and to the general membership such information and notices as may be required by these by-laws or as directed by the Board of Directors. The Executive Director in conjunction with the Audit Commutee shall also be responsible for having an independent audit and preparing financial reports for the Board of Directors. The Executive Director shall serve as a member of the Visitation Committee and in this capacity prepare the initial check for delivery to the spouse when a BackStopper death occurs. The Executive Director and all Directors or persons authorized to withdraw funds of the organization shall be covered by a surety band paid for by the Corporation.

Section 9. Vacancies. Whenever a vacancy occurs in any office it shall be filled by the Board. The Officer so elected or appointed shall hold. There for the remainder of the term and until his successor is elected or appointed and qualified.

Section 19. Removal. Any Officer elected or appointed by the Board of Directors may be removed from office by the Board whenever in its judgment of the best interest of the Corporation would be saved thereby

ARTICLEA

PATCUTIVE AND OTHER COMMUTEES

The Board of Directors may, by resolution adopted by a majority of the whole Board, designate the President and three or more of their number to constitute an I vicutive Committee, who to the extent provided in said resolution, shall have and exercise the authority of the Board of Directors in the management and affairs of the Corporation between the incertage of the Board. The Board may also from time to time by resolution appoint one or more of their number, or members of the Corporation to constitute special committees.
