28 Hydro Research Foundation's (HRF) ongoing projects in 2009 included the continued support of its education programs including maintenance of its educational website, support of the National Energy Education Project (NEED), held one teacher's workshop during the National Hydropower Association's (NHA) Annual Conference which was attended by teachers in the greater Washington DC area and has scheduled additional workshops for the NHA conference in 2010 and HydroVision 2010, initial development of a grant application to the Department of Energy to establish a hydro fellows program designed to attract graduate students from around the country to the hydroelectric industry. The program is in response to the graying of the hydro industry and the critical need to train and prepare the next generation of hydro professional. A second application for an educational forum on small hydro was also developed and filed by end of 2009. In 2009, the HRF/NEED hydropower curriculum project reached nearly 15,000 educators with hands-on, balanced hydropower materials and lessons. The project was guided by a team of subject matter experts - from utilities and engineering as well as educators to design hydropower curriculum - focused in science, technology, engineering and math - at four levels. The primary, elementary, intermediate and secondary resources were launched in 2008 to educators in teacher training workshops nationwide. In 2009, the HRF further refined these materials, clarified that industry will not be building new dams but rather will be retrofitting and upgrading existing ones, and exposed additional teachers to this material. Five hydropower workshops were held across the country in 2009, reaching nearly 500 teachers. Facts And Circumstances Test

The HRF (Hydro Research Foundation) has been directed by a non-paid part-time executive director who also serves as the executive director of the National Hydropower Association (NHA). This staffing pattern seemed most prudent in the early stages of the foundation's development. However, as the NHA has grown, so too have the demands on its executive director and that, in turn, has reduced the amount of time she has had available to help build and fundraise for the HRF. Consequently, over the last several years the HRF has not implemented a focused fundraising effort, but rather relied on the support of a few very important donors. The HRF board initiated a discussion concerning the need to hire its own, part-time yet paid staff, established a search committee and solicited applications over this past year. The board entered into discussions with several potential candidates but did not complete the hire. In 2010, this will be a major focus for the Foundation's leadership. The HRF filed two grant applications with the DOE in 2009. The first was the creation of the fellowship program designed to attract the next-generation hydro professional, gained renewed interest in hydropower among academia expected to stimulate new curricula at the university level and ultimately benefit and further the technology. The program is also designed to spur specific applied research in meeting emerging issues facing the hydroelectric industry. The second application submitted to the DOE would support a summit on small hydropower that would bring developers, new turbine manufacturers and other technology providers together to discuss impediments to the growth of small hydropower and identify needed research and development in the small hydropower area, a category identified as being perhaps the largest potential area of growth within the hydropower industry. The summit will be conducted in 2010. Both applications were successful, with the awards announced in late 2009 and expected start-up in 2010. With the addition of a new singularly focused executive director along with the reinstatement of the DOE hydropower program that provides more opportunity for federal assistance, the HRF anticipates significant diversification of its funding sources in the future.
