TAX ON INVESTMENT INCOME

ON MARCH 3, 1875, THE TRUSTEES OF THE LOUISE HOME WAS CHARTERED AND INCORPORATED BY AN ACT OF CONGRESS. SECTION 2 OF THE CHARTER ACT (18 STAT. 508, CH. 168), AS PRINTED AT D.C. CODE SECT. 47-805, PROVIDES AS FOLLOWS:

THE BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS OF THE LOUISE HOME, AND ALL PROPERTY HELD BY THE TRUSTEES THEREOF FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE TRUST CONTAINED IN A CERTAIN DEED FROM WILLIAM W. CORCORAN DATED NOVEMBER 21, 1869, AND RECORDED IN LIBER 630 AT FOLIO 458 OF LAND RECORDS OF THE DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA, ON THE SQUARE NUMBERED ONE HUNDRED AND NINETY-SIX SHALL BE FREE FROM ALL TAXES AND ASSESSMENT BY THE MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES, OR BY THE UNITED STATES, SO LONG AS THE SAME SHALL BE HELD AND USED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE SAID TRUST. (MAR. 3, 1875, 18 STAT, 508, CH. 168, SEC. 2).

ON NOVEMBER 29, 1960, THE INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE CONFIRMED ITS EARLIER DETERMINATION THAT THE TRUSTEES OF THE LOUISE HOME IS "FREE OF ALL TAXES AND ASSESSMENTS BY MUNICIPAL AUTHORITIES OR THE UNITED STATES"

ON MARCH 13, 1972, THE INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE RULED THAT THE TRUSTEES OF THE LOUISE HOME ARE EXEMPT FROM TAX ON INVESTMENT INCOME IMPOSED BY SECTION 4940 OF THE CODE "AS LONG AS THE PROPERTY OF THE TRUSTEES OF THE LOUISE HOME IS HELD AND USED FOR THE PURPOSES OF THE TRUST...WHICH WAS INCORPORATED BY AN ACT OF CONGRESS ON MARCH 3, 1975"

ON SEPTEMBER 26, 1983, IN T.C. MEMO 1983-589, THE UNITED STATES TAX COURT CONFIRMED THAT THE LOUISE HOME IS EXEMPT FROM THE EXCISE TAX UNDER IRC SEC. 4940(A).
