2009 Stop Heart Disease Specialty License Plate Summary From the Florida Heart Research Foundation

The Stop Heart Disease specialty license plate was enacted on July 1, 2003 by the Florida State Legislature. \$25 from each plate sold or renewed goes to the Florida Heart Research Foundation (FHRF) and is legislatively mandated to go toward heart disease research, education and prevention programs in Florida. FHRF is permitted to allocate 20% of the funds raised toward administration and marketing of the plate. FHRF is a wholly owned subsidiary of the Florida Heart Research Institute — an independent, not-for-profit 501(c)(3) organization with the mission to stop heart disease through research, education and prevention.

2009 marks the sixth year of sales of the **Stop Heart Disease** license plate for the Florida Heart Research Institute. **In the last year, the license plate has sold over 2,074 new plates and over a 9,810 renewals raising \$290,935.00 in total net revenue.** This is a 1% increase from the previous year's net revenue of \$287,140.

One major reason for the decrease in percentage change in net revenue is that during the 2009 legislative session, the Florida state legislature unexpectedly imposed an increase in fees for specialty license plates of an additional \$33 to the state of Florida. This increase has driven an unprecedented decrease in new specialty plate sales of 67%. Compared to the decrease in sales of other specialty plates, however, the Stop Heart Disease specialty license plate has had the LOWEST rate of decrease of all other specialty plates. We believe this stronghold is due to three key reasons: people are strong supporters of the cause, people love the design, and we are doing a good job marketing the plate.

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- ▼ Corporate Outreach Program Through our Corporate Screening and Education Program, we have successfully worked with various corporations to help promote the license plate.
- ▼ Stop Heart Disease Researcher of the Year Award This was the sixth award given for cardiovascular research at the annual conference of the Florida Chapter of the American College of Cardiology. This year, the \$25,000 award was given to Dr. Anthony Bayry, from the University of Florida in Gainesville Dr. Bayry has been at the forefront of exploring the current controversy regarding stent thrombosis and the risk for stent clinical attention.
- Screening Outreach We continue to travel throughout the state to screen Florida residents and simultaneously promote the license plate. Of special interest was the Annual Tax Collector's Conference held in Orlando this year that was attended by over 500 tax collectors and their top managers. Since most motorists purchase their license plates from their local tax collector, this is an extremely important marketing effort because they see firsthand what we do for the general public.
- County Promotion- Several counties collaborated with FHRI in the month of February to promote the Stop Heart Disease license plate as well as bring awareness to this cause.
- ▼ UM Research- In view of the influx of talent to the UM in the area of cardiac genetics, the FHRF-established laboratory is now embarking on an expanded mission under the direction of the new departmental chair, Dr. Joshua Hare. Four pilot projects have been initiated in different areas of cardiac genomics, all of which leverage the talent and resources of the UM team to enter areas of investigation which would not have been possible without the impetus of FHRF collaboration.
 - "Piloting next generation resequencing strategies for dilated cardiomyopathy"—this study generated preliminary pilot data used advance sequencing techniques to study the DNA of individuals with dilated cardiomyopathy. The data generated and experienced gained were used to submit an NIH RO1 grant.
 - "Enhancing cardiac contractility by expression aoof an adenylate cyclase binding peptide." This project seeks to elucidate and selective activate intracellular mechanisms governing myocardial contractility in order to develop novel approaches to the treatment of heart failure. A key transgenic mouse model was successfully created and the preliminary data generated were used to apply for three separate grants currently under review, two from the NIH and one from the Julie Martin Mid-Career Award in Aging.
 - "Genetic/genomic contributions to individual risk prediction of sudden cardiac death." An outgrowth of the project with which the FHRF launched cardiac genetics at UM, this study demonstrated a cluster of single nucleotide polymorphisms associated with sudden cardiac death in the very genes which encode 2 calcium-handling proteins.

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- "Novel biomarkers for detecting coronary artery disease using gene expression "—work this year has focused on identification of candidate genes for further study
- ▶ The support for the "Miami mouse" project studying the cellular response to hypertensive stress has resulted in 5 NIH and American Heart Association grants, as well as seven peer-review publications and 16 presentations at national meetings. Under joint direction with FHRF, this project has now begun to explore the behavior of native cardiac stem cells, as well as several unique genetic modulations related to the p300 protein.
- ▶ Periodic Acceleration: This highly innovative project has begun to gain considerable scientific traction, resulting in 17 presentations (some of which were award-winning) at national meetings as well as 17 publications in peer-review journals, and an AHA grant to study another aspect of the project. Based on this progress, this project has expanded to incorporate collaboration with Dr. Keith Webster's Vascular Institute at the University of Miami, designed to study the molecular and genetic mechanisms behind the physiologic phenomena observed in the larger animal model. Research is now focusing on the possible prevention of reperfusion injury, a topic of immense clinical potential. Findings from this collaboration have opened up investigation on an international scale related to the treatment of ischemic heart disease and stroke.
- ♦ Obesity and the South Beach Diet: This is a study in which FHRI brought together local resources to help address the leading health epidemic in the country—obesity. Collaboration between FHRI, Dr Keith Webster of the University of Miami and Dr Arthur Agatston of the South Beach Diet is studying the impact of different dietary components on the physiology of obesity—on a cellular, biochemical and genetic level. Research is underway with preliminary results demonstrating a dramatic difference between the Mediterranean style "South Beach"-type diet, and standard western diet, especially in the critical areas of insulin-resistance and obesity. Preliminary findings have been presented at the recent AHA scientific sessions, and have resulted in a successful NIH grant, with several other grant applications in process.

Florida Heart Research Foundation utilizes the conflict of interest of its Parent company The Florida Heart Research Institute. Both the Board of Trustees and all employees are required to sign a conflict of interest statement and review it annually. The procedures for policy enforcement follow:

Board conflict of interest:

- It is the policy of the Miami Heart Research Institute, Inc. d/b/a Florida Heart Research Institute that no member of its Board of Trustees or Board of Directors shall vote upon any matter coming before a meeting of those bodies, or any committee of those bodies, if that member has any substantial or significant interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, in the outcome such that the person cannot fairly be said to be disinterested and able to act in the best interests of the Research Institute;
- 2. No employee shall comment or render a report upon any matter coming before a meeting of the Board of Trustees, Board of Directors, or any of the committees of those boards of the Research Institute if that employee has a substantial or significant interest, financial or otherwise, direct or indirect, in the outcome such that the person cannot fairly be said to be disinterested and able to act in the best interests of the Research Institute;
- 3 It shall be the duty and obligation of each such excluded person to disclose any conflict of interest before participation in debate or deliberation on issues or matters, even if the member does not intend to cast a vote, so that other participants in the deliberation shall be aware of the member's interests,

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- 4. It shall be a requirement that no member of the Board of Trustees, of the Board of Directors, of a committee of those bodies or of the employed staff of the Institute shall, directly or indirectly or through any entity, family member or intermediary, purchase, rent, lease or sell any realty, goods or services, from, to or with the Research Institute without prior full disclosure; and
- 5. It shall be a requirement of membership on the Board of Trustees, Board of Directors, or the Executive Director that they execute the statement attached hereto, on a yearly basis that:
 - (a.) they have read and reviewed the Conflict of Interest Policy and agree to abide by it,
 - (b.) and they agree to divulge any interests in companies, partnerships or other entities that, to their knowledge, are conducting or attempting to conduct business with the Research Institute.
- 6. In the event a potential conflict is disclosed by a member of the Board of Trustees, Board of Directors, or the Executive Director, then the Executive Committee will advise him of whether or not it recommends that he/she abstain from comment, participation in or attendance during discussion of the issue, voting, or any combination of them. The Executive Committee's decision shall be binding on the person requesting the advice unless he requests the full membership of the Board to review that advice. These matters shall be handled informally and confidentially.

Employee conflict of interest:

It is the policy of FHRI to prohibit its employees from engaging in any activity, practice or act that conflict with, or appears to conflict with, the interests of FHRI or its participants. Since it is impossible to describe all of the situations that may cause or give the appearance of a conflict of interest, the prohibitions included in this policy are not intended to be exhaustive and only include some of the more clear-cut examples.

Employees are expected to represent FHRI in a positive and ethical manner and have an obligation both to avoid conflicts of interest and to refer questions and concerns about potential conflicts to their supervisor.

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- (1) Employees are not to engage in, directly or indirectly either on or off the job, any conduct that is disloyal, disruptive, competitive, or damaging to FHRI
- (2) Employees are not to accept any employment or consulting relationship with any organization that does business with FHR1 or any competitor without prior written approval of the Chief Executive Officer. See also **Outside Employment**, policy #208
- (3) Employees and their immediate families are not to accept gifts, except those of nominal value, or any special discounts or loans from any person or firm doing, or seeking to do, business with FHRI. The meaning of gifts for purposes of this policy includes the acceptance of gifts with a monetary value exceeding \$25.00.
- (4) Employees are not to give, offer, or promise, directly or indirectly, anything of value to any representative of a research participant, of a potential research participant, a supplier, or of a financial institution in connection with any transaction or business that FHRI may have with such customer, potential customer, or financial institution.
- (5) Employees are not to disclose inside information to anyone, either inside or outside the organization, who does not have a legitimate business need to know it (see **Disclosure of Confidential Information**, policy #406.) This applies to active employees and to those who have left the organization.

Disclosures of Potential Conflicts

Employees must disclose to the Chief Executive Officer any financial interest they or their immediate family have in any firm that does business with FHRI or any competitor. FHRI may require divestiture of such interest if it deems the financial involvement to be in conflict with its best interests. Such disclosures will be communicated via the Conflict of Interest and Outside Employment Questionnaire (see Appendix A) which is completed upon hiring. It is the employee's responsibility to promptly submit a revised questionnaire to Administration when their circumstances would warrant different responses. Failure to disclose potential conflict of interest can result in disciplinary action up to and including termination.

Any monies earned during FHRI work time or at FHRI's expense (i.e. royalties or honorariums received as a result of speaking engagements or published articles, etc.) is the property of FHRI and should be endorsed over to FHRI.
