services are rendered. The Hospital has charge per case (CPC) agreements with the HSCRC which are renewed annually. These CPC agreements establish a prospectively approved average charge per inpatient case (defined as hospital admissions plus births) and an
estimated case mix index. These CPC agreements also set the rates for all payers, including Medicare and Medicaid. These approved CPC charges are adjusted during the rate year for actual changes in the case mix. The CPC agreements allow the hospital to adjust approved unit
rates, within certain limits, to achieve the average CPC target for each rate year ending June 30. Outpatient service revenue is recorded at
