THE ROSE SPURRIER SCHOLARSHIP FUND

INDIVIDUAL GRANT PROCEDURES

Pursuant to Section 4945(g) of the Internal Revenue Code and Section 53.4945-4 of the Treasury Regulations, the following is submitted as a description of the procedures of the Rose Spurrier Scholarship Fund ("Fund") for the awarding of scholarships to individuals.

1. Description of Scholarships.

A. Purpose of Scholarships.

Scholarships will be awarded for the purpose of allowing the recipients to attend a college, university or other institution of higher education. Specifically, it is intended that the funds provided by the scholarships will be used by the recipients to cover the cost of tuition, books, reasonable living and transportation expenses, and other expenses reasonably related to the recipient's educational needs.

2. Number and Amount of Scholarship.

The Fund will award between five and ten scholarships each year depending upon the quality of applicants and the foreseeable needs of the Kingman High School and the Kingman Public Library for support from the Fund. It is anticipated that the average scholarship will be in the amount of \$3,000.00 to \$6,000.00, but higher amounts may be awarded to recipients who will have greater educational expenses because of the quality and location of the school attended by them or because of the nature of the degree that they are pursuing.

3. Eligible Applicants.

Any student, regardless of race, religion or ethnic origin, who is a graduate from a four-year course of education at Kingman City High School, Kingman, Kansas, other than students who are related by blood or marriage to a disqualified person or employee of the Fund. The typical graduating class consists of 80 students.

4. Duration of Scholarships.

Each scholarship will be designed to cover the cost of only one year of post-high school education. However, recipients of scholarships may have their scholarships renewed for additional one-year periods, provided, however, that (1) such recipients will be enrolled as full-time

students during the renewal period, (2) such recipients have demonstrated above-average proficiency in their studies during prior years when they have received scholarship funds from the Fund, and (3) the trustees determine that continuation of the scholarship will not deplete the income of the Fund to a point that it will be unable to award scholarships to deserving students who are graduating from high school.

5. Selection Process.

A. Selection Criteria.

Applicants will be selected based upon scholastic performance, character, extent and quality of extracurricular activities, educational goals, and financial need. Applicants who, in the opinion of the trustees, have a serious interest in obtaining a Doctor of Medicine degree will be given preference in the selection process.

B. Solicitation of Applications.

Through oral and written communications, each year, the Fund will notify the principal of Kingman High School of the availability of its scholarships during such year.

C. Selection.

Each applicant will be required to submit a biographical sketch and resume setting forth academic qualifications, background, extra-curricular activities, and any matters pertinent to financial need. Each resume must be accompanied by two letters of recommendation from teachers or other officials at the high school and a grade transcript that has been verified by an appropriate official of the high school. The trustees of the Fund will review all applications and attempt to narrow the field to approximately ten to fifteen candidates. These candidates will then be asked to appear at personal interviews with the trustees. After the interviews have been completed, recipients will be selected by the trustees. The scholarship recipients will be announced at the commencement exercises of the high school.
