SINCE 2004, THE INSTITUTE HAS CONTINUOUSLY AND AGGRESSIVELY SOUGHT PUBLIC SUPPORT FROM A VARIETY OF SOURCES. THESE DEVELOPMENT EFFORTS ARE GUIDED BY A FULL-TIME DEVELOPMENT DIRECTOR.

THE MOST SIGNIFICANT VEHICLE FOR GARNERING PUBLIC SUPPORT HAS PROVEN TO BE DRIVEN AROUND OUR PUBLIC FORUMS THAT ENGAGE CITIZENS.

SINCE 2005, THE INSTITUTE GENERATED APPROXIMATELY \$545,000 IN REVENUE FROM CORPORATE DONORS. THE INSTITUTE HAS ALSO AGGRESSIVELY PURSUED FOUNDATION SUPPORT. INSTITUTE EXECUTIVES HAVE SUBMITTED WRITTEN SOLICITATIONS OR GRANT PROPOSALS TO A TOTAL OF 23 FOUNDATIONS AND MORE THAN 50 COMPANIES. IN THE FIRST FULL YEAR OF OUR DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, THESE EFFORTS SUCCEEDED IN SECURING SEVERAL GRANTS FROM FOUNDATIONS, INCLUDING A SUBSTANTIAL GRANT FROM EWING MARION KAUFFMAN FOUNDATION.

FROM 2005 TO 2009, THE INSTITUTE HAD SUCCEEDED IN RAISING \$2,326,614 PUBLIC SOURCES, WHICH CONSTITUTES APPROXIMATELY 28.4% OF ITS TOTAL REVENUE DURING THAT TIME FRAME AND IS NEARLY THREE TIMES THE MINIMUM 10% PUBLIC SUPPORT REQUIREMENT. THE INSTITUTE IS PURSUING A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN TO CONTINUE TO INCREASE THIS LEVEL OF PUBLIC SUPPORT.

THE INSTITUTE ENJOYS SUPPORT FROM A BROAD SPECTRUM OF INDIVIDUALS, ORGANIZATIONS AND COMPANIES. IN 2007, NEARLY 50 SUPPORTERS PROVIDED SUPPORT OF \$10,000 OR LESS, TO THE INSTITUTE. THE INSTITUTE CONTINUES TO SEEK MONEY FROM THESE AND OTHER CORPORATE SOURCES WITH A NUMBER OF COMPANIES CONSISTENTLY PROVIDING ANNUAL SUPPORT TO THE INSTITUTE. IN 2006, THE INSTITUTE RECEIVED \$1.1 MILLION IN REVENUE FROM FEDERAL AGENCIES, INCLUDING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES.

ALMOST ALL FORUMS AND ACTIVITIES GAIN THE INPUT AND NON-FINANCIAL SUPPORT FROM A WIDE RANGE OF LOCAL NON-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS THAT SERVE AS PARTNERS OR NON-FINANCIAL COSPONSORS.

FACTOR 5: THE EXTENT TO WHICH MEANINGFUL SERVICES ARE PROVIDED TO THE PUBLIC OR CIVIC AND COMMUNITY LEADERS PARTICIPATE IN ITS PROGRAMS AND ACTIVITIES.

THE INSTITUTE IS DEDICATED TO IMPROVING PUBLIC DISCOURSE ABOUT ISSUES OF THE DAY. OVER THE PAST FIVE YEARS, THE INSTITUTE HAS CONDUCTED MORE THAN 60 EVENTS, FORUMS AND ACTIVITIES ALONG WITH 8 PUBLIC OFFICIALS. ALL EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES ARE DESIGNED EXCLUSIVELY TO ENABLE THOSE WHO WOULD

THE WORK OF THE INSTITUTE HAS ALSO INSPIRED OTHER ORGANIZATIONS TO CONTRIBUTE THEIR TALENT, NETWORKS AND ENERGY UNDER A SIMILAR CAUSE SUCH AS THE INSTITUTES ENTREPRENEURSHIP WEEK/USA EFFORT WHERE MORE THAN 1100 ORGANIZATIONS PARTNERED IN PROVIDING 2,325 EVENTS OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AT A TIME WHEN SO MANY ARE CONCERNED ABOUT THE ECONOMY, THEIR JOBS AND THEIR FINANCIAL FUTURES.

TOO OFTEN LOCAL CITIZEN ENGAGEMENT IS TAINTED BY THE IDEALOGY OR POLITICAL VIEWS OF THE HOST ORGANIZATION. THE PUBLIC FORUM INSTITUTE HAS REMAINED RUTHLESSLY NON-PARTISAN AND INDEPENDENT OF TAKING A POSITION ON ISSUES. ALL PUBLIC FORUM INSTITUTE PROGRAMS WITHOUT EXCEPTION ARE OPEN TO THE PUBLIC AND FREE OF CHARGE. AS A RESULT EACH ACTIVITY ENGAGES A WIDE VARIETY OF CITIZENS. THE DOZENS OF FORUMS ON HEALTH CARE FOR EXAMPLE, ATTRACTED INTERESTED CITIZENS RANGING FROM THOSE WITHOUT HEALTH INSURANCE TO SENIORS ON MEDICARE. EVENTS AND ACTIVITIES ON ENTREPRENEURSHIP ATTRACT MOSTLY AN UNDER 30 DEMOGRAHIC INTERESTED IN EXPLORING THEIR POTENTIAL TO GIVE BACK TO AMERICAS ECONOMY AND PURSE A DREAM OF STARTING UNLEASHING AN IDEA.

A COUPLE OF PROJECTS THAT SERVE AS EXAMPLES INCLUDE THE PUBLIC FORUMS ON HEALTH CARE. WHILE THE INSTITUTE HAS HELD MORE THAN 500 PUBLIC FORMS ON HEALTHCARE, BETWEEN JANUARY AND NOVEMBER 2006 THE PUBLIC FORUM INSTITUTE ORGANIZED 24 FORUMS ON HEALTH CARE OFFERING THE OPPORTUNITY FOR THE PUBLIC TO LEARN ABOUT THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM AND EXPRESS AN INFORMED VIEW AS TO HOW TO IMPROVE IT. THIS SERIES OF FORUMS WAS MADE POSSIBLE THROUGH FUNDING FROM THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES THROUGH ITS CREATION OF THE CITIZENS HEALTH CARE WORKING GROUP WHICH WAS ESTABLISHED BY CONGRESS.

ANOTHER EXAMPLE RESTS AROUND THE ROLE THE PUBLIC FORUM INSTITUTE HAS PLAYED IN ENGAGING THE PUBLIC IN DISCUSSIONS AROUND EMERGING PUBLIC ISSUES. FOR EXAMPLE, THE INSTITUTE COORDINATED 12 TOWNHALLS ON GENETICS IN ASSOCIATION WITH JOHNS HOPKINS UNIVERSITY. FUNDED BY THE NIH, THESE PROGRAMS PROVIDED THE PUBLIC WITH AN OPPORTUNITY TO PARTICIPATE IN THE DEVELOPMENT OF SOUND PUBLIC POLICY ON A NEW ISSUE NOT YET BEFORE EXPERTS. CITIZENS WERE SERVED BY ENSURING THEY HELPED DEFINE WHAT ISSUES WOULD BE MOST IMPORTANT FOR THE NATION TO ADDRESS WHEN EXPLORING HOW TO DEAL WITH
